SUBJECT: USAG RP Command Policy, Substance Abuse Prevention and Deterrence (Cmd Memo 2022-012)

1. REFERENCES.

Army Directive 2018-23, Improving the Effectiveness of Essential and Important Army Programs: Sexual Harassment/Assault Response and Prevention, Equal Opportunity, Suicide Prevention, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention, and Resilience Change in the Army's Random Deterrence Drug Testing Program, 8 November 2018

2. PURPOSE. To provide guidance on prevention and deterrence of substance abuse issues.

3. APPLICABILITY. This policy applies to all Personnel Assigned or Attached to United States Army Garrison Rheinland-Pfalz (USAG RP) to include subordinate units.

4. POLICY. All US Army Soldiers assigned in the Rheinland-Pfalz area of operation will comply with this policy to sustain force readiness.

5. PROCEDURES.

- a. Personnel will receive mandatory substance abuse prevention training face-to-face annually. A copy of the sign-in roster containing topic, facilitator, attendance, and length of the training must be provided to the Army Substance Abuse Program (ASAP) within five (5) working days upon completion of training.

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b. Commanders are responsible for educating and training their personnel about the dangers of drug and alcohol abuse and other risks to their health and military readiness associated with substance abuse.

c. Commanders will incorporate alcohol and drug abuse prevention annual training into the overall training plan for the unit. This annual alcohol and drug abuse prevention training will be conducted face-to-face. Commanders will determine the duration, location, and means for conducting training and implement risk reduction measures based on unit assessments.

d. Unit leaders will lead the training and may use subject matter experts to assist as available and needed.

e. Company Commanders will ensure random testing for 10% of the Soldiers per month and all Soldiers assigned are tested a minimum of once per year in the ongoing deterrence process. All specimens must be processed with ASAP within five (5) working days upon completion of training. A signed memo by the Company Commander must accompany the specimens when they have exceeded five (5) working days in storage.

f. The Unit Risk Inventory is required at a rate of one survey per Soldier per year.
