
What is Radon?

- Radon is naturally occurring gas that is colorless, odorless, and tasteless.
- It is generated by the breakdown of naturally occurring elements in soil, rocks, and sediments.
- Radon is present everywhere in the world; its concentration in air depends on the local geology and atmospheric conditions.





Radon: Germany Compared to USA Radon Concentration in Buildings



* According to the US EPA, nearly 1 in 3 homes checked in seven states had radon levels over the <u>recommended action level</u> for radon exposure of 1 pCi/L.

How Radon Enters Buildings

- Cracks in solid floors
- Construction joints
- Cracks in walls
- Gaps in suspended floors
- Gaps around service pipes
- Cavities inside walls
- Water supply


Radon Exposure Risks

- Smoking, Radon exposure, and secondhand smoking are leading causes of lung cancer in US
- Radon exposure has a multiplicative effect for smokers
- Risk of developing lung cancer due to lifetime radon exposure is
 2 in 1,000 for someone that never smoked

Risk of dying from lung cancer due to lifetime radon exposure is

20 in 1,000 for smokers

 The risks of dying from lung cancer for a nonsmoker is comparable to risk of dying in a car crash






How to Protect Yourself

- While it's wise to be aware of radon, the risk at average levels is relatively low
- Simple measures like improving ventilation can often reduce radon levels significantly
 - √ Replacing stagnant air in basement and first floor rooms will prevent accumulation
 of radon concentration
 - ✓ Opening doors/windows for a few minutes every day to refresh and purge the air







√ For rooms without windows use fans to force some air exchange through the open door (arms rooms, basement closets etc.)



Radon Within the BMC Legal Background

Radon is <u>no longer</u> regulated in German Final Governing Standards (FGS) nor in Army Regulation 200-1. However, the Garrison has taken the below proactive actions.

Radon Monitoring Explained **Timeline for Testing**

No Mitigation Required (annual testing) **Annual Radon Testing** Continue No Mitigation **Normal Radon** Req. **Testing**

- Considered preliminary sampling (to get updated results)
- Detector placed in the area which are interesting to sample based on the building structure
- Detector remain unaffected for the sampling period of one vear
- Detector gets picked up by a contractor and analyzed in an accredited laboratory
- Depends on the result, building will be mitigated or continued sampled after a certain period of time

Mitigation Required **Annual Radon Testing** Mitigation Req. Radon Tested every 5 years 1 yr Construction Quarterly monitoring for 1

After a facility is mitigated, One Year monitoring will occur, spitted in four quarterly monitoring events (radon detector exchange every three months by the contractor)



- This setting gives us the flexibility to change settings at the installed mitigation system and react quickly if necessary
- Based on the four quarterly monitoring events yearly average will be provided to DPW to evaluate the results





GENERAL FIRE SAFETY

Time to check out your Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Smoke Detectors

According to the NFPA, nearly three of every five home fire deaths resulted from fires in which no smoke alarm was present (41%) or at least one alarm was present but non-operational (16%).

- Check the manufacture date on your smoke detector. They should be replaced every 10 years.
- Smoke detectors should be installed in every bedroom, outside of every sleeping area and on every level including basements.
- Smoke alarms should be installed at least 10 feet from a cooking appliance to minimize false alarms when cooking.
- · Mount smoke alarms high on walls or ceilings (remember, smoke rises). Wall-mounted alarms should be installed not more than 12 inches away from the ceiling (to the top of the alarm).
- · Smoke alarms should be maintained according to manufacturer's instructions.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month using the test button.
- Smoke alarm batteries must be replaced at least once a year. If the alarm chirps, warning the battery is low, replace the battery right away.
- · Manufacturer's instructions are specific to the batteries (brand and model) that must be used. The smoke alarm may not work if the wrong battery is used.

WINTER-RELATED SLIPS, TRIPS AND FALLS

Stay on your feet in wet or icy weather

- Wear proper footwear that is right for the weather. Non-skid boots or shoes with plenty of traction can help prevent falls in wet or snowy
 weather. Wet grass can be as slippery as an icy sidewalk, so plan accordingly.
- Keep your driveway, walkways and stairs clear and free of leaves. As they accumulate or get wet, leaves become slippery.
- · Apply de-icing materials such as salt to reduce ice buildup.

Take short steps over ice. Point toes slightly outward to maintain a stable base of support and try to use only cleared sidewalks and walkways.
Pay attention to where you're going, stay on cleared sidewalks and paths and keep an eye out for patches of black ice.
Use handrails where available to help keep your balance when walkways or steps may be slick.

