
USAG-RP Real Property Planning Board (RPPB)





SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum 2024-XXX — United States Army Garrison Rheinland-Pfalz (USAG RP), Driver Improvement Training Policy Letter

Reference: AER 190-1, Driver and Vehicle Requirements and the Installation Traffic Code for the U.S. Forces in Germany.

- PURPOSE: To reduce the amount of traffic accidents and traffic violations to improve the overall quality life in the community.
- APPLICAPABILITY: Procedures and responsibilities established herein are applicable to units, organizations, and agencies within the USAG RP Military Community
- 3. POLICY:
- a. USAG RP has recorded over 2,100 traffic offenses over the past 24 months. That includes over 1,700 traffic accidents and nearly 400 other traffic violations. Most of the traffic accidents are caused by inattentive driving, excess speeding, and distracted driving. This is a preventable trend that needs to be eradicated as it impacts mission readiness.
- In an effort to curb this trend and improve the overall quality of life for our community, both US and Host Nation, USAG-RP will institute a Remedial Driver Improvement Program.
- c. The purpose for the training will be to enhance the skills and knowledge of drivers, focusing on safe and responsible driving practices. By addressing areas such as defensive driving techniques, understanding road signs and rules, and improving awareness of potential hazards, this training aims to reduce the likelihood of accidents, minimize traffic violations, and promote overall road safety. The training will be conducted at the Workforce Development Center on Sembach Kaserne or annex location designated by the USAG RP Safety office.
- d. Beginning 1 April 2024, drivers who are cited in violation of any of the below offenses will need to attend the Driver Improvement Training:
 - (1) Determined to be at fault for causing a motor vehicle traffic accident.

Remedial Driver Training will be conducted at the Workforce Development Center, Sembach Bldg. 109.

Background

USAG RP has recorded over 2,100 traffic offenses over the past 24 months. That includes over 1,700 traffic accidents and nearly 400 other traffic violations. This is a preventable trend that needs to be eradicated as it impacts mission readiness.

Purpose

To reduce the amount of traffic accidents and traffic violations to improve the overall quality life in the community.

Applicability

Procedures and responsibilities established herein are applicable to units, organizations, and agencies within the USAG RP Military Community.

Implementation

Beginning 1 April 2024, drivers who are cited in violation of any of the below offenses will need to attend the Driver Improvement Training:

- 1. Determined to be at fault for causing a motor vehicle traffic accident
- 2. Involved in an alcohol related offense with a motor vehicle.
- 3. Disobeying a traffic control device such as a Traffic Light, Stop Sign or Yield Sign.
- 4. Speeding more than 20 KM over the posted speed limit or cited for Reckless Driving.
- 5. Cited for two or more Traffic Violations in a 30 day period.

Enhanced Security Pedestrian Gate (ESPG) Update

- May 2023, First two ESPGs placed on Kleber and Daenner Kasernes
- February 2024, New ESPGs placed on Panzer and Kleber (Clock Tower) Kasernes
- March 2024, New ESPG arriving, replacing ESPG at BMC (Medical Compound) and Smith Barracks
- O/A end of June 2024, New ESPGs will arrive and be installed at the Pulaski Exit Gate and at Gate 1. LRMC (Near Emergency Room)









Parking Discs WILL BE ENFORCED.

When parking in designated areas with the parking disc sign, such as near Garrison post offices or other garrison service locations it is a mandatory requirement to use a parking disc placed visibly in your vehicle windshield. Failure to comply will result in receiving a parking ticket. Our Military Police are actively enforcing this law. The parking discs should be prominently displayed in your car's windshield, clearly indicating the time you have parked there. Let's work together to create a convenient and organized parking environment for everyone, while avoiding any unnecessary penalties.

What does this mean?

- Patrols will write 1408's (tickets), you will be entered in the Automated Law **Enforcement Response and** Tracking System (ALERTS)
- Patrol supervisors will ensure patrols are actively issuing citations when appropriate.

