Sierra Energy had a busy summer operating and improving its FastOx gasification plant located at FHL. This unit is designed to turn trash into energy, helping ease reliance on the civilian grid while cleanly treating waste on the installation. They successfully completed their first operations in August, using household waste (MSW) material and will continue operating on this type of waste throughout the fall and into 2021. "It's a great step to establishing this new technology for use in both military and civilian applications, and our goal to helping FHL be even more sustainable and resilient," said Meredith E. # SUPPORT TO COMMUNITY Los Padres National Forestry and Tusi Airfield






Fort Hunter Liggett Tusi Army Airfield is currently being utilized as a Heli tack Base for the Dolan Fire burning in the Los Padres National Forest. Each helicopter comes with its own flight crew, fuel truck and maintenance personnel. The Heli tack base is run by the Los Padres National Forestry Department out of Sana Ynez, California. Current missions include; reconnaissance, bucket drops, and troop transport if/when needed. Pilots and crew members are required to attend a morning briefing covering latitude/longitude, weather conditions, range/training area activity, pending missions and elevations/flight path to be utilized. Pilots average approximately 7 hours of flight time per day and can only fly 8 hours per every 24 hour period. (Photos by Shawn Sullivan, FHL DES)
