While there will be minimal impact to garrison services, expect ALERT! / Giant Voice messaging! Expect FPCON changes! Security and Emergency Services will respond to clearly identified training areas throughout the installation during this exercise.

#### Fort Meade recognizes the 20 year Anniversary of 9/11.



The clang of the bell rang out along the parade field on Fort George G. Meade. Deputy Chief James Evans, with Fort Meade's fire company, struck the bell five times in a row, then another five times. The sound of a bell has steep traditions within fire companies. Today, it symbolized the sacrifice of the first responders and the lives lost on Sept. 11, 2001. Saturday will mark 20 years since hijackers took control of four planes, crashing two into the twin towers in New York and one into the Pentagon. A fourth, headed for D.C., crashed into a field in Pennsylvania after the passengers of flight United 93 fought back. It's a day that shaped many careers, said Col. Christopher Nyland, garrison commander at Fort Meade. His included. Read
