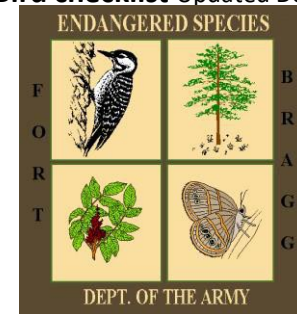

- + Probable breeder in region but not found on property yet

#### Seasons:

- SP Spring - March, April, May
- SU Summer - June and July
- FA Fall - August, September, October, November
- W Winter - December, January, February
