

**LTG GREGORY “Greg” K. ANDERSON**  
**Commanding General and Senior Mission Commander**  
**XVIII Airborne Corps and Fort Liberty, North Carolina**



Lieutenant General Gregory K. Anderson assumed command of the XVIII Airborne Corps on December 6, 2024. He is the 40<sup>th</sup> commander of America’s Contingency Corps, home to more than 80,000 Soldiers across 11 installations.

LTG Anderson comes to Fort Liberty having previously served in a host of command and leader positions from platoon leader to division commander, including assignments in the 7th Infantry Division, 1st Armored Division, 75th Ranger Regiment, United States Special Operations Command, 173rd IBCT (ABN), United States Central Command, United States Africa Command, and 10<sup>th</sup> Mountain Division (Light).

He is a native of San Jose, California and commissioned as an Infantry officer upon graduation from the United States Military Academy in 1991. He holds two master’s degrees: a M.S. degree from the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, CA and a M.A. from the United States Army War College, Carlisle Barracks, PA.

LTG Anderson has deployed 17 times including operational experience in Haiti, Panama, Bosnia, the Baltic States, Afghanistan, Iraq, and Eastern Europe. Previous command positions include 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 87<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment, 10th Mountain Division (Light); 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment; 173rd Infantry Brigade Combat Team (Airborne), and the 10<sup>th</sup> Mountain Division (Light).

LTG Anderson has more than 7 years of joint assignments, including a deployment as the Director for Joint Interagency Task Force West, in Iraq.

His Military Awards and Decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, Combat Infantryman’s Badge, Expert Infantryman’s Badge, Ranger Tab, Master Parachutist Badge, and Air Assault Badge.

In 2024, LTG Anderson was awarded into the French National Order of Merit (Chevalier) and he is a Distinguished Member of the 75<sup>th</sup> Ranger Regiment.

LTG Anderson and his spouse Luzane (Lu) have 3 sons all of whom are currently serving in the active-duty Army.
