SAFETY TIPS DURING PEAK TRAINING SEASON MAY-JUNE

FORT HUNTER LIGGETT, Calif. - The peak training season at Fort Hunter Liggett will start mid-May and run through the end of June. Expect traffic delays and entry onto the installations, and increased law enforcement in the area.

The Army Reserve is conducting its annual large-scale Combat Support Training Exercise. Increased military and contractor traffic is anticipated on Jolon Road. Please use patience and caution near military convoys. Also anticipate increased aircraft traffic and noise from training activities. Report unsafe driving or incidents to the Fort Hunter Liggett Police Department at 831-386-2526.

Public must NOT go off the paved roads while traveling through Fort Hunter Liggett to get to Los Padres National Forest or Mission San Antonio de Padua. DO NOT use GPS to navigate as it often does not provide accurate directions to your destination. There has been an uptick of people getting lost and trespassers in recent months wandering off-road onto training areas which are marked **"FEDERAL PROPERTY" AND "LIVE FIRE TRAINING- DO NOT ENTER."** Please pay heed to the signs for your safety and the military training at Fort Hunter Liggett.
