



## USAG R-P MPD Reassignments

## Processing Requests for Deletion, Deferment, and Early Arrival

- 1. PAR requests will be forwarded to the MPD for submission to HRC.
  - a. OCONUS Actions UDL: AC\_HRC\_OFF\_WO\_ENL\_OCONUS\_Actions (00000000054274)
  - b. Requests must include colonel/O-6 level chain of command recommendation.
  - c. Requests may be disapproved at any level in the chain of command without referral to HRC, except for requests based on medical reasons of the Soldier.
  - d. Requests related to REENLISTMENT assignments must be processed through the supporting Career Counselor's office.
  - e. Requests based on a Family member must be submitted as a compassionate request to HRC Special Actions Office.
- 2. Requests resulting in Soldiers departing OCONUS locations after or before their DEROS <u>must also include a request for a FSTE or FSTC</u>, except for compassionate or adverse action requests.
- 3. Requests will be submitted within 30 calendar days of the IPPS-A cycle date or as soon as the determination is made.
  - a. Requests submitted after 30 calendar days due to unforeseen circumstances will not be rejected; however, they must explain circumstances causing the late submission. Supporting documentation must be included (for example profile, court documents, etc.).
- 4. Requests will not be submitted to HRC <u>if data to support the requested action is not</u> <u>correct in IPPS-A</u>.
  - a. For example, if the assignment is not in an "approved" status in IPPS-A, requests will be returned, and the unit will have to resubmit once the assignment is out of a "draft" status and approved.
- 5. If a disqualifying factor can be resolved <u>within 120 calendar days</u> of the report month, deferment should be requested instead of deletion.
- 6. Early arrival versus early report. Requests for early arrival are requests to change the report date in IPPS-A and on the Soldier's orders. Early report is the ability to report earlier than their report date without requiring a change to the report date or amendment to orders.
- 7. Requests for deferment or early arrival <u>will not exceed 120 days before or after the</u> <u>report date</u>, unless exception to policy is approved by HRC.
  - a. Multiple requests on one Soldier will not exceed a total of 120 days without HRC exception to policy approval.
  - b. All requests will be in 30-day increments (for example: 30, 60, 90 or 120 days).
- 8. Reassignment processing will continue (except for port call request, moving Family Members, shipping HHG, and terminating quarters). Soldiers must continue all other out-processing until HRC determination is confirmed through IPPS-A.
  - a. Soldiers will be advised not to take irreversible actions (for example, shipment of HHG or POV) while pending a request for deletion, deferment, or early arrival.
- 9. <u>If requests are disapproved</u>, Soldiers will comply with the original report date. If necessary, HRC will adjust the report date.
