Do you pay for your TRICARE coverage using a bank electronic funds transfer, credit card, or debit card? If so, and you haven't done so already, **you must securely provide your recurring payment information to the West Region contractor, TriWest Healthcare Alliance**. You have until **Wednesday, April 30, 2025** to submit your payment.

If you have TRICARE Prime, you should also know that the Defense Health Agency has extended the West Region referral approval waiver through **April 30**, **2025**. This means TRICARE-authorized specialty care providers don't need to wait for TriWest to approve referrals issued by your primary care manager before providing outpatient care.

## BLUF: Education Centers can no longer submit Manual Tuition Assistance Requests (TAR) with in 7 days of the Start Date.

Per the Army Credentialing and Continuing Education Services for Soldiers (ACCESS) Field Call on 5 Mar-2025, no one is authorized to submit a TAR later than seven (7) days prior to the term start date - No Manual TAR creations for Soldier's who missed the TAR enrollment deadline (60-7 days). Therefore, we advise letting Soldiers know to apply for TA as soon as their 60 day window opens to avoid any issues in requesting TA the week before classes start.

In the previous portal go Army Ed, Soldier's had to submit their TA Request no later than 3 days prior to start date. Since Army Ignited portal 2.0 began (August 2022) it has had the 7 day window that was the Air Force requirement. We were able to submit manual requests with in the 7 days with ESO approval but now we cannot. Soldiers must have request submitted 7 days prior to the class start date or they will have to take the class at a future date. Soldiers can enter a request starting 60 days prior to start date.

### **Importance of Labeling Containers**

Container labeling refers to the practice of properly identifying hazardous substances when they are transferred from their original (primary) container to another container, known as the secondary container. Here are some key reasons why labeling chemical containers is important:

- **Preventing Accidents:** Proper labels on chemical bottles reduce dangerous mix-ups, spills, burns, and injuries.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Labeling ensures adherence to industry regulations, avoiding fines and legal issues.
- **Emergency Response:** Labeled bottles enable quick identification during emergencies, minimizing damage and health risks.
- **Storage & Disposal:** Labels provide critical information on hazards, storage, and disposal, preventing environmental and health risks.
- Safety Culture: Labeling promotes a culture of safety and responsibility among employees. Proper labels prevent accidents by ensuring hazardous materials or chemicals are correctly identified and handled with care.

#### **Department of Public Works (DPW)—Transportation Systems**

#### Lewis Main:

- Pendleton Ave at the underpass between Lewis Main and Lewis North, the contractor for WSDOT will alternate traffic through the work zone between 9 am to 2 pm from 3 MAR thru 11 APR 2025 as part of the ongoing Phase 3 work.
- **S 14<sup>th</sup> St and Mann Ave from Stryker Ave to Railroad Ave** will undergo reconstruction from 10 FEB to 2 JUNE 2025. The work is scheduled in two phases.
  - Phase 1: S 14<sup>th</sup> St from Stryker Ave to Mann Ave will be closed from 10 FEB to 4 APR 2025.
  - Phase 2: Mann Ave from 41<sup>st</sup> Division Drive to S 14<sup>th</sup> St and S 14<sup>th</sup> St from Mann Ave to Railroad Ave will be closed from 7 APR to 2 JUNE 2025.

#### McChord:

- Barnes Blvd from between 1<sup>st</sup> St SW to the entrance to J01119 parking and Levitow Blvd to 2<sup>nd</sup> St will undergo construction to replace the existing culvert with a bridge at Clover Creek from 31 MAR 2025 to 5 FEB 2026. The work is scheduled in two phases.
  - Phase 1A: Barnes Blvd from the intersection with Levitow Blvd to the entrance of J01119 parking will be <u>closed</u> from 3 to 16 APR 2025 from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm, Mon. through Fri. for gas line relocation.
  - Phase 1B: Barnes Blvd at the intersection with Levitow Blvd to the entrance of J01119 parking will have <u>lane restriction</u> with flaggers from 17 APR to 14 MAY 2025 from 7:30 am to 5:30 pm, Mon. through Fri. for gas line relocation.
  - Phase 2A: Barnes Blvd and Levitow Blvd preparatory activities in area for FULL closure from 20 MAY to 12 JUNE 2025. Shoulder work and edge of lane activities will take place, road will remain open.
  - Phase 2B: Barnes Blvd from 1<sup>st</sup> St SW to entrance to J01119 parking and Levitow Blvd from Barnes Blvd to B St will be <u>completely closed to traffic</u> 13 JUNE 2025to 11 JAN 2026.
- Carter Lake Housing Area and Lincoln Blvd underwent water line replacement from 25 SEP 2024 to 28 FEB 2025 by American Water. Work involved single lane closures. Residents affected were notified of the closures/ detours. Restoration work in the areas will continue until MAY 2025 with minor road disturbances.

#### Off-base work by WSDOT:

**I-5 Mounts Rd to DuPont Steilacoom** corridor improvements will continue with traffic disruptions from Exit 120 to 116, through August 2026. Work is scheduled predominately during the day with occasional night operations.

**I-5's Main Line** will have Full Closures to set girders for the new Steilacoom DuPont bridge. The work will take place four evenings in APRIL beginning at 10:00 PM and opening at 6:00 AM with the dates of the closures as follows:

Fri., 4 APR 2025

Sat., 5 APR 2025

Fri., 11 APR 2025

Sat., 12 APR 2025

The detour for NB and SB I-5 will be to take exit 119 and go up and around the work zone. Below shows a simplified plan of how traffic will be detoured during the closure.

## **Celebrating Army Heritage**

Meet the first Medal of Honor recipient: Army Pvt. Jacob Parrott

Parrott was born on July 17, 1843, in Fairfield County, Ohio. He enlisted in the Army as part of Company K, 33rd Ohio Voluntary Infantry, during the Civil War.

In April 1862, Parrot and nearly two-dozen other volunteers were given orders to go deep into enemy territory

U.S. Army Pvt Jacob Parrott and destroy bridges and railroad tracks between Chattanooga, Tennessee, and Atlanta. Once they reached

the Atlanta area, the Union soldiers hopped on a train heading north.

When the train stopped at Big Shanty, Georgia, the passengers and crew got off for breakfast, but the raiders stayed on and began their covert mission by uncoupling the engine, fuel car and three boxcars and steaming out of the station.

The raiders gained a little bit of distance and were able to damage a few bridges, but it wasn't long before Confederate soldiers got a hold of another train and were hot on their trail. The Union soldiers uncoupled more of the stolen cars to slow their pursuers, but the move was to little effect.

Eventually, the train ran out of fuel near the Georgia-Tennessee border, and all of the Union soldiers tried to get away on foot. They were all captured, including Parrott.

Parrott was eventually returned to the Union in a prisoner exchange in March 1863. For his part in the raid, he was awarded the very first Medal of Honor that same month, with five of his comrades receiving the same distinction shortly thereafter.

The Medal of Honor was first authorized by Congress in December 1861 specifically for the Department of the Navy, but within two months it was adapted for Army recipients as well. The medal is now bestowed on individuals serving in any branch of the armed forces who have performed a personal act of valor above and beyond the call of duty in action against an enemy force. There are currently three variations of the medal.
