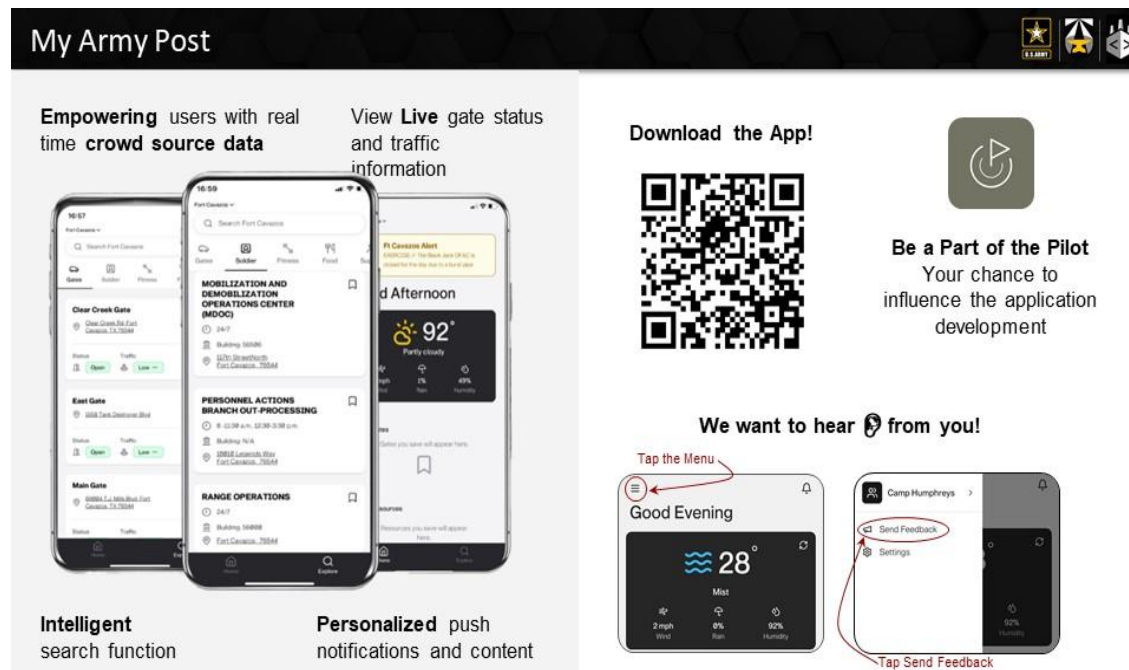

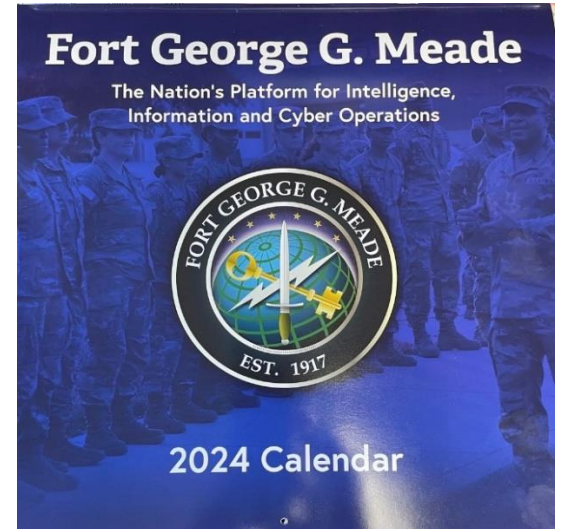

### 741st Military Intelligence Battalion, B/C Company Conduct 'Crucible' PT Event
