Fort George G. Meade Begins 100th Anniversary Celebration

FORT GEORGE G. MEADE – Fort George G. Meade is celebrating its 100th birthday with events marking the occasion throughout the next year. Some of those events include: Lt. Dan Band Concert, Memorial Day Massing of the Colors, Fort Meade Appreciation Night at the Bowie Baysox, and the Red, White and Blue Celebration.

The 100th Anniversary Gala, scheduled for June 17, is a black-tie event featuring musical entertainment, dancing, food and displays that depict Fort Meade's history and represent a visual reminder of why the slogan for this yearlong celebration is: From Saddles to Cyberspace; A Century of Innovation and Security. Background

Fort George G. Meade started as Camp Meade in 1917 to support troops drafted into World War I. The site was because of its close proximity to the railroad, Baltimore port and Washington D.C. The cost for construction was \$18 million and the land sold for \$37 per acre in 1917. The Post is named for Maj. Gen. George Gordon Meade, whose victory at the Battle of Gettysburg proved a major factor in turning the tide of the Civil War in favor of the North.
