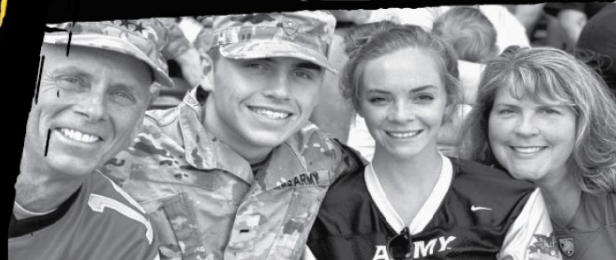

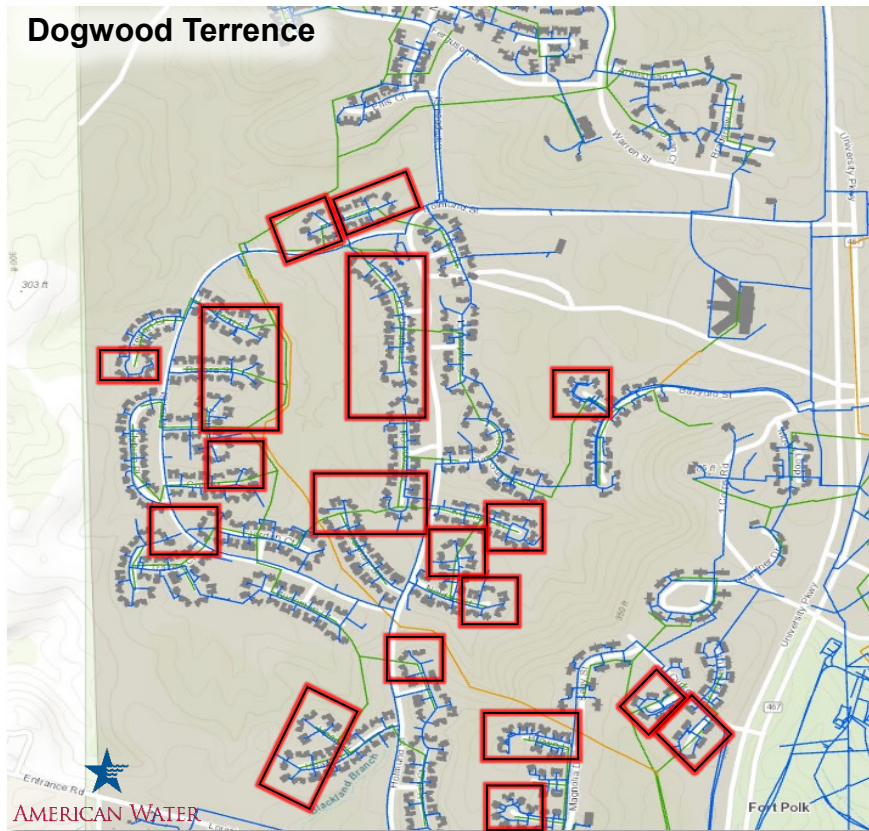
In a strategic effort to fortify the electrical infrastructure of the installation, Entergy Louisiana, LLC will commence overhead-to-underground utility conversion initiatives in the areas delineated in red on South Fort.

These critical infrastructure enhancements are designed to significantly mitigate the risk of power disruptions resulting from severe weather events, including high winds, thunderstorms, ice accumulation, tornadoes, and hurricanes. Project operations are scheduled to begin on Tuesday, June 27, 2025.

Given the scope and location of the work, personnel should anticipate potential temporary impacts, including power interruptions, increased traffic congestion, and other minor inconveniences. The Directorate of Public Works will ensure timely communication of all developments to maintain situational awareness across the installation.

