## GARRISON READINESS Dolan Fire Impact





Fort Hunter Liggett continues to monitor the Dolan Fire which breached Fort Hunter Liggett, Sept. 7, 2020. A spot fire broke out on Sept. 8, injuring more than a dozen firefighters. The FHL first responders were the first on scene and provided medical support, and coordinated the medical evacuation of those requiring more medical attention to a hospital. FHL has been successfully keeping the fire away from the cantonment by back burns and reinforcement of fire breaks. FHL using multiple communication platforms to keep the community informed: daily Facebook livestreams, emails, Alerts, to name a few; and establishing a wildfire webpage. ### SUPPORT TO TRAINING 88M30 Motor Transport Operator Course





This course is usually conducted at Fort Knox and Fort Lee, and the TTC-FHL is providing additional training opportunities to units based in the west coast. This is the advanced leaders course where NCOs further develop their leadership skills and increase their proficiency planning and leading a variety of logistical operations. This month-long course covers skills such as convoy, port and tactical operations, and HAZMAT transportation. Students also had an opportunity to participate in a real-world support mission by providing drivers and dozers for the garrison's effort to build fire breaks around the cantonment area during the Dolan Fire.