Winter Driving Conditions


More than 70% of the nation's roads are located in snowy regions, which receive more than five inches average snowfall annually. In 2019, there were 440 fatal crashes and 33,000 injury crashes that occurred during wintry conditions according to the NHTSA.

Depending on where you're traveling to, running out of gas, getting a flat tire or having your vehicle break down on the side of the road can have far more disastrous consequences in the winter, than in the spring or summer. Preparing yourself – and your vehicle – for winter weather is key.

So how should you prepare?

Winter Travel Preparedness

- Plan and evaluate your route ahead of time and anticipate adverse weather conditions.
- Check your vehicle's tires, windshield wipers, coolant, lights and other systems before you hit the road. If you're heading to areas known for snowy conditions, install snow tires before you hit snowy conditions.
- Have an emergency kit and ensure you know how your vehicle handles adverse road conditions.
- Look out for common hazards including hidden potholes, blowing snow or unplowed roads, snowdrifts obscuring roads, sun glare, black ice, bridges or roads near bodies of water (slow down and take your time), tractor-trailers skidding or reducing visibility, other vehicles going too fast for conditions.
- Inform family or friends of your route and expected arrival time and share your location if traveling through remote areas, so they know where you were before losing contact if something happens.
- Maintain your distance from other vehicles.



What To Do If You Get Stranded or Stuck

SEASONAL DRIVING SAFETY

- If you are stranded in a vehicle, stay in the vehicle. Call for emergency assistance if needed, Notify your supervisor and family or friends of your situation.
- Do not leave the vehicle to search for assistance unless help is visible within 100 yards. You may become disoriented and get lost in blowing and drifting snow.
- Display a trouble sign by hanging a brightly colored cloth on the vehicle's radio antenna and raising the hood. Turn on the vehicle's engine for about 10 minutes each hour and run the heat to keep warm. Also, turn on the vehicle's dome light when the vehicle is running as an additional signal.
- Beware of carbon monoxide poisoning. Keep the exhaust pipe clear of snow and open a downwind window slightly for ventilation.
- Watch for signs of frostbite and hypothermia. Do minor exercises to maintain good blood circulation in your body. Clap hands and move arms and legs occasionally. Try not to stay in one position for too long.
- Stay awake, you will be less vulnerable to cold-related health problems. Use blankets, newspapers and even the removable car mats for added insulation.
- Avoid overexertion since cold weather puts an added strain on the heart. Unaccustomed activities such as shoveling snow or pushing a vehicle can bring on a heart attack or make pre-existing medical conditions worse.









Drowsy Driving

A National Sleep Foundation (NSF) poll says 60% of adults have driven while they were tired and another 37%, or 103 million people, have fallen asleep at the wheel. Of those, 13% say they fall asleep while driving at least once a month, and 4% say they have caused a crash by falling asleep while driving. The reasons vary – shift work, lack of quality sleep, long work hours, sleep disorders, and it doesn't only happen on lengthy trips.

- These staggering numbers are backed up by a report by NHTSA that 100,000 police-reported crashes are a result of driver fatigue. Most crashes or near-misses happen at times you would expect drivers to be tired: 4 to 6 a.m., midnight to 2 a.m. and 2 to 4 p.m., according to the NSF.
- Drowsy driving puts everyone on the road at risk. Depending on the person, losing two hours of sleep may have the same effect on driving as drinking three beers. Tired drivers are three times more likely to be in a car crash if they are fatigued.

The NSF offers this advice:

- Get seven or more hours of sleep a night.
- Don't drive if you've been awake for 16 hours or more.
- Stop every two hours to rest.
- Pull over and take a nap if you're drowsy.
- Travel during times you are normally awake

- Driving Under the Influence
- Every day, about 32 people in the United States die in drunk driving crashes. That's one person every 45 minutes. In 2020, 11,654 people died in alcohol impaired driving accidents, a 14% increase from 2019 according to the NHSTA. Drivers impaired by prescription medicines and other drugs increase that number significantly.
- Impaired drivers are most frequently on the road after dark particularly between the hours of midnight and 3 a.m., on weekends.
- While drunk driving has declined by about one-third single 2007, the number of drivers under the influence of drugs has increased.
- SAFETY FACT: 56% of drivers involved in serious injury and fatal crashes who tested positive for at least one drug.
- The NHTSA also found the prevalence of THC (found in marijuana) among drivers on weekend nights has increased 48% since 2007, from 8.6% of drivers to 12.6%. Many states have not yet updated their impaired driving laws to address this growing problem.




Foreign Travel Reporting

DES Fire Safety Tips

COOKING FIRES AND PROCEDURES TO TAKE



If a grease fire erupts in a pan on top of the stove, quickly and carefully cover the pan with a lid or a larger pan. This action will extinguish most stove top fires.

