Fort Meade Holds Housing Town Hall

WHAT: Maj. Gen. Omar J. Jones IV to host a housing town hall
WHEN: Tue., Jan. 21, 2020 6:30 to 8 p.m.
WHERE: Fort Meade Post Theatre, Llewellyn and Roberts Avenue, Fort Meade

FORT GEORGE G. MEADE, Md. – Maj. Gen. Omar J. Jones IV, commanding general of Joint Force Headquarters-National Capital Region and US Army Military District of Washington, along with Fort Meade garrison commander, Col. Erich Spragg, will host a town hall to hear directly from residents as part of the Army-wide initiative to address family housing concerns.

Fort Meade has held quarterly town halls with residents since late 2018. This will be the second town hall Maj. Gen. Jones will host since he took command in June 2019.

Representatives from Corvias, the military housing partner for the 2,600 leased homes on Fort Meade are participating in the town hall. Representatives from the installation housing office and U.S. Army Public Health Command will also be on hand to answer questions.

Jones and Spragg will offer a brief media availability following the town hall. The housing town hall also will be live streamed on Facebook.

BACKGROUND

Fort Meade is the Nation's Platform for Intelligence, Information and Cyber Operations. With more than 57,000 employees representing each branch of military service, Fort Meade is the largest employer in the state of Maryland and the Army's second largest installation based on population. Some of the Fort's 119 tenant organizations include US Cyber Command, The National Security Agency, Defense Information Systems Agency, Defense Media Activity and federal agencies including the Architect of the Capitol and the Environmental Protection Agency.
