HHC Change of Command/Responsibility

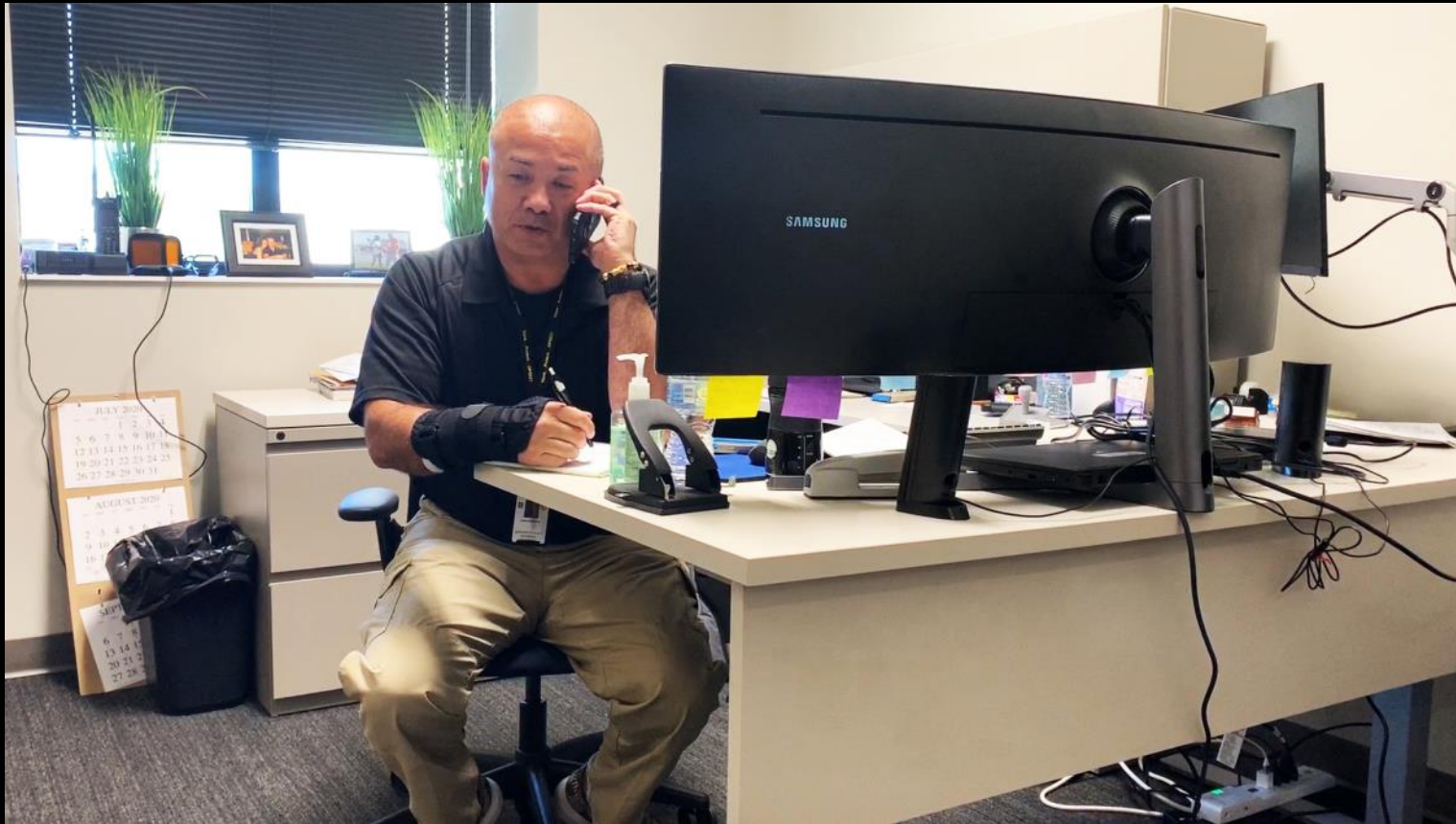

Team Trace in Action

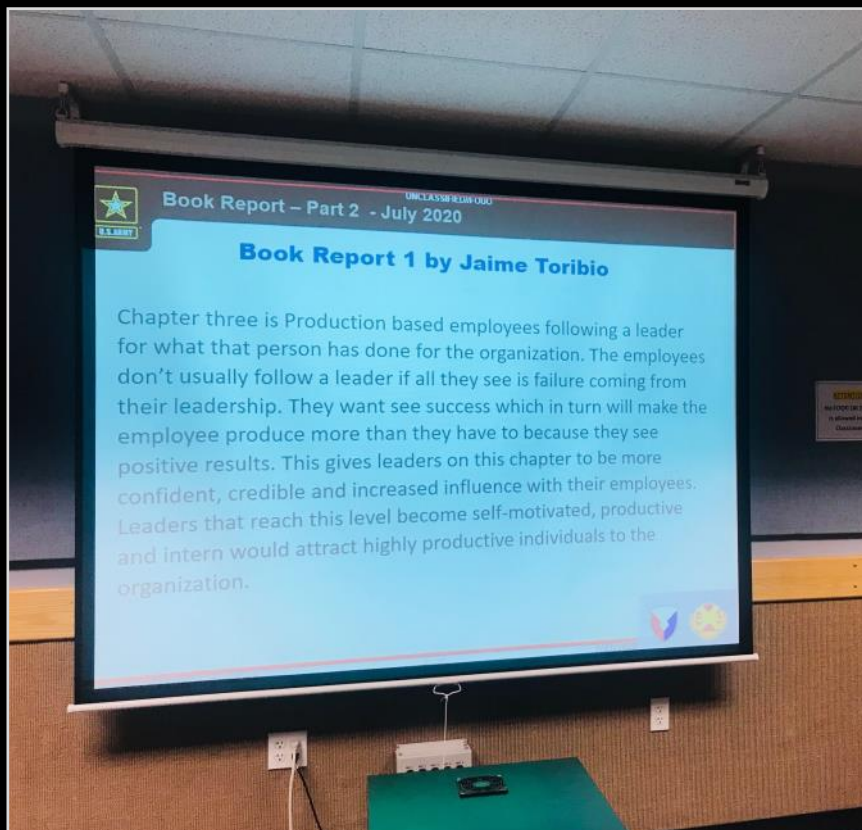


When an employee tests positive for COVID-19, Team Trace goes into action to find people who may have been in contact with the positive person. With a phone call, the contacts are notified that they may have been exposed to COVID-19 and are asked a series of questions to determine if they are exhibiting COVID symptoms. They are also told they should be quarantined for 14 days to avoid possibly infecting others should they also test positive.
