# Take walk on wild side at Global Wildlife Center

#### GLOBAL WILDLIFE CENTER

FOLSOM, La. — Going to and supporting a zoo can be rewarding, but there's something special about seeing an animal run free instead of behind bars.

The Global Wildlife Center is the largest totally free-roaming wildlife preserve of its kind in the country. Located on La. Hwy 40 in Folsom, GWC is home to more than 4,000 exotic, endangered and threatened animals from all over the world. The center is northeast of Baton Rouge.

You will experience a little bit of Africa in Louisiana as you enjoy a one hour and 15 minute guided safari wagon tour through 900 acres of Louisiana countryside, complete with 12 ponds and a lake.

You can even enhance your experience by feeding the animals. A 32ounce souvenir cup is \$2. A family bucket is \$30.

Some of the animals you might feed while coming face to face on the tour include free-roaming bison, giraffes, zebras, camels, elands and more.

The reticulated giraffes at the center are considered gentle giants, which is no surprise considering they have the largest heart of any land mammal. Their hearts can weigh up to 25 pounds! Global Wildlife's family of reticulated giraffes is growing, but not as quickly as the babies. At birth, giraffes weigh 150 pounds and can be up to 6 feet tall. On average, giraffes are 15-18 feet tall and their tongues are 18-20 inches long. Visitors love it when the giraffes snake their tongues into a waiting feed cup.

The Bactrian camels are amazing to see. There are less than 1,000 wild Bactrian camels left in the Gobi Desert, Asia, and they are recognized as a critically endangered species. Bactrian camels are identifiable by their two humps, which can weigh up to 25 pounds per hump. These humps contain fat, which can be turned into energy or water when sustenance is not available.

Discover American bison at the center. There were 30 million bison roaming the Americas before the Europeans settled here. By 1900, there were only about 1,000 bison surviving. Through extensive conservation efforts, the population of bison has risen to 500,000. Bison is a Greek word that means "ox-like animal." Bison are the largest mammal endemic to North America. The bison at Global like to wallow (in the dirt) to deter biting flies and help them shed their fur.

Guided wagon tour ticket prices for people age 12-61 are \$19 per person. Tickets for seniors older than 62 are \$17 per person. Tickets for children ages 2-11 are \$13 per person and ages 1 and under get in free.

Tickets for the safari wagon tour are sold on a first come, first served



basis and are not sold in advance, online or over the phone.

Plan to arrive on the grounds at least two hours before your tour check-in time. On busy days, tours may sell out hours before check-in.

Tour times are updated every Friday and only one week at a time is advertised. Saturday and Sunday tours take place at 9, 10 and 11 a.m., noon, 1 and 2 p.m.

The center is open seven days a week year-long. Call (985) 796-3585 for safari check–in times and availability.

# Act outlines political activities allowed government employees

FORT RUCKER, Ala. - Since 1939, military members and federal employees have been subject to restricted election season activities.

When questions arise about what is permissible and prohibited with regard to a specific political activity, the Hatch Act is the sole source of information.

Ignorance of the law does not excuse an employee's violation of the Hatch Act.

The political activity of government employees has been a concern of government officials since the earliest days of the republic. Thomas Jefferson, the nation's third president, was among the first to express concern about this issue.

In response to his concern, the heads of the executive departments issued an order, which stated, while it is "the right of any officer (federal employee) to give his vote at elections as a qualified citizen ... it is expected that he will not attempt to influence the votes of others nor take part in the business of electioneering, that being deemed inconsistent with the spirit of the Constitution."

However, despite the concerns of Jefferson and other American statesmen, almost a century and a half elapsed before Congress began enacting a comprehensive law regarding the political activities of government employees.

The Hatch Act, a federal law passed in 1939, limits certain political activities of federal employees, as well as some state, D.C., and local government employees who work in connection with federally funded programs.

The law's purposes are to ensure that federal programs are administered in a nonpartisan fashion, to protect federal employees from political coercion in the workplace, and to ensure that federal employees are advanced based on merit and not based on political affiliation

The law was named for Senator Carl Hatch of New Mexico.

It was most recently amended in 2012, limiting the activities of certain state and local government employees.

Military member guidance

U.S. military service members are limited when it comes to political activities. Some restrictions are based in federal law, others in mili-

tary regulations. The main purpose for these restrictions is to avoid the implication or inference that military members represent some official point of view.

The major military prohibition is against any type of partisan activities. A partisan activity is defined as "activity directed toward the success or failure of a (particular) political party or candidate for a partisan political office or partisan political group."

A military member may:

• Register, vote and express personal opinions.

• Encourage other military members to exercise voting rights.

• Join a political club and attend political meetings and rallies as a spectator when not in uniform.

• Make monetary contributions to a political organization.

• Sign petitions for specific legislative action or place candidate's name on the ballot.

• Write letters to the editor expressing personal views (so long as not part of organized letter writing campaign).

• Place bumper stickers on private vehicles.

 Participate in local nonpartisan political activities, so long as not in uniform and no use of government property or resources, no interference with duty and no imposi-set of SPECia publication satisfies and set of set o plied government posi-

tion or involvement. A military member may not:

• Use official authority to influence or interfere.

• Be a candidate for, hold or exercise functions of a civil office.

UNITED • Participate in partisan political cam-

paigns, speeches, articles, TV or radio discussions.

• Serve in official capacity or sponsor a partisan political club.

• Conduct political opinion surveys.

Use contemptuous words against certain civilian leaders (10 U.S.C. 888), which applies to commissioned officers only.

• March or ride in partisan parades.

• Participate in organized effort

• Promote political dinners or



• Display large signs, banners or posters on private vehicles.

• Display a partisan political sign, poster, banner or similar device visible to the public at one's residence on a military installation, even if that residence is part of a privatized housing development.

• Sell tickets for or otherwise actively promote partisan political dinners and similar fundraising events.

Permitted activities for federal employees:

• May be candidates for public office in nonpartisan elections.

> • May register and vote as they choose. • May assist in registration voter drives.

• May express opinions about candidates and issues.

• May contribute STATES OF money to political organizations.

• May attend political fundraising functions.

• May attend and be active at political rallies and meetings.

• May join and be an active member of a political party or club.

• May sign nominating petitions. • May campaign for or against referendum questions, constitutional amendments and municipal ordi-

nances • May campaign for or against candidates in partisan elections.

• May make campaign speeches

for candidates in partisan elections. May distribute campaign literature in partisan elections.

• May hold office in political clubs or parties, including serving as a delegate to a convention.

Prohibited activities for federal employees:

• May not use their official authority or influence to interfere with an election.

• May not solicit, accept or receive political contributions unless both individuals are members of the same federal labor organization or employee organization and the one solicited is not a subordinate employee.

• May not knowingly solicit or discourage the political activity of any person who has business before the agency.

• May not engage in political activity while on duty.

• May not engage in political activity in any government office.

• May not engage in political activity while wearing an official uniform.

 May not engage in political activity while using a government vehicle

• May not be candidates for public office in partisan elections.

• May not wear political buttons on duty.