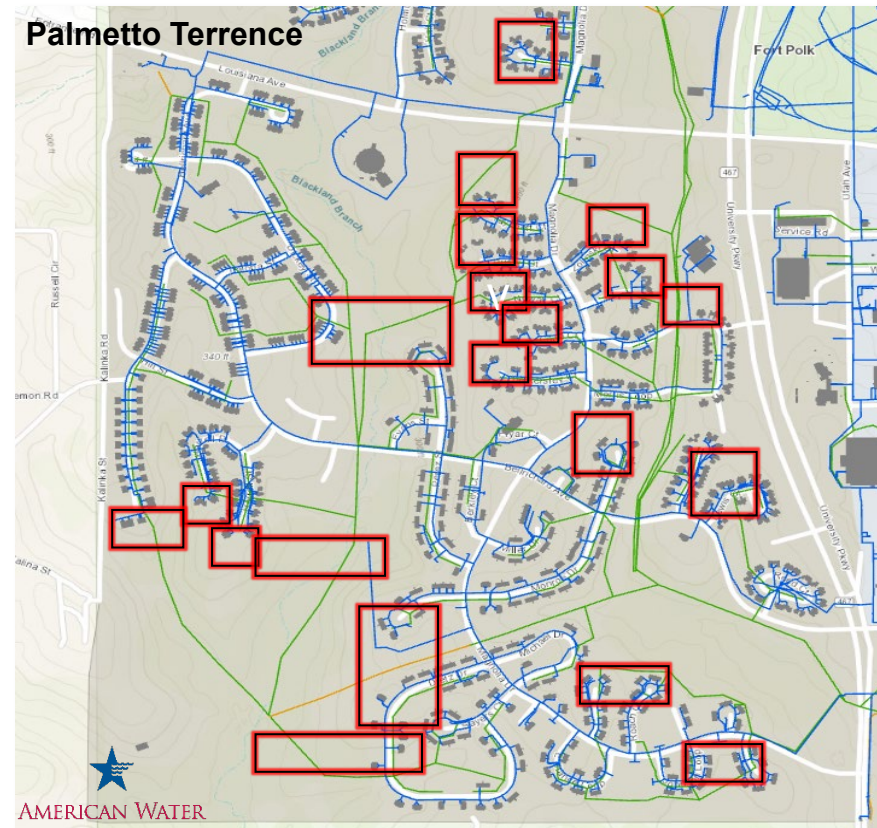

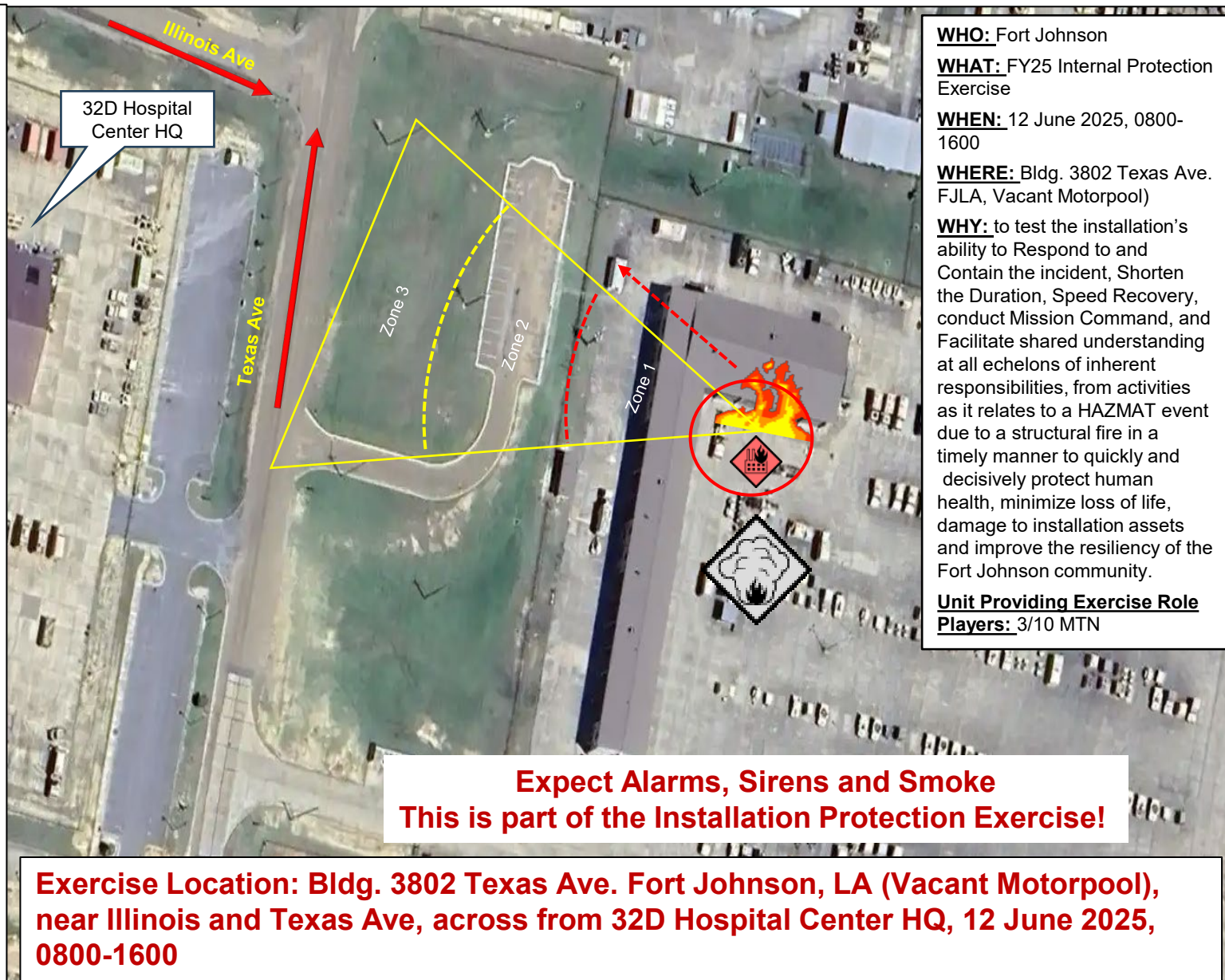


Structural Fire Scenario – June 12, 2025

Annual Survey

The Tenant Satisfaction Survey ended on May 15. Our final participation rate was below target, ending at 19.4% with 548 residents completing the survey. We appreciate everyone that took the time to complete the survey. Once we receive the compiled results, we will use that information to plan future projects/upgrades to our communities.

PCS Season and Housing:

PCS season will be here soon and there are some important steps we would like to remind everyone:

- We require notice in writing at least 30 days prior to moving out of the home. Hard orders are not required to be put on notice. Those can be collected prior to the final move out inspection. Put your notice in as soon as possible to avoid insufficient notice fees.
- As with Transportation, our schedule fills up quickly as we can only conduct so many inspections a day. Get your notice in and move out date secured as soon as possible to align with all your travel plans, HHG shipment and report dates.
- A Move Out Guide is available on the Resident Portal with reminders and tips on how to navigate thru a PCS as smoothly as possible.
- Pre-inspections are available upon request if needed to clear prior to your move out date or just to assess the condition of your home before the final move out inspection.
- Don't forget to provide a forwarding address to USPS as well as update your address with any delivery services such as Amazon, Walmart, Chewy, etc. Corvias is unable to forward any mail or packages delivered after a resident has moved out. That must be handled thru the USPS or merchant the item(s) were purchased thru.

Roads and Playgrounds

Corvias recognizes the importance of maintaining the roads and playgrounds for our residents. Our development team completed the following work as part of the last ODP project:

- Playgrounds – Demolished 6 outdated and offline large playgrounds. Built 4 new playgrounds at existing locations, strategically chosen to serve the most residents possible.
- Roads – Spent over \$2M to repair and repave over 3 miles of roads and sidewalks affecting streets such as: Riverton Dr, Berkley Ct, Tankersley Ct, Nowak Ct, Busch Ct, Zolinski Ct, Traycheff Ct, McCauley Ct and Norris Lp.

