SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum #2, Substance Abuse Prevention and Deterrence Policy

## 1. REFERENCES.

- a. AR 600-85, 28 November 2016, The Army Substance Abuse Program
- b. AR 350-1, 10 December 2017, Army Training and Leader Development
- c. AR 60-63, 14 April 2015, Army Health Promotion
- d. Army Directive 2016-15 Change in the Army's Random Deterrence Drug Testing Program
- 2. PURPOSE. To provide guidance on prevention and deterrence of substance abuse issues.
- 3. APPLICABILITY. This policy applies to all Department of the Army (DA) personnel assigned to Army support activities and U.S. Army elements (USAE) of Rheinland-Pfalz.
- 4. POLICY. All US Army Soldiers assigned in the Rheinland-Pfalz area of operation will comply with this policy to sustain force readiness.

## PROCEDURES.

- a. Soldiers will receive mandatory substance abuse awareness training annually. A copy of the sign-in roster containing topic, facilitator, attendance and length of the training must be provided to the Army Substance Abuse Program (ASAP) within five (5) working days upon completion of training.
- b. Company Commanders will ensure random testing for 10% of the Soldiers per month and all Soldiers assigned are tested a minimum of once per year in the ongoing deterrence process. All specimens must be processed with ASAP within five (5) working days upon completion of training. A signed memo by the Company Commander must accompany the specimens when they have exceeded five (5) working days in storage.

- c. The Unit Risk Inventory is required at a rate of one survey per Soldier per year.
- d. Suicide Awareness training will be conducted on an annual basis. The standard Suicide Prevention training for the Army is Ask, Care, and Escort. Suicide awareness training sign-in rosters must be provided to the ASAP Suicide Prevention Program Manager within five (5) working days upon completion of training.
- PROPONENT. ASAP is the proponent for this policy. The POC is the Army Substance Abuse Program Manager, at commercial 0631-3406-1710 or DSN 493-1710.
