SPECIAL POWERS OF ATTORNEY WRITTEN PERMISSION TO DRIVE A SOFA VEHICLE

If you want to let another person operate your SOFA-Plated vehicle, there are certain “rules” you must follow on Okinawa. This article will explain not only about the rules, but also about “best” practices.

You may only loan your SOFA-plated vehicle to a person with SOFA Statusⁱ and the person borrowing your vehicle must haveⁱⁱ the following:

1. A valid U.S. Forces Japan Operator’s Permit for Civilian Vehicle (USFJ Form EJ).
2. Written Permission from the Owner of the Vehicleⁱⁱⁱ.
3. Have the vehicle title, Japanese Compulsory Insurance (JCI), Automobile Insurance (Property Damage Insurance of at least ¥3,000,000 and Bodily Injury Insurance of at least ¥30,000,000 that covers the driver borrowing the vehicle).

As mentioned, the Army rule requires written permission. Most insurance companies also require written permission or a Special Powers of Attorney. Be sure to check with your insurance company before loaning out a vehicle. The best practice is to give the person borrowing your car a Special Powers of Attorney to operate your vehicle. You can use this form below for either giving written permission, or for creating a Special Powers of Attorney.
