Colonel Mary Beth Scott, a native of Blue Bell, Pennsylvania, received her commission as an Aviation Officer from Temple University Army Reserved Officers Training Corp in 2000. She has served as the Military Deputy Director, Army Capability Manager – Lift, US Army Futures Command, and Aviation Organizational Integrator, Headquarters, Department of the Army G-3/5/7 at the Pentagon.

Before arriving at the Pentagon, Colonel Scott was assigned to the 1st Mission Support Command in Puerto Rico, where she was involved in hurricane relief efforts in the aftermath of hurricanes Irma and Maria. Prior to this time, as a Battalion S3 and Executive Officer, she was assigned to 8-229th Assault Helicopter Battalion at Fort Knox, Kentucky, as the unit became the first to transition from an Attack to an Assault formation under the Aviation Restructure Initiative.

Additional assignments include service as the Current Operations
Officer for the 11th Aviation Command, United States Army Reserve
(USAR); Brigade Aviation Officer, 48th Infantry Brigade Combat Team
Army National Guard (ARNG); Brigade Assistant S4, 3rd Combat

Aviation Brigade (CAB); and Aviation Platoon Leader, 18th Aviation Brigade. She commanded both Headquarters and Headquarters Command (HHC), 4-3 Assault Helicopter Battalion, and HHC, 3rd CAB. While assigned to 3rd CAB, she spent a total of 27 months deployed to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom III in 2005 and in support of the Surge in 2007-2008. She currently serves as the Deputy Assistant Commandant, US Army Reserve at the Aviation Center of Excellence.

Colonel Scott is a graduate of Airborne School, the Aviation Officer Basic and Captains' Career Courses, UH-60 and CH-47 Aircraft Qualification Courses, Command and General Staff College, and the US Army War College.

She holds a Master of Business Administration Degree from Georgia Southern University, a Master of Strategic Studies from the US Army War College, and a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from Temple University. Her awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal, the Air Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with five Oak Leaf Clusters (OLC), the Army Commendation Medal with two OLC, the Parachutist Badge, and the Senior Army Aviator Badge. She is also the recipient of the Order of St. Michael (Bronze Award).

Colonel Scott is married to Colonel (Retired) Guy Bass, United States Army.
