DID YOU KNOW? DFAS RECOUPS A RETIREE'S

FINAL PAY AT DEATH. Often, surviving spouses are surprised to learn that upon notification of death, DFAS collects the Retiree's final pay, even at the end of a month. Unclaimed compensation (arrears of pay) must be requested by the beneficiary. To claim this final pay, a Standard Form 1174 must be submitted after the Retiree's death. When needed, the form may be downloaded via DFAS' website www.dfas.mil, calling or by them 800-321-1080. If the application is not filed along with a death certificate, the arrears of pay is not returned to the surviving spouse/Retiree's estate.

NEED PROOF OF YOUR RETIREMENT INCOME?

Your Retiree Account Statement (RAS) is a DFAS annual leave and earnings statement containing information on pay and deductions that many potential creditors require. Your latest RAS is on myPay at <u>mypay.dfas.mil/mypay.aspx</u>. If your lender asks for a pay verification letter, a generic "Pay Verification Letter" is available online. If you cannot access myPay and need a hard copy RAS and verification letter mailed to you, call the DFAS Customer Care Center at 1-800-321-1080.

DFAS: UPDATE ADDRESS AND BENEFICIARIES

Every year someone contacts me about a missed document. Want to ensure proper receipt of your tax documents, Retiree Account Statements (RAS), and the latest Retiree information from the *Echoes*? Keep your mailing address current by calling DFAS toll free at 1-800-321-1080.



OBTAIN OR RENEW YOUR ID

<u>CARDS</u> – Effective June 2, 2021, all dependent, retiree and DAV card holders (USID) with an expiration date between January 1, 2020 and July 31,

2021, were extended to January 31, 2022. Per Under Secretary of Defense. The ID card section is in the Soldier Service Center, Building 5700, Room 160. Operating hours are M-F from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. For information, call 334-255-2182. Duty hours are set aside for *appointments only*. Appointments can be made via the internet up to 60 days out. To make an appointment or locate an ID/DEERS office visit <u>https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco/</u>. You are not limited to visiting an Army installation, just enter your zip code and the radius you want to search.

UPDATING ADDRESS AND BENEFICIARIES

DEERS RESPONSIBILITY - Sponsors must ensure their DEERS records are up-to-date. Events such as birth, death, divorce, etc., affect benefit eligibility. Failure to update DEERS could result in the sponsor being held responsible for claims filed on unauthorized family members.



NATIONAL PERSONNEL RECORDS CENTER ONLINE RECORDS REQUEST

The National Personnel Records Center website is

available for veterans to request copies of their DD Form 214 at <u>www.archives.gov/veterans</u>. Veterans and next-of-kin of deceased former military members may also use the system for proof for insurance, education, or employment purposes.

LEGAL ASSISTANCE OFFICE – Retirees and their Families are

entitled to FREE legal assistance from a licensed attorney. The Legal Assistance Office provides assistance with

powers of attorney, notarizations, wills, property issues, income tax preparation, debt collection, landlord/tenant, and much more! Notarizations and powers of attorney are done on a walk-in basis; all other consultations require an appointment. Their hours are: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, 0830-1600, and Thursday, 1200-1630.

THE POST EXCHANGE (AAFES)

A non-appropriated fund instrumentality operating almost exclusively through funds generated from sales. The Exchange contributes to military MWR and service programs. Exchange earnings are also used to build new stores and renovate existing facilities. For information on local events and special sales contact 334-503-9044, Ext 211.



CASUALTY REPORTING PROCEDURES – Retiree deaths should be reported as soon as possible to DFAS at 1-800-321-1080. Be prepared to provide the

Retiree's name, social security number and date of death. Fort Rucker provides an Honors Team for deceased U.S. Army active duty Soldiers. Retirees. POWs, honorably discharged veterans, and Medal of Honor recipients for most of Alabama and the Florida panhandle. Funeral honors should be requested Monday-Friday by the funeral director by calling the Fort Rucker Casualty Office at 334-255-9081 or 800-661-1407 not less than 24 hours prior to the funeral. For honors in Mississippi contact Fort Polk's Casualtv Office at 888-474-0377. Verification, i.e., DD Form 214 or similar discharge document, must be provided showing honorable service.

NATIONAL GUARD AND RESERVE (GRAY AREA) RETIREMENT APPLICATION PROCESS

If they are still around, you may have reached out to your old unit and spoke with the Unit Administrator (UA) about the application process to start collecting your National Guard or Reserve retirement pay. If so, you found out the days when Human Resources Command (HRC) contacted you by mailing out a packet to start your retirement pay at age 60 (or earlier if you are eligible for an "Early Drop") are passed. The Reserve Component Retirements Branch at HRC processes retirement applications for all U.S. Army Reserve and National Guard members that are eligible for retirement pay at age 60 or earlier due to the NDAA 2008, Reduced Retirement Age. Retired pay applications should be submitted 9 months, but not less than 90 days, prior to 60th birthday to ensure all documents are received and processed correctly to Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) Cleveland. This will also help in ensuring retired pay is received in a timely matter. Find the Retirement Application and Data for Payment of Retired Personnel (DD Form 2656) links at the website below. Follow the Check List and complete forms, DD Form 108 and DD Form 2656 and Bank.
