The Army Community Service (ACS) Family Advocacy Program (FAP) Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month (TDVAM) contest will accept submissions in two categories:

- · Hand-drawn or hand-painted artwork (any medium)
- Written word (poetry or essay/short story)

Official Rules

- The contest is open to Fort Johnson youth, ages 13-17.
- Entries may be submitted individually, by the youth, based on the submission guidelines below and must clearly reflect the contest theme: #RespectThat!
- Entries must be an original and exclusive work in idea, design, and execution.
- Hand-drawn or hand-painted entries may not include copyrighted materials such as comic characters, magazines, or newspaper illustrations. These works violate copyright laws and are subject to immediate disqualification.
- Written word submissions will be reviewed for plagiarized content. Instances of plagiarism are grounds for the immediate disqualification of the entry.
- Entries will not be returned and are not for sale. All submissions will become the property of the ACS FAP and may be used in various types of media and/or displays. Please consider making a copy of each entry prior to submission.
- An official entry form must accompany EACH submission (see attached).
- All entries must be received by ACS FAP no later than deadline, 25 Feb 25, 4:30 pm.

Submission Guidelines

- Hand-Drawn/Hand-Painted Submission Requirements
 - Original hand-drawn paintings, drawings, or illustrations must be submitted on paper, poster board, or canvas that is at least 11" x 17" but not larger than 18" x 24".
 - Hand-drawn artwork should be designed in horizontal/landscape format as it may be used for a calendar and/or media display.
 - o Artwork may be done by hand in ink, charcoal, marker, watercolor, oil or acrylic paint.
 - o Artwork must be flat. Do not roll, matte, frame or laminate.
 - o Artwork, with official entry form should be submitted to:

- o Written word submissions can be in the form of poetry, essay, or short story.