- Never attempt to remove the burning pan or pot away from the stove to the outside.
 Many fires have spread and serious burns occurred by individuals dropping the flaming oil.
- Never, apply water to a grease fire.
- Always isolate the power to the stove, if possible.

Oven Fire Safety Tips

Always turn the controls off and close the door tightly if the fire is in the oven:

- · This will smother the flames.
- Always make sure the oven and stovetop are clean, ensuring no grease buildup:
- Ensure there are no flammables stored in the immediate area
- Always keep pot handles turned inward and away from the edge of the stove:
 - Prevents inadvertent tipping and out of the reach of children.
- Always use a potholder or appropriate utensil to remove lids and coverings from heated containers, which prevents steam or contact burns.
- Always keep flammable fabrics such as towels, dish rags or curtains away from the stovetop and burners:
- Don't wear long, loose sleeves that can hang over the stove while cooking.
- Keep clothing clear of any cooking surface. It can be ignited merely by contact with a burner.

Using Fire Extinguishers



- Have a portable fire extinguisher handy and know how to use it. Be sure it is charged at all times.
- Fire extinguishers are designed to combat small fires. Never attempt to extinguish a fire if the fire is large or spreading - your escape route may be blocked by the spread of fire. If the fire cannot be extinguished using a fire extinguisher, DO NOT ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN ANOTHER ONE: EVACUATE TO SAFETY!



PASSPORTS:

- 1. Customers should renew their passports before they expire, don't wait. Tourist passports have a possible turnaround of up to 6 weeks in normal season.
- 2. Inform yourself with the country of destination's entry requirements, for example: Do I need a VISA? How many months are the minimum requirement for my passport's validity for entry. Obtain country specific entry requirements from the online DoD Foreign Clearance Guide (FCG), https://apacs.milcloud.mil/fcg/loginForm.cfm.
- 3. A SOFA Card is required for family members of Soldiers, authorized civilians and contractors and their Family members, NOT for Service members. Requests for SOFA Card is submitted on AE Form 600-77A, signed by the organization's appointed official (officials are appointed by the organization and the appointment memorandum must be on file at USAG RP Central Processing Facilities Offices in KMC & BMC).

ID CARDS:

- 1. There is no need for ID Card appointments for PIN resets or lost or stolen cards. Walk-ins are welcome, however appointments are priority, so there might be long waiting times.
- 2. ID Card holders can renew their ID Card 30 days before the expiration date and can make an appointment 60 day prior to their expiration date.
- 3. Sponsors may request ID card renewal online, which if approved, are mailed directly to the card recipient; no in-person appointments necessary. Request card renewals online through ID Card Office Online (IDCO) at https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco/. Online renewals do NOT apply to the Common Access Card (CAC), which must be issued/renewed in person.
- 4. Units are responsible for issuing Ration Cards to Service Members and their Family members.

What are the requirements to open a Community Bank Account?

To be eligible for full banking services at Community Bank, you must meet at least one of the requirements below:

- Active-duty U.S. Military, stationed in a country serviced by Community Bank
- A DOD civilian employee who is a U.S. citizen, residing in a country serviced by Community Bank
- A U.S. citizen who is an employee of all other U.S. Government departments, agencies, and Non-appropriated Fund Instrumentalities carrying on functions on a DOD installation in a country serviced by Community Bank
- An authorized family member of such military or civilian employee listed above
- In addition, DOD Component Commands may approve banking services for other individuals when they qualify for individual logistic support under regulations of the appropriate military service which is not precluded by Status of Forces Agreement (SOFA), other intergovernmental agreements, or hosting country or local law.

Micro-Purchase VAT App

- ➤ Eligible Value-Added Tax (VAT) customers can obtain tax relief on micro-purchases through a Smartphone App (Remonon) that is operated by NOVAT GmbH and sponsored by IMCOM-E and Family and MWR.
- Individual micro-purchases cannot exceed 240 Euro (with VAT) per establishment. Customers pay micro-purchases with VAT and upload receipts on Remonon. VAT reimbursement minus processing fees will occur at the end of each calendar month using an uploaded VAT form (NF1).
- Multiple receipts totaling up to 2,499.99 Euro (without VAT) can be used on 1 VAT form (NF1) each calendar month.
 - > Example establishments: Restaurants, Clothing Stores, Bookstores or Grocery Stores.
- Customers are encouraged to upload an unused VAT form (NF1) on the 1st day of every month to ensure maximum savings throughout the calendar month.
- > The Micro-Purchase App is currently in the testing phase with limited slots available.
 - > The KMC and BMC have approximately 277 slots available.
 - > Community-wide availability is planned to launch early 2025 (Jan-Mar).






