Unmarried children (21+) of U.S. citizens or Green Card holders

Current wait time: 2.5-5.5 years (online/in U.S.)

Siblings of U.S. citizens

Current wait time: 8.5-12 years (online/in U.S.)

Married children of U.S. citizens

Current wait time: 5-10 years (online/in U.S.)

PHASE I REQUIREMENTS

Petition: I-130

Asks for everywhere the petitioner has lived and worked in the last 5 years (no gaps)

Fee + biometric photos

\$535 paid to U.S. Department of Homeland Security (cashier's check/money order)
Two (2) biometric photos of petitioner and beneficiary

Proof of citizenship/LPR

Copy of:

- U.S. Green Card *OR*
- U.S. birth certificate *OR*
- U.S. Consular Report of a Birth Abroad *OR*
- U.S. Certificate of Citizenship

Proof of relationship

Requirements depend on the relationship and can be found in the I-130 instructions or at uscis.gov/i-130

IF FILING IN GERMANY, INCLUDE A COPY OF ORDERS TO GERMANY

Common I-130 errors

Marriage end date

If still married, put "N/A" in "Date marriage ended"

Zip code vs. Postal code & State vs. Province

Addresses in the U.S. or on a U.S. military post use zip codes & states

Addresses outside the U.S. use postal codes & provinces

Foreign phone numbers need country codes

Adobe won't let this be typed - must handwrite in black ink

Common I-130 errors

Marriage end date

If still married, put "N/A" in "Date marriage ended"

Zip code vs. Postal code & State vs. Province

Addresses in the U.S. or on a U.S. military post use zip codes & states

Addresses outside the U.S. use postal codes & provinces

Foreign phone numbers need country codes

Adobe won't let this be typed - must handwrite in black ink

Common I-130 errors

Type or handwrite in black ink

Not blue ink! BLACK INK! (But USCIS is generous about penmanship)

Wet signature required

USCIS is known for spot checking signatures on forms -- all signatures must be ink-and-paper, not digital or a photocopy

Don't leave any days unaccounted for!

For employment and residency -- include everywhere (even under the table jobs)

Military-specific I-130 answers

Physical addresses on post (not CMR for mailing address)

[Bldg. ##] [Street name]

APO, AE [Zip code for CMR]

APO, AE 09112

Germany on U.S. military post

Germany on U.S. military post

Addresses for basic training and AIT or OSUT

Best guess for an exact address is acceptable -- if not available, put address of company, battalion, or local command HQ

Occupation: Active Duty Soldier

Listing the MOS or even writing "Officer" may confuse USCIS

Military-specific I-130 answers

U.S. Army address

Start date should be date of enlistment; only one entry for entire Army time (unless gap in service)

Put building Commanding Officer sits in as U.S. Army address

Schooling = Employment

Periods of time in school count as employment for USCIS

List occupation as "student" and put registrar's address

If PCSing, put "Pending orders to [base name]"

Fill out city, state, and zip code of chosen base for "address in U.S."

AFFIDAVIT OF SUPPORT REQUIREMENTS

Biographical info

Full name, citizenship, place of birth, duty station or city/state/country of residence of affiant

Proof of citizenship/LPR

Copy of:

- U.S. Green Card *OR*
- U.S. birth certificate *OR*
- U.S. Consular Report of a Birth Abroad *OR*
- U.S. Certificate of Citizenship

Relationship to couple

Specify how affiant knows both the petitioner and the beneficiary with as many IF DUAL PROXY MARRIAGE, emphasize time w/applicant after date of marriage

Is it genuine?

State whether affiant believes marriage is genuine, ideally with a longer explanation of general impressions of the relationship

PHASE II

Initial package to Frankfurt

ON TOP: Copy of I-130 approval letter

Usually sent by e-mail and snail mail

DS-260 barcode

Fill out form at link provided on I-130 approval letter;
barcode generated at end

Original AND photocopy of beneficiary's birth, marriage, & police certificate(s)

Police certificate for any country lived in for 1 year or more.
Add divorce decree if applicable.

Color photocopy of biometric passport page

Two (2) biometric photos w/name on back

I-864 and W2s/1040s (Petitioner)

Frankfurt asks for last W2/1040, but for service members
often asks for an additional two years (three total) later
Recommend sending all 3 with initial package

Medical exam and consular interview go hand-in-hand

Each must be scheduled (or completed) before doing the other

Don't schedule the medical exam until receiving invite to schedule consular interview

If time is a factor, recommend doing medical exam 1-2 weeks prior to interview

*Must be with Embassy-approved provider
Schedule by calling provider
Bring DS-260 barcode, passport, confirmation of consular interview*

Consular Interview



*Schedule online through link sent by consulate/embassy
Bring DS-260 barcode, passport, confirmation of medical exam, and documents from medical exam (if applicable)
If approved, consulate will keep passport*

Requirements change based on grounds for naturalization



Step II: Complete interview

Questions about application
English language test
Civics test



Step III: Attend naturalization ceremony

Mandatory in-person attendance!!!

GROUNDS FOR NATURALIZATION

Military service

No fee!
N-426 (Certification of military service)
N-426 supporting documents (varies O-6 to O-6)

3 years Long-Term Permanent Resident (LPR) card holder, 3 years married to 3 year US spouse

\$725 fee
Proof of relationship
Marriage certificate
Proof of spouse's citizenship

Five (5) year LPR holder

\$725 to U.S. Department of Homeland Security

319(b): U.S. spouse receives overseas employment

\$725 fee
Proof of overseas employment offer (orders ok)

EVERYONE MUST PROVIDE N-400, COPY OF GREEN CARD, ORDERS TO GERMANY TWO (2) BIOMETRIC PHOTOS (PX PHOTOBOOTH), AND TWO (2) FINGERPRINT CARDS

Common N-400 errors

Physical addresses on post (not CMR for mailing address)

Addresses for basic training and AIT or OSUT

Best guess for an exact address is acceptable -- if not available, put address of company, battalion, or local command HQ

Job title with U.S. Army -- keep it simple, stupid!

