This training was necessary because all LRC staff self-isolated at home for CDC recommended 14 days due to possible exposure to COVID-19. Mission-essential LRC staff returned to work and learned how to conduct deep cleaning of all work areas, how to properly put on and remove personal protective equipment (PPE), and how to maintain entry/exit control point. 




25L Course at TASS TTC









A small "pop-up" 25L (Cable Systems Installer-Maintainer) reclassification course for deploying Soldiers is at Fort Hunter Liggett, May 8 to June 7. This course is normally conducted at the High Tech Regional Training Site – Maintenance (HTRTS-M), Sacramento. FHL was selected for this training, as opposed to HTRTS-M, because of our ability to restrict the students to an area due to the current COVID-19 environment. The installation has been working with TASS Training Center and HTRTS-M to get Soldiers COVID-19 tested prior to arrival, provide isolated barracks and training space, and install telephone poles and an above-ground vault to support the training. Fort Hunter Liggett recently completed a project to develop a new training capability to support the Army Reserve's Joint Light Tactical Vehicle (JLTV) Operator New Equipment Training (OPNET) course. The project involved collaboration between the course managers, and installation engineers, Geographic Information Systems specialist, environmental specialists, and Roads & Grounds. The 12-obstacle course is designed to train drivers on the new vehicle and test it on various terrain conditions. Currently, Fort McCoy hosts this course but FHL can now join the effort to provide an additional training platform for Army Reserve Soldiers.
