SUBJECT: Garrison Policy Memorandum #16 – Authorized Patrons for Intramural Sports Activities

1. Reference. Army Regulation (AR) 215-1, Military Morale, Welfare, and Recreation Programs and Nonappropriated Fund Instrumentalities, 24 September 2010.
2. The purpose of this memorandum is to define authorized patrons for organized intramural sports on Fort Polk.
3. Intramural sports activities are primarily established for Armed Forces military personnel.
4. When the number of military personnel available is inadequate to form teams for intramural league play, other authorized patrons may participate who are within the approval authority of the Garrison Commander, as defined in AR 215-1, chapter 7.
5. In the event the facilities cannot accommodate all authorized users, the following are specific use priorities:
 - a. Active Duty (AD) military personnel and Families (including US Coast Guard)
 - b. Members of the Reserve Component and Family Members
 - c. Retired military personnel from active duty and Family Members
 - d. Veterans with 100% service connected disability, honorable discharged
 - e. Unmarried surviving spouses (and Families) of military personnel
 - f. Military personnel of foreign nations with duty at Fort Polk
 - g. US DoD APF/NAF Civilian employees and Family Members
 - h. Non-DoD Federal employees working on the installation
 - i. DoD contract personnel working full time on Fort Polk

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- j. Delayed Entry/Delayed Training Recruits
 - k. Cadets of Armed Forces academies
 - l. Commissioned Corps of the Public Health Service
 - m. Medal of Honor recipients
 - n. Orphans of military members, when not adopted by new parents, under 21 years of age+
6. Any other authorized users will be prioritized on a case-by-case basis.
 7. The common access card (CAC), issued to active duty personnel, selected Reserve, DoD Civilian employees and other eligible personnel will be used for identification purposes. Other forms of identification, as outlined in AR 215-1, paragraph 7-3, will be used for authorized users who are not issued a CAC.
 8. Patronage privileges will be suspended, terminated, or denied if the Garrison Commander or the Director of Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation (DFMWR) determines it to be in the best interest of a MWR program, the garrison/installation, or the Army.
 9. Proponent. The Directorate of Family, Morale, Welfare and Recreation's Division of Community Recreation is the proponent for this policy.
 10. This policy will remain in effect until superseded or rescinded.
