

Real ID ACT Implementation

ATTENTION

State-issued driver's license and identification cards marked, “**Not for Federal Identification, Not for Federal Purposes, Federal Limits May Apply**” or similar wording will require a secondary ID to access Fort Riley. If you do not have a secondary ID you'll be denied unescorted access, or you'll have to be escorted by an adult DoD Sponsor.

DoD Sponsor: Uniformed service members or government employees with a valid CAC, a military retiree (with a valid DoD identification credential), or an adult dependent (with a valid DoD identification credential) may serve as a sponsor.

Acceptable Secondary form of Identification

- Locally issued installation badge and/or pass with successful IAQ check
- DBIDS Credential with successful IAQ check
- Birth Certificate (no photo copy)
- U.S. Social Security Card issued by the Social Security Administration
- Certificate of U.S. Citizenship (Form N-560 or N-561)
- Foreign passport with a temporary (I-551) stamp or temporary (I-551) printed notation on a machine readable immigrant visa
- U.S. Certificate of Naturalization or Certificate of Citizenship (form N-550)
- U.S. Citizen ID Card (Form I-197)
- Native American Tribal photo ID
- U.S. Military or draft record
- School ID containing the photograph, name and expiration date (for minors only)
- Vehicle registration with name and address (must match address on non-compliant driver's license with successful IAQ check)
- Utility bill showing the person's name and address of principal residence (must match address on non-compliant driver's license) with successful IAQ check
- Voter's registration card

If you recently renewed or applied for a driver's license or state identification card you will receive one that is marked with a **STAR** emblem or marked with “**Federal Limits May Apply, Not for Federal Identification or Not for Federal Purposes**”.

REAL ID Act licenses/identification cards marked "**Limited Term**" or "**Temporary Visitor**" are issued to individuals who are in a 'temporary' lawful status as defined in the Real ID law. Unless a permanent resident card is provided, these visitors are considered foreign and require a DoD Sponsor as an Escort.
