

- New AEA 220-5 Regulation
- Stationing process starts with stationing request submitted to USAREUR-AF G5





Army Stationing Installation Plan (ASIP)

Regulatory Guidance: AR 5-18 (5 August 2022)

- Paragraph 1-14. Commanders of Army commands, Army service component commands, and direct reporting units; senior commanders; and installation/garrison commanders will -
 - Review the ASIP installation report quarterly. Within 60 days of receipt of the report, provide recommended changes through appropriate channels to the HQDA proponent for inclusion in the source databases (such as SAMAS, DRRS – A, FMSWEB, ATRRS, ARNG, and USAR unit locations). Provide an information copy of these submissions to DCS, G – 9 (DAIN – ODR).
 - 2. Report improperly identified or undocumented derivative units' strength (officer, warrant officer, enlisted, and civilian) and location to the DCS, G 9 (DAIN ODR) for inclusion in the ASIP.
 - 3. Report improperly identified or undocumented derivative units' changes to appropriate channels to update ASIP data in DRRS A and FMSWEB.
 - 4. Submit report on transient training data (not including ATRRS training) for inclusion in the ASIP to DCS, G 9 (DAIN ODR).
 - 5. Designate an ASIP point of contact (POC) and provide the POC name, position, and phone number to the DCS, G 9.
 - Your FORCE MANAGER is most likely going to be your POC and needs to understand this responsibility.

Key Takeaway. IMCOM is no longer the lead agency for ASIP integrity. It is the responsibility of every unit Commander (at levels stated above) to self-report, identify discrepancies, and provide revisions to HQDA (DCS G-9).

DRSS-A is one method of communicating these revisions/discrepancies to HQDA

Why you should care. ASIP directly feeds the Real-Property Planning and Analysis System (RPLANS) database, which ensures proper funding for the maintenance and renovations of your facilities!





- Army Maintenance Application (ArMA) is a new system that allows all occupants to electronically submit and track DMOs to the DPW work reception desk.
- The app can be launched on a computer or smart phone through a publicly available website.

ArMA Overview

- ArMA Functions
 - Quickly and easily submit DMO related questions or issues via a phone or web browser
 - Include pictures of the issue
 - Check the status of an issue on-line
 - Communicates with customers via email and text
 - Submit questions, comments, or responses to the DPW customer service desk
 - Automated delivery of customer satisfaction survey upon completion of maintenance orders
 - Non-Emergency DMOs
- ArMA Facts
 - Self-registration by soldiers and family members with self-identification of installation, building, and unit
 - Accounts must be confirmed by a "army.mil" email address
 - Linked within the Digital Garrison App
 - Common platform for residents command-wide (ServiceNow)
 - Emergency DMOs must be phoned-in immediately


Demand Maintenance Orders (DMO): These services include work that is either corrective in nature (e.g., repairs, modifications, installations, and replacements) or not generally considered to be a maintenance activity. DMO's are categorized by priority: Emergency, Urgent, or Routine.

The 5-W's of the RPPB

Who:

IMCOM-E Winter 22-23 Energy Guidance: Individual Measures

Heating a room to 19°C (66°F) instead of 24°C (75°F) saves up to 30% Office areas (Individuals):

- 1. Turn off heating or set thermostats to "snowflake" or "one" in hallways, stairwells and other typically unoccupied areas of the office
- 2. Set max heating to 19°C (66°F), when not interfering with the safety or health of those using the facility
- 3. Set thermostats to no more than "three" in occupied spaces
- 4. Set thermostats to "one" at the end of the workday, nights, weekends and holidays
- 5. Keep doors and windows closed except for ventilation
- 6. Consolidate office areas and office times as mission permits; use telework when effective
- 7. Get rid of space heaters
- 8. Close shutters/roladens at night; open them in the day



"Who Let the Dogs Out?"