We will continue to review the needs of our communities thru the feedback we received in our annual tenant survey as well as suggestions and input we receive from ICE submissions and the monthly town hall walks. These items help us to develop our development plans according to not only what Corvias sees as opportunities for improvement, but most importantly what our residents have identified as opportunities for improvement as well.

We encourage residents to report any potholes in the roads and/or any safety concerns within the communities by contacting their neighborhood center to place a work order or via the Resident Portal.

- Fort Johnson phased in the Global Household Goods Contract (GHC) 02 Dec 2024
 - Each Service Member must be screened **upon receiving orders** to determine if they will move under GHC or the legacy system (DPS)
 - A Sort Tool located on the DPS landing page asks a series of questions to make the determination and way forward

Fool's Gear Cool Gear

HEAD. Considered precious by sensible people: never exposed by the pros. When fully in view, allows immediate identification of unsafe person not using his or hers. Hand out rider education info on sight.

HELMET. Most important piece of protective gear a rider can use. Protects against head injury, windblast, cold, and flying objects. Full-face helmet recommended.

EYES, EARS AND FACE. Exposure leads to irritated eyes, noise-deafening windblast, and distracting impacts from bugs and road debris.

FACESHIELD. "Saves face." Any rider who's been hit in the face by stones, insects, or debris can tell you the benefits.

HANDS. *Au naturel* (not for long). Known to lock into curled position when exposed to cold; not genetically evolved to withstand abrasion.

GLOVES. Keep hands comfortable, functional, and protected. There's an infinite variety for all seasons.

BARE LIMBS. A phenomenon seen only in riders who think it's other people who crash. Subject to ridicule in riding circles.

JACKET AND PANTS. Long sleeves and sturdy trousers resist abrasion and protect against sunburn, dehydration, or hypothermia. Some riders wear padded gear with "body armor" for more protection. Light colors in the daytime and reflectivity at night make it easier for car drivers to see you.

FLIP FLOPS. Terminology for what sandals, toes and feet do upon contact with road surfaces, shift lever, brake pedal, or footrests.

BOOTS. Provide protection against foot and ankle injuries and give you a good grip on footrests or road surfaces.

BOTTOM LINE. Fool's gear identifies an unaware rider. Learn how to avoid embarrassment, ridicule and injury, while gaining valuable skills and knowledge by completing an MSF RiderCourse®.

BOTTOM LINE. Dress for the ride as well as for the crash. Proper riding gear allows you to enjoy the ride in comfort and helps minimize injury.

Enforcement plan for Motorcycle PPE

ACP stop for SM: (Universal UCMJ applies)

- SM is stopped and detained until CoC arrives. CoC can bring proper PPE, have another qualified rider take the motorcycle, or the motorcycle can be towed at owners expense.
- If SM is provided PPE, the SM will drive the motorcycle to an area designated by the CoC to be parked.
- CoC is responsible for revoking motorcycle driving privileges and possible pursue UCMJ ART 92.
- SM information is collected and sent to Safety.

ACP stop for CIV:

- CIV is denied access and turned around at the gate.
- CIV is informed of what PPE is required
- CIV information is collected and sent to Safety.

