Conservation of at-risk species, limitations on invasive species

Effective natural resource management at U.S. Army installations requires maintaining adequate habitat for flora and fauna as well as providing the vital training areas for Soldiers. At Fort Novosel in lower Alabama, the natural resources team has the added challenge of dealing with a variety of invasive species -- adding an additional wrinkle to effectively managing more than 30,000 acres that hosts more than 2-million-plus takeoffs and landings at the U.S. Army's Aviation Center of Excellence.




Home of Army Aviation builds culture of environmental quality

As the "Home of Army Aviation," Fort Novosel is an incredibly busy place. The number of flights there represent 32% of the Army's total flying hours and in 2022 alone there were 2 million takeoffs and landings at the Alabama installation.

To put that into context, the traffic count at Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport – consistently counted among the nation's busiest – is less than half of that at Fort Novosel, which provides air and ground training for Army rotary wing pilots using a...