DACID Crime Trends in KMC/BMC




Sexual Offenses

- Accounted for 17% of felony crimes reported to CID across KMC and BMC, and nearly 28% of the CID investigative caseload in CY23.
- Largest categories were Sexual Assault (41%) and Abusive Sexual Contact (48%)
- 34% of sexual offenses reported in CY23 occurred in previous years

Drug Offenses

- 35% of offenses reported to CID in KMC/BMC
- 68% of all drug cases originated with UA
- CID Kaiserslautern established the Special Emphasis Team to increase capacity for proactive initiatives, including drug suppression operations





Behavioral Threat Assessment Program



Behavioral Threat Assessment (BTA) Program and Coordinators:

- Established to assist CID and Army-wide efforts to mitigate the risk of targeted violence through threat assessments, stakeholder engagement, and CID (HQ) Behavioral Analysis Unit support.
- Threat assessments are not criminal investigations, but often work in parallel to case agents when a potential felony crime has been committed.
- Available as a law enforcement resource to commanders to support threat management and violence prevention through training, assessments, or investigative support

- 2. Military ID, dependent ID or Stateside driver's license if they do not yet have an ID.
- 3. Social Security card,
- 4. Fingerprint request memo, if applicable, which is obtained from HR.
- 5. Don't moisturize your hands prior to the appointment until after your fingerprints have been taken

Note: Fingerprints are by appointments only. Personnel requesting fingerprints must first go through their unit's security managers. To make an appointment please call commercial: 06111-43-541-3037 or DSN: 541-3037.

Foreign Travel Reporting

In accordance with AR 380-67, PERSONNEL SECURITY PROGRAM, "all personnel possessing a Department of Defense security clearance must report foreign travel to the security office prior to travel being performed". Upon completion of travel, personnel will report foreign contact when there is suspicion of attempts to attain information.



- Good Housekeeping is an essential factor in preventing workplace and home fires.
- Charcoal and gas grills are designed for <u>outdoor use only!</u> Before the season's first barbecue, check the gas tank hose for leaks by applying a light soap and water solution to the hose and then turning on the gas. If there is a propane leak, the solution will bubble.
- Store paints, and flammable liquids away from any heat, sparks or flame.
- Do not run extension cords under carpets and never use for permanent wiring.



ACES provides Counseling; Tuition Assistance; Army Personnel Testing; Credentialing Assistance; Basic Skills Education Program (GT Score Improvement); National Testing Centers; ASVAB for Recruiting Services; ASVAB Career Exploration Program for DoDEA high schools. (In-Person College Courses): ERAU & UMGC. Locations: Sembach, ROB, Landstuhl, and Baumholder (Ed center Clinic Kaserne Bldg 8745, Baumholder Army Personnel Testing Smith Barracks Bldg 8332.
 - a. American Education Week (All Centers): 13-17 Nov 23 (See flyers).
- 2. Transition Assistance Program (TAP). TAP is a congressionally mandated program for all transitioning Soldiers that helps them prepare for their post-military career. All service members must start TAP NLT 365 days prior to expiration of Term of Service (ETS) or retirement date (may start TAP up to 18 months before ETS or 24 months before retirement).
- 3. Career Skills Program (CSP). CSP provides Soldiers the opportunity to participate in skills training programs (such as internships) while still on active duty for an increased probability of employment in high-demand and highly-skills jobs. The Soldier must be within 180 days of separation/retirement, completed TAP requirements and have the commander's approval.
- **4. Total Army Sponsorship Program (TASP).** TASP is a commander's program. The commander is responsible for its implementation, leadership involvement and its success. The USAG-RP DHR Installation Sponsorship Liaison & ACS Relocation Readiness Program Manager are the POCs for training, assistance and resources.
- **5. Army Substance Abuse Program (ASAP).** USAG RP's Army Substance Abuse Program provides the community with suicide prevention education, substance use and alcohol abuse prevention activities, confidential employee assistance counseling, referrals to mental health resources and drug testing services to sustain and enhance resiliency and readiness.

PASSPORTS:

1. Customers should renew their passports before they expire, don't wait. Tourist passports have a possible turnaround of up to 6 weeks in normal season.

- 2. Inform yourself with the country of destination's entry requirements, for example: Do I need a VISA? How many months are the minimum requirement for my passport's validity for entry. Obtain country specific entry requirements from the online Foreign Clearance Guide (FCG).
- 3. A SOFA Card is required for family members of Soldiers, authorized civilians and contractors and their Family members, NOT for Service members. Requests for SOFA Card is submitted on AE Form 600-77A, signed by the organization's appointed official (officials are appointed by the organization and the appointment memorandum must be on file at USAG RP Central Processing Facilities Offices in KMC & BMC).

ID CARDS:

- 1. There is no need for ID Card appointments for PIN resets or lost or stolen cards. Walk-ins are welcome, however appointments are priority, so there might be long waiting times.
- 2. ID Card holders can renew their ID Card 30 days before the expiration date and can make an appointment 60 day prior to their expiration date.
- 3. Units are responsible for issuing Ration Cards to Service Members and their Family members.
