

E-Bike and E-Scooter Safety

The popularity of electric bikes and electric scooters (e-bikes and e-scooters) has taken off over the past few years. Lithium-ion batteries are usually the source of power for both, and not used correctly, or if damaged, these batteries can catch on fire or explode. Whether you use e-bikes or e-scooters as your main way of getting around, or just for fun, there are important safety tips to keep in mind when charging or storing these devices.

The Problem

- Damaged or defective batteries can over-heat, catch fire, or explode.
- Lithium-ion battery fires glow off toxic gases and they burn extremely hot.

Safety Tips

- Only use those and use devices, batteries, and charging equipment that are listed by a nationally recognized testing lab and labeled accordingly.
- Always follow the instructions from the manufacturer.
- Only use the battery and the charger that were designed for and came with the device. Do not keep charging the device or device battery after it is fully charged.
- Only charge one device or device battery at a time to prevent overloading the circuit.
- Keep batteries at room temperature when possible. Do not charge them at temperatures below 32°F (0°C) or above 104°F (40°C).
- Do not allow batteries in direct sunlight or inside hot vehicles, and keep them away from children and liquids.

Signs of a Problem

Stop using the e-bike or e-scooter if you notice any of these problems with the battery: unusual odor, change in color, too much heat, change in shape, bulging, swelling, or not holding a charge.


If you see a fire ...

1. Leave the building immediately.
2. Don't try to fight the fire.
3. Call 911.

Grilling Safety

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

Prep

- Job in the past month for grill fire.
- Roughly half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.

Safety Tips

- Prepare and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the structure and not from under eaves and over hanging branches. Follow label's instructions to best for grill.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill.
- Keep your grill clean to removing grease or fat build up from the grill and in area below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure that your grill lid is open before lighting it.


Charcoal Grills

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. A charcoal chimney starter will allow you to use newspaper as fuel.
- If you use starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid to any other flammable liquid to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid and all other flammables away from children and heat sources.

Prep Grill

Check the gas tank level for the grill before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane tank and remove batteries. If your grill has a gas tank, by itself or the propane tank, and there is no flame, turn off the gas tank and grill. If the tank stays, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the tank does not stay, call the fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

Let's try to avoid this, or worse.

