CONFIDENTIAL ATTENDANCE POLICY

The Torii Station Legal Assistance Office will not verify a Client Visit

On Okinawa, Department of the Army Civilians, and Family Members receive confidential legal advice from the Office of the Staff Judge Advocate's Soldier Family Legal Services Office. Many do not know that the Legal Assistance Office also has a confidential appointment policy. Consequently, we are unable to verify to leaders, spouses, or others who call our office and inquire whether a client has or will visit our office (or kept an appointment).

Verifying a Client visit may considered be a violation of the of Attorney Professional Rules

Although it does not come up often on Okinawa, this issue does arise. Certainly, a legal office may not discuss the representation or the matters discussed. This confidentiality is universality known. However, there is some debate, even within the legal community, about whether or not we should confirm to the command (or inform anyone) that a client or potential client actually visited our office. While some military offices view this as a "mere accountability matter," the Torii Station Legal Assistance Office views it as confidential client information. Revealing attendance or visitation information very likely is a violation of the Attorney Professional Rules of Responsibility and may harm the client who could ultimately be less likely to trust the legal office and may harm other potential clients who may not trust the Legal Assistance office in the future.

Sending an escort is permissible

The Torii Station Soldier Family Legal Services Office is a client-service office and we treat it as such. We maintain the confidentiality of our clients. Commanders or NCOs that want to maintain accountability over a Soldier may send an escort with the Soldier. Of course, the escort cannot sit-in on the confidential meeting with the attorney, but the escort can ensure that a Soldier is where he or she is supposed to be. This is a practice routinely followed for Soldiers sent to appointments with the Trial Defense Service.

Clients can make a Legal Assistance Appointment

Eligible ID card holders can make an appointment at the Torii Station Legal Assistance Office by calling DSN 652-4332.
