



ARMY RESERVE 112TH BIRTHDAY Cake cutting and Virtual Run





GARRISON READINESS MOMC and Easter amid COVID-19






Fort Hunter Liggett's Directorate of Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation hosted a social distancing Easter Egg Hunt to support post housing residents. The Easter Bunny and FMWR team members hid Easter eggs in the front yards of each registered household. Participants could only hunt for Easter eggs in their own yard. FMWR team members changed disposable gloves for each house and sanitized each Easter egg prior to placing. Participants had to wait inside the residence while the team hid Easter eggs. When all the eggs were hidden, a team member rang the doorbell to signal parents that they could begin their own Easter egg hunt.