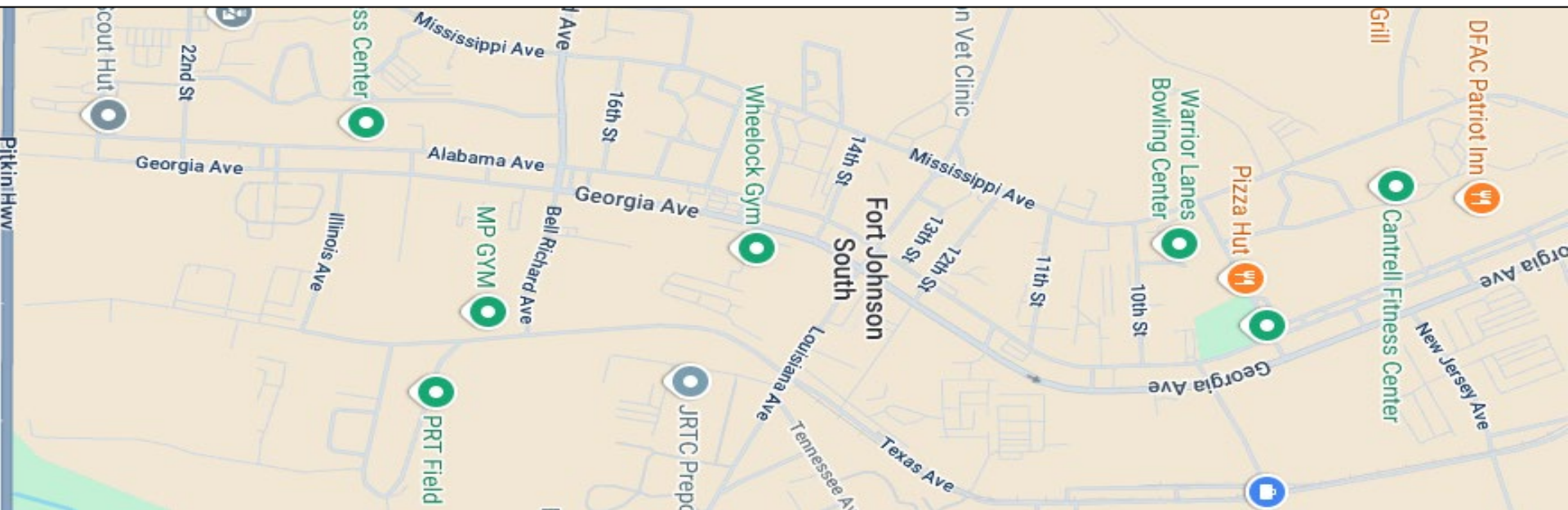

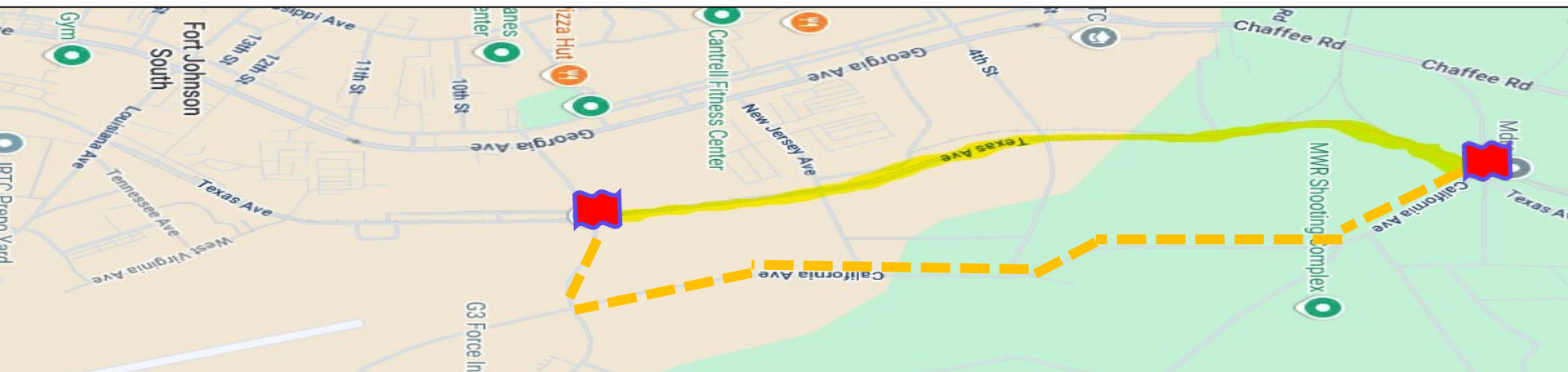