Active Duty Soldier

Common N-400 errors

Trips outside U.S. in last five (5) years

List any/all countries traveled to on orders as "on U.S. military orders"

End date for time stationed in Germany should be "present"

Any time outside U.S. on military orders does not go in trip/day total

Have you served in the Armed Forces (or similar)?

Yes!

Are you scheduled to deploy in the next 90 days?

Answer honestly -- if on response force (UCRF, QRF, etc.), select yes

Common N-426 errors

Time in service

If presently serving, put service end date as "present"

Make sure pages 3-5 are correctly filled out by certifying official (first O-6 in applicant's chain of command)

Be sure to check all relevant boxes about service member's service

On signature page, put records of the "U.S. Army" and fill out information with O-6's name, email, etc.


Anything but "U.S. Army" (or other service name) will be rejected

Expect avg. 2-6 month turnaround.*

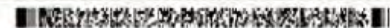

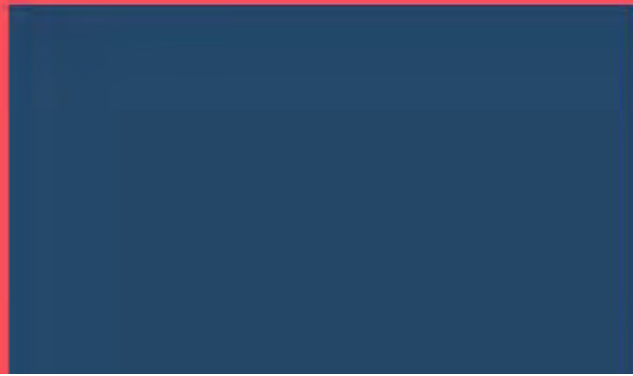

Parole in Place

I-485 and I-130



I-485 is for adjustment of status

Should also be used any time filing for green card for someone already in the U.S. with (or entered on) legal status (i.e. work visa, tourist visa, etc.)

Frankfurt will not accept I-485

Submit I-130 package to Frankfurt; submit I-485 online or via mail
Submit both at same time

I-485 filled out by immigrant

Provide info similar to I-130A, including residences and employment for 5 years

I-485 and I-130 requirements

I-485 has its own reqs

Cost: usually \$1,140, but lower for some under-14s and refugees

Required documents for initial submission include:

I-864 (filled out by I-130 petitioner)

Copy of passport biometric & entry pages

Copy of entry visa

Two (2) biometric photos

Copy of birth certificate

I-601A (8 USC 1182 (7(a(i))))

Parole in Place (PIP)



Required document

I-131 w/"Parole in Place" handwritten on form

Biometric photos of parolee

Active duty service member or veteran proof (orders and CAC)

Letter of support from service member

Eligible family members

Spouse, widow, parent of active duty service member or veteran

File at USCIS office closest to parolee

PIP Pros



Grants status to those who enter U.S. illegally (few paths)

Free

Designed to be used as springboard for I-130 (or other)

PIP Cons



Parolee MUST stay in U.S. after granted (otherwise, 10 year

ban)

Apprises USCIS to presence in U.S. without status -- huge risk if denied

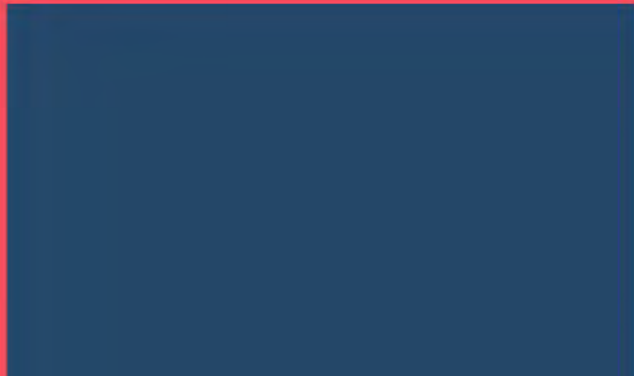

Consular Report of a Birth Abroad

Complete DS Form 11 online; enter mailing address as "USAG Bavaria MPD, TTN: Passports, Unit 28130, APO AE 09114" and enter "000-00-0000" as SSN

Get Geburtenregister

Fill out DS-2029 (eCBRA)

Provide below documentation at passport appointment:

o Marriage certificate for parents (if applicable)

o Divorce decrees (and/or death certificates) for ALL previous marriages for parents (if applicable)

o Proof of U.S. Citizenship for parent (To transfer U.S. citizenship, five years of physical presence, with two years after the age 14, in the U.S., is required for at least one U.S. parent. Additional documentation is

required to prove physical presence such as school transcripts, military records, employment records.)

o Parents' Passports (if the parent(s) do(es) not have a passport, an original citizenship document is required: birth certificate, naturalization certificate, or certificate of citizenship)

o Parents not married or not married for one year prior to the baby's date of birth: DS Form 5507 "Affidavit of Parentage, Physical Presence and Support"; German Vaterschaftsanerkennung or a German statement

regarding custody (Sorgerechterklärung specifying sole or joint custody)

o Military ID cards for both parents

*o Payment (money order/cashier's check made payable to Dept. of State): \$100 (no-fee passport) or \$215 (fee passport) ***If you have submitted the eCRBA, there is no payment*

required for the no-fee passport but a

\$115 is required for a fee (tourist) passport at the time of the appointment.