USAG Rheinland-Pfalz Pet Policy:

- 1. Pets will not be exercised in the immediate vicinity of government Family housing.
- 2. Pets will not be allowed to relieve themselves on balconies, playgrounds, or within 50 feet of government Family housing.
- 3. Pet owners are required to carry a feces bag when outdoors with their pet.
- 4. Pet owner will immediately clean up excrements created by their pet, place it in a plastic bag and dispose of the bag in a trash container. This applies to all areas within USAG Rheinland-Pfalz Baumholder Military Community, including dog park areas.
- 5. Pets will not be tied to stair railings, pipes, shrubbery, and trees or kept in fenced playgrounds where small children may congregate. Pets will not be left unattended on balconies.
- 6. If the pet owner is going to be absent from the quarters for an extended period of time, they must make arrangements for proper care of the pet. The owner is responsible for informing the Stairwell coordinator and building coordinator of the person(s) that will be responsible for the pet if the pet is left in the quarters. Personnel responsible for pet abandonment incidents will be subject to disciplinary action by both military and civil authorities.

Private Organizations (PO) on Army Installations

PO Establishment

- 1. Submit valid documents to PO Liaison Office:
 - USAG RP Application
 - Constitution and Bylaws (Must include the articles of agreement listed in AR 210-22)
 - Officer Listing (Include address, phone number email and SOFA status)
 - SOFA Status Memo (51% of members must have SOFA status)
 - Valid Proof of Insurance
 - Request to establish a bank account with IRS SS-4 document
- 2. Packet is submitted for Legal Review by PO Liaison.

Once favorable legal opinion is received and written approval is obtained from Director, Family and MWR, approval memo is provided to Private Organization POC. POs requesting space must initiate a space request through the USAG RP Plans, Analysis, and Integration Office to pursue a real estate license or agreement if space is available.

Fundraisers on Army Installations

Fundraiser Submission Approval Process for approved Private Organizations, Informal Funds (units), or Soldier Family Readiness Groups

- Fundraiser Requests should be submitted a minimum of 30 days before the event date to PO Liaison Office (PO's must have current approval to operate and be current on insurance – it cannot be lapsed):
 - a) Event Application
 - b) Valid Food Handler Card (if food is involved at fundraiser)
 - c) Number of fundraisers will be set by local Family and MWR Standard Operating Procedure.
- 2. Packet is submitted for Legal Review by PO Liaison.
- 3. Written Letter of Approval from Director, Family and MWR is provided to POC after favorable legal review is received, reflecting the number of fundraisers remaining for the FY.



USAG-RP Real Property Planning Board (RPPB) The "ART"

PURPOSE: Assists the Garrison Commander in managing, developing, realigning, cleaningup, and closing the installation, area facilities, and real estate. Acts as the installation "city planning council" to ensure the orderly development and management of installation real property. This includes coordinating installation real property master planning with adjacent and nearby installations, other activities and land use of the DOD and federal agencies, local agencies, nongovernmental groups and associations, etc. (Requirement: AR 210-20)





IMCOM-E Winter 22-23 Energy Guidance: Housing and Barracks Measures

Additional saving options in areas of daily life:

- 1. Slightly reduce overall temperature and heat rooms uniformly
- 2. Reduce heating of hallways and keep doors closed to reduce heat losses
- 3. Keep windows closed while heating; minimal heat in unused rooms
- 4. Pull down window exterior blinds and shutters at night
- 5. Reduce hot water consumption in bathroom
- 6. Wear thick clothing or extra layers at home in the heating season

Saving Electricity:

- 1. Turn off lights in all unoccupied rooms and use daylight
- 2. Turn off electrical systems when not used or leaving the house
- 3. Use energy saving products like LED light bulbs
- 4. Use energy-saving process settings for washing machines, dishwashers, etc.
- 5. Consider Holiday Lighting that is EU voltage and LED bulbs, and partner the lights with a timer to come on and shut off at specific times

- The USAG Rheinland-Pfalz Baumholder Military Community has established two areas where pet owners can go to in order to let their dog(s) off the leash. He tasks his secretary to prepare the billing statements during duty hours on government equipment.	Misuse of government resources and time. 5 CFR 2635.704 and 705; JER para 3-305b.
A unit commander appoints a unit point of contact for the local Military Spouses Organization (MSO) membership drive.	Misuse of position, misuse of government resources, endorsement of a private organization, official participation in membership drive. 5 CFR 2635.702 and .705I; JER para 3-205 and 3-210.
Captain Blue, Commander, A Company, is a member of the National Association of Officers (NAO). He directs his soldiers to accept donations (i.e., sell) raffle tickets for the NAO's major fundraising event during duty hours while in a duty status.	Misuse of position and government resources. 5 CFR 2635.702 and .705; JER para 3-305. May also be in violation of State law concerning gambling and lotteries.





