SUBJECT: U.S. Army Garrison (USAG) Okinawa Command Driving Policy

1. REFERENCES:

- a. Marine Corps Installations Pacific-MCO Camp Butler Order (MCIPAC-MCBBO) 5560.1B (Motor Vehicle Traffic Supervision/Drive Safe and Licensing) and MCIPAC-MCBBO 5560.2B (Centralized Traffic Court).
 - b. Army Regulation (AR) 190-5 (Motor Vehicle Traffic Supervision).
 - c. AR 600-20 (Army Command Policy).
- 2. POLICY Effective 17 June 2020, USAG Okinawa remains under Marine Corps Installations Pacific-MCO Camp Butler Order (MCIPAC-MCBBO) 5560.2B as the traffic code and traffic adjudication mechanism for all USAG Okinawa installations.
- 3. The USAG Okinawa Provost Marshall Office (PMO) will serve as the coordinating authority between the USMC traffic court and U.S Army affiliated members on Okinawa. USAG Okinawa PMO will notify members when required to appear in traffic court.
- 4. USMC Traffic court will serve as the adjudication authority for all on post and off post citations issued on Camp Butler and USAG Okinawa installations. Traffic court adjudication may be appealed in writing to the MCIPAC-MCBB Commanding General within ten calendar days of the court's ruling.
- 5. The point of contact for this policy is the USAG Okinawa Provost Marshal, at DSN (315) 652-5730.
- 6. This command policy supersedes USAG Okinawa Command Policy 190-1, 9 August 2019 and will remain in effect until superseded or rescinded.