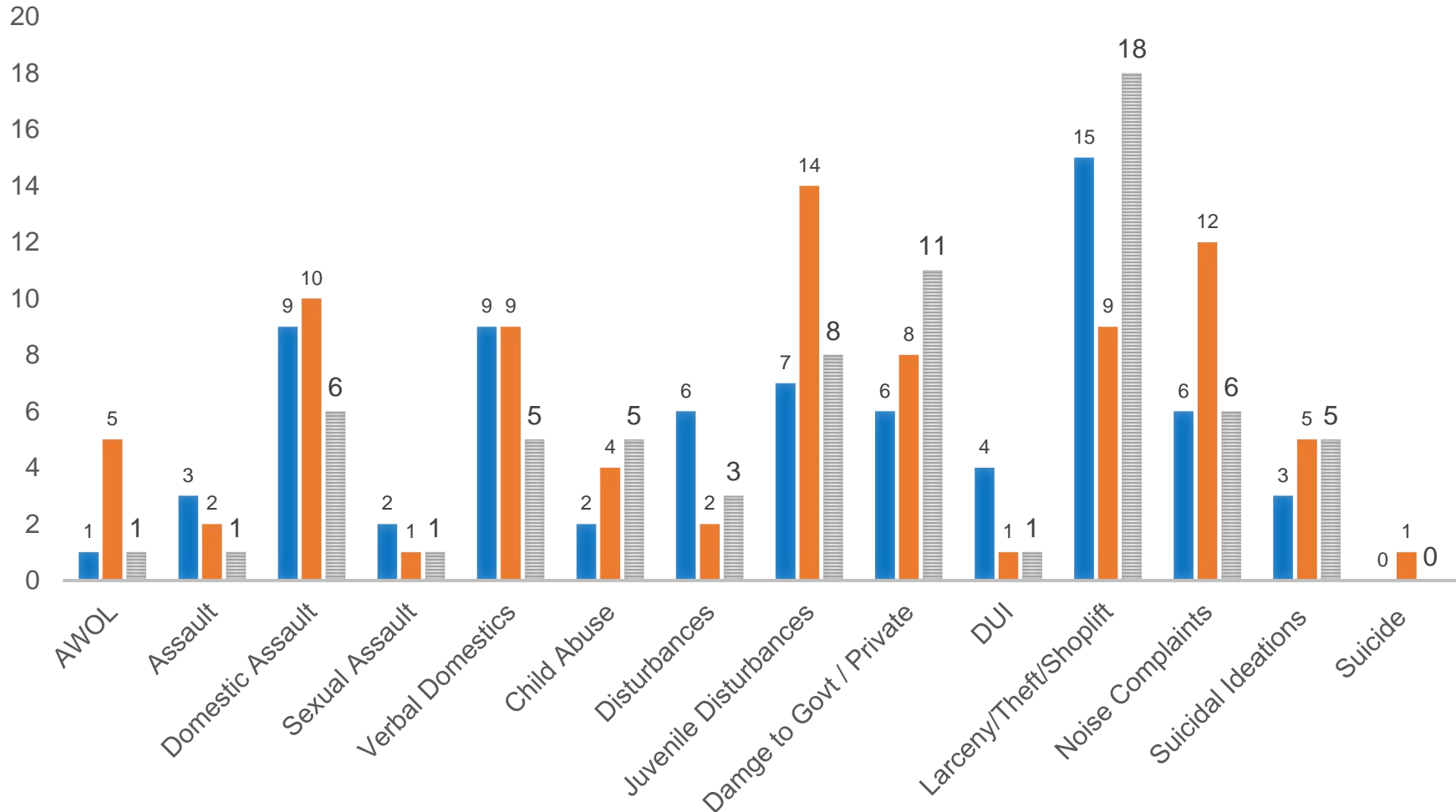

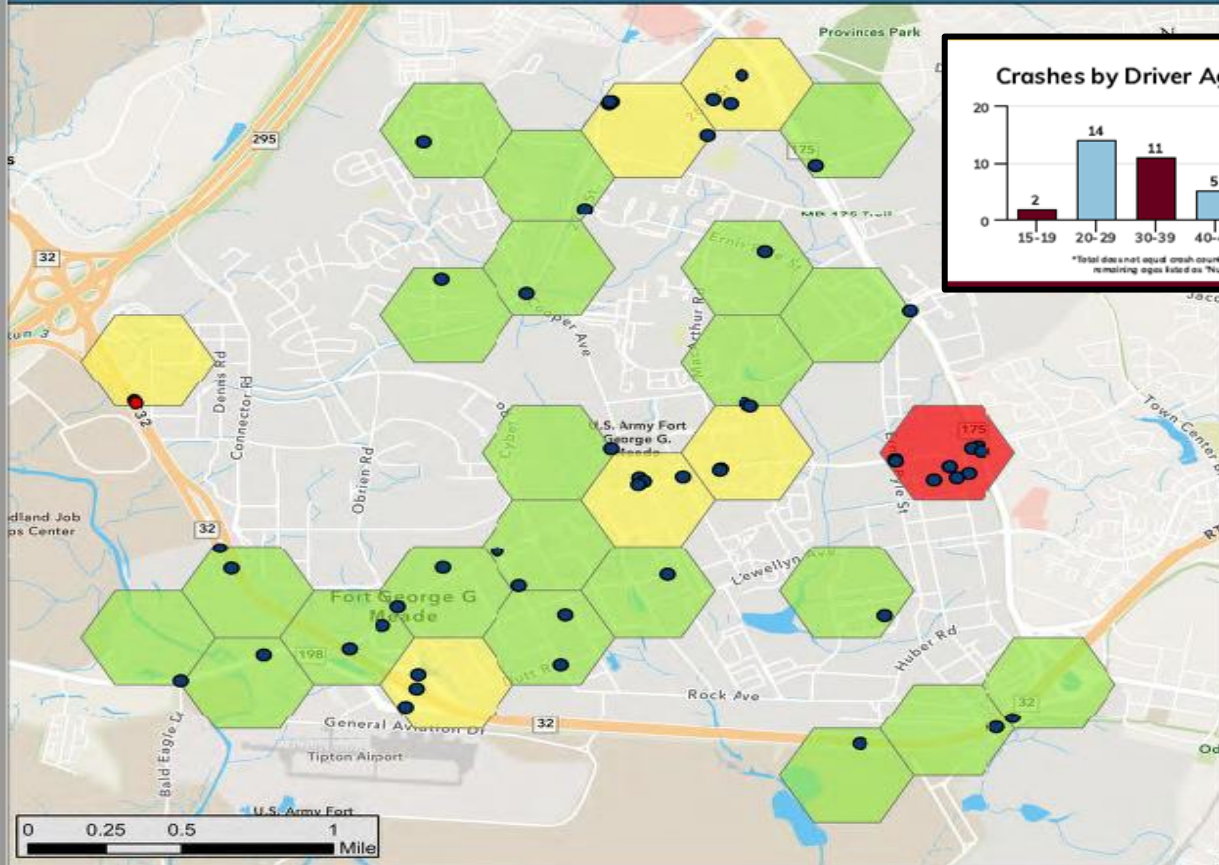
FGGM CRIME STATS FY24

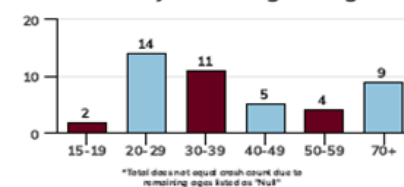


Overall Crashes

Fort Meade January - March 2024



