TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

The records show that the late Gunnery Sergeant George Percy KENDALL, Jr., 110 32 92, U. S. Marine Corps, born 16 February 1930 at Missoula, Montana, enlisted in the regular Marine Corps on 30 March 1950 and was honorably discharged on 16 July 1953 to reenlist in the regular Marine Corps. He reenlisted on 17 July 1953 and was honorably discharged on 16 July 1955 by reason of expiration of enlistment. He reenlisted in the regular Marine Corps on 10 December 1958 and was honorably discharged on 9 December 1963 to reenlist in the regular Marine Corps. He reenlisted on 10 December 1963 and served continuously until his death on 4 February 1968 while engaged in action against hostile forces in the Republic of Vietnam.

The records further show service in the Montana National Guard from 21 November 1955 to 20 October 1957 and in the U. S. Army Reserve from 21 October 1957 to 9 December 1958, service number 02287088/28722068.





KENDALL HALL DEDICATED

In a special ceremony held here June I the Company B Barracks officially became Kendall Hall. Named in honor of Marine Gunnery Sergeant George P. Kendall, Jr. the structure is one of several scheduled to be dedicated at the Presidio of Monterey to former DLIWC students who died as a result of hostile action in Vietnam.

Speaking at the ceremony Colonel Kibbey M. Horne, commandant, said, "It is appropriate that our buildings be named for our distinguished graduates who died while serving our country valiantly."

GySgt. Kendall was killed in action Feb. 4, 1968. While in Vietnam he added to his numerous awards and decorations the Silver Star, the Purple Heart and the Combat Action Ribbon. He graduated from the Vietnamese language course in 1967. Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Gilbert, parents of GySgt. Kendall, were present to unveil

on the wall at building 629 which houses Company B. Also present for the ceremony was Mrs. Dean Macy, sister of GySgt. Kendall.

Master of Ceremonies for the event was Lieutenant Colonel Harold V. Manson, deputy commandant for administration. Guests for the ceremony included representatives from the Marine Corps, members of Troop Command and members of Company B.
