HOW TO MAKE A RELATIVE A MILITARY DEPENDENT

Military Dependents

Certain family members, such as a spouse or child, are automatically entitled to dependency status. Under certain conditions, other family members, known as secondary (non-primary) dependents, may also quality for dependency status. This qualification requires an initial dependency determination made by the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS).

Secondary Dependency

Secondary dependents may include:

- Parent, parent-in-law, step-parent, parent by adoption, or any person who stood "in-loco parentis" to you for at least five years prior to your emancipation.
- Unmarried children ages 21 and 22 who are enrolled in an accredited institution of higher education on a fulltime basis.
- Ward of the court, unmarried, and placed in the permanent legal physical custody of the member, or if not permanent custody for a period of at least 12 consecutive months.
- Unmarried child over 21 incapable of self-support because of mental or physical incapacity that occurred while
 the child was considered a dependent of yours as a member or retired member or is considered the dependent
 of a deceased member (while under age 21 or under age 23 and a full-time student).

Preparing and submitting applications to have eligible person included as your secondary dependent can ensure you receive the benefits and allowances you and your dependent are entitled to.
