






## Community Crime Map (on/ Off Installation) Q3/4 FY24


# Fire Safety

## Electrical Fire Safety

- High powered appliances must be plugged directly to the wall
- Daisy chain of extension cords and surge protectors
- Extension cords not ran through doors, windows, ceiling and walls

## Facility Fire extinguishers

- Certified building manager responsibility to ensure extinguishers are recertified annually IAW JBLM 420-30 and AR 420-5
- Shall not be removed from assigned location






# WATER-RELATED Activities

- From FY20-FY24, the Army lost 27 Soldiers in water-related mishaps – 48% were leaders [SGT and above].
- The U.S. Coast Guard reported 3,844 mishaps that involved 564 fatalities, 2,126 injuries, and \$63 million of damage to property as a result of recreational boating mishaps in 2023.





# **JBLM Historical**

## **Water Related Mishaps**

- **From FY20 – FY24 JBLM had suffered seven (7) water related fatalities in off-duty mishaps.**
- **These incidents contributed to 17% of the total Army incident rate for this type of mishap during the same time frame.**
- **Root causes of the mishaps were identified as the following:**
  - **Use of Alcohol**
  - **Unaccompanied Swimmer (Solo)**
  - **Hypothermia (59-75 degrees F)**
  - **Faulty or Poor-Quality Floatation Devices**
  - **Remote Location (Nisqually River)**




- Inspections take place from 21 April – 23 May
- 3,985 Inspections have been completed – **77% Complete**
- 193 Homes had Life/Health/Safety Issues Identified – LMH Responded / Corrected
- 95% of the Life/Health/Safety Issues should have been called in by the Resident
  - Toilets leaking, outlet covers cracked/missing, outlets inoperable, dishwasher leaking, leaking hose bibs, heat not working, mildew/mold on the bathroom walls, window cracked, smoke alarm not working



# Are you moving from JBLM this Summer?

**Bottom Line:** The DoD is transitioning HHG movement to a new contractor Home Safe Alliance (HSA) who is struggling to meet performance requirements. Soldiers moving under this new contract have increased risk of delayed HHG movement.

## Soldiers Need to Know:

1. Upon receiving orders, initiate HHG actions in **sorting tool** and proceed to PPPO (Lewis/Mcchord) to initiate counseling.
2. SM needs to back brief leadership on HHG counseling and key dates
3. **DON'T initiate/terminate** current living status without moving company 2. confirmed pack/pick dates.
4. **Be responsive** to phone calls/emails from PPPO / JPPSO / TSP / Prime Contractor and **proactively** engage these entities.
5. **GHC Conditions:** If your move is initially booked under GHC and you do not receive confirmation or assigned a mover from HSA of pack/pick up dates. And If Move mil Status is indicating - No assigned Service Provider and Missed pick up. **Do this:**
  1. At **12 Govt Business Day (GBD) if no requested pick up-date/assigned local agent, call JPPSO-NW QAE** and (800) 521-9959
  2. At **10 GBD or less, JPPSO-NW will contact customer to confirm/deny HSA support, customer return to PPPO for counseling/re-booking in DPS**

## Leadership Support:

1. Ensure Soldiers complete orders elections & leave form > 90 days prior to report date and HHG counseling >60 days prior to requested HHG Pick up Date. PPPO do not require leave form to initiate the move.
2. Direct Soldier to PPPO and schedule HHG.
  - A. Sorting tool will determine type of move. Track SM counseling appt and briefing date/time.
  - B. If Soldier does not have a firm scheduled pack/pick or service provider assigned 12 GBD prior, recommend to contact HSA and JPPSO QAE.
3. If a move is delayed, adjust the SM's report date and leave.
4. **HIGHLY RECOMMEND** Service Members allow JBLM – Quality Assurance Evaluators to inspect/evaluate moving company pack/pick of HHGs to ensure quality service.





- We have had more donors attend blood drives but less have been collected
  - This may be due to donor eligibility requirements and/or good collections
- Despite having a slight increase in donor attendance, we are still not meeting our ASBP quota consistently, we have met 22 quota requirements of 42 this year

### • Mission Success:

- Continued Leadership support of quarterly blood drives and partnerships across JBLM



## Collection Goals

- **GOAL: Collect 150 Units of Blood Per Week**
  - Host 3 to 4 blood drives per week on JBLM to ensure ASBP and contingency shelf quota is met
  - Eligible donors include Service Members, Dependents, GS/Contractors, and Retirees
- **Military:**
  - IAW AR 40-3 (22 February 2013, Chapter 5): Commanders are authorized to provide incentives to encourage participation.
  - JBLM Reg 40-38 Command Blood Program (March 2023)
    - CDRs at all levels to establish a blood policy
- **Civilian:**
  - IAW DODI Number 1400.25, (June 2021.) DoD civilian employees are encouraged to seek supervisory approval without charge to leave for the time necessary to donate the blood, for recuperation immediately following blood donation, and for necessary travel to and from the donation site.

Established in 1983 as the Voice of the Army People – A grassroots effort used to generate submissions from Service members, DoD civilian employees, retirees, and their Families to **identify, prioritize, and elevate their quality-of-life issues to senior leaders for action and resolution.**

## AFAP Outcomes:

- ~ Since 1983, 794 issues have entered AFAP (577 issues resolved; 175 classified as unattainable)
- ~ Currently working 40 Active AFAP issues