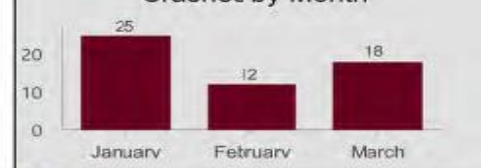
Crashes by Driver Age Range

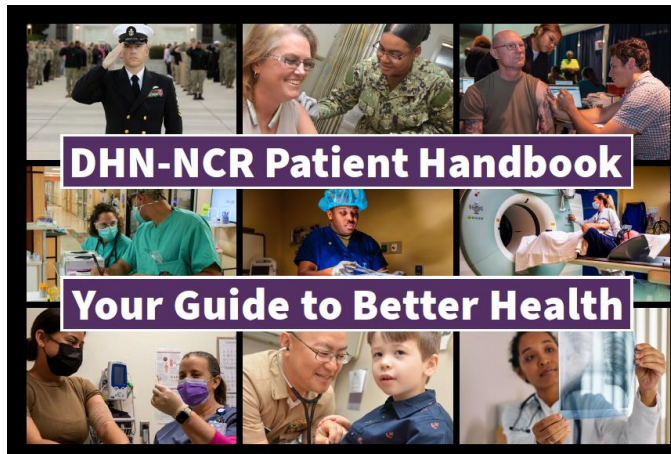

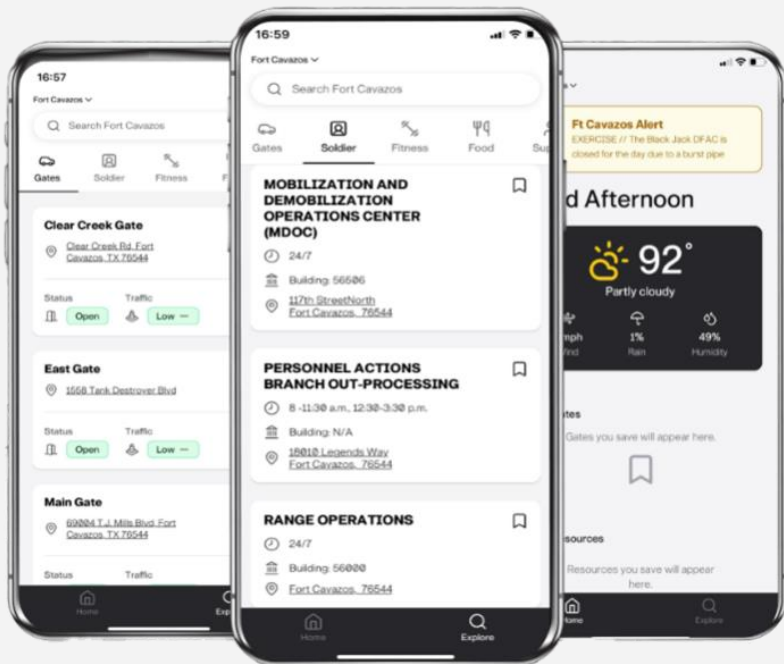

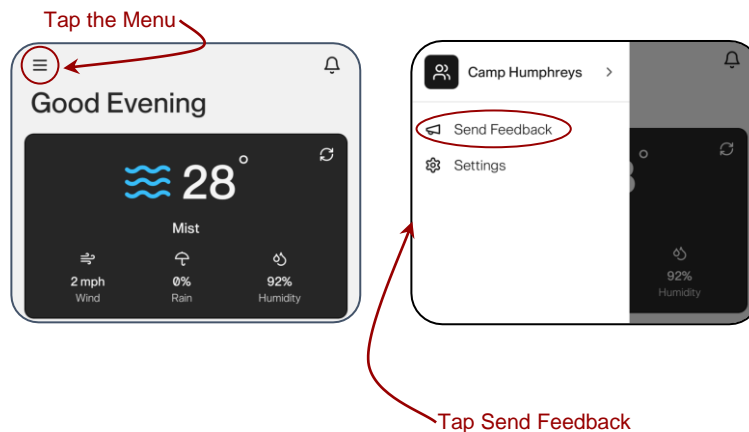
