SUBJECT: Fort George G. Meade Policy Memorandum #38, Treatment of Motor Vehicle/Traffic Offenses on Fort George G. Meade, Maryland

1. REFERENCES:

2. PURPOSE. To ensure consistent treatment of all individuals committing motor vehicle/traffic offenses on Fort George G. Meade.

3. APPLICABILITY. This policy applies to all military personnel (regardless of their branch of service), Department of Defense employees, other civilian employees of the U.S. Government, and all other nonaffiliated civilians working, visiting, or traveling through or on Fort George G. Meade territory. All other non-motor vehicle offenses committed by military personnel on Fort George G. Meade should be handled by the military member's command pursuant to applicable provisions of the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ).

4. POLICY. Pursuant to my authority and obligations as the commander of Fort George G. Meade, all motor vehicle/traffic offenses will be processed through the U.S. Magistrate's Court system. This includes alcohol-related motor vehicle offenses.

5. EXCEPTIONS. A commander may request an exception to this policy when he or she feels the military member's offense(s) warrants disposition under the UCMJ. For example, a commander may request an exception to this policy when the severity of the motor vehicle offense(s) or the impact upon the military makes the case more suitable for UCMJ disposition. A commander requesting such an exception must submit his or her request in writing to the Commander, U.S. Army Garrison, ATTN: IMME-ZA, Fort George G. Meade, Maryland 20755-5000, through the U.S. Army Garrison Office of the Staff Judge Advocate, ATTN: IMME-JA (Chief, Military Justice Division, 4217 Morrison Street, Fort George G. Meade, Maryland 20755-5030).