Oversight and Administration

- The Installation Commander has authority over installation access and approval to operate for all non-Federal entities (private organizations).
- ✓ Before operating on Department of Defense (DoD) installations, private organizations must request and receive written permission.
 - Garrison Commander Designated authority for approval, disapproval, and withdrawals.
 - Directorate of Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation Designated to manage the administrative process for private organizations on behalf of the Garrison Commander.
- ✓ Responsibility for command oversight of the program includes regulatory requirements to:
 - Be aware of all private organizations operating on DoD installations.
 - Review membership provisions.
 - Implement and ensure compliance with regulatory requirements.
 - Take action as necessary to ensure compliance / withdraw authorization.





General Guidelines

- ✓ Private Organizations shall be self-sustaining, primarily through dues, contributions, service charges, fees, or special assessment of members. The sole purpose of a private organization cannot be to raise funds.
- ✓ Private organizations are not entitled to certain levels of DoD support unless they have statutory authorization (Example: American National Red Cross, United Service Organization, Armed Service YMCA, Civil Air Patrol).
- ✓ DoD personnel acting in an official capacity will not execute charters that serve as the legal basis for any non-Federal entity or other private organization.
- The private organization entity shall have adequate insurance to protect against liability and property damage claims or other legal actions.
- ✓ Private organizations shall comply with applicable fire and safety regulations. They are not exempt from local laws because they operate on Federal property. They must obtain any required licensing, certification, or registration required by local authorities
- Private organizations must receive permission to conduct events that are on the installation and are open/advertised to more than their immediate members.





Private Organization General Guidelines

- Installations cannot favor or appear to favor one Private Organization over another. Private Organizations will receive no special treatment or Army endorsement even if they promote Army goals or support the military community.
- ✓ To prevent the appearance of official sanction or support by the Department of Defense:
 - Non-Federal entities may not use the seals, logos, or insignia of the Department of Defense or any DoD Component, DoD organizational unit, or DoD installation on organization letterhead, correspondence, titles, or in association with organization programs, locations, or activities.
- Private Organizations are not part of the military, so they will receive only limited Government supervision and oversight.
 - Private Organizations cannot use Army services or official resources (legal, audit, transportation, postal, printing, management, etc.)
 - DoD personnel are not authorized to participate in day-to-day management for a Private Organization, not authorized to act as a fiduciary.
- The Staff Judge Advocate Office will review all private organizations requests for legal sufficiency.





Private Organization Common Requests – Special Requirements

- ✓ Ongoing Compliance and Reporting Requirements
 - Report major changes in: activities, membership requirements, officers, objectives, organization, structure, management functions, constitution and bylaws, planned use of funds must be reported to remain in good standing.
 - Submit reoccurring reporting / documentation requirements.
 - Comply with applicable regulations and policies.
- ✓ Fundraising
 - POs must receive permission to conduct fundraisers.
 - Fundraising is only authorized on an occasional basis. They must not compete with the Combined Federal Campaign or Army Emergency Relief.
 - The Department of Defense (DoD) cannot co-sponsor, endorse or appear to endorse PO. fundraisers, except allowed by other regulations (Combined Federal Campaign, Army Emergency Relief).
 - Legal review is required.
- ✓ Advertising
 - POs may utilize paid advertising available through the Directorate of Family and MWR.
 - All advertising present on the installation to more than its immediate members must be approved.
 - All print material must contain a disclaimer.
- ✓ Membership Drives
 - POs must receive permission to conduct membership drives that are on the installation and advertised to more than their immediate members.
 - DoD cannot co-sponsor, endorse, or appear to endorse PO membership drives.
