Free issue of good materials

- What is the HMPC's purpose- Receive Hazardous Materials and Hazardous Waste into the facility. Hazardous materials are evaluated to determine if they can be reissued-free of charge for use on post, or disposed of as waste. Some of the more common items received are: Paints- latex, enamel and spray paint, Adhesives, POL items- grease, oil, transmission fluid, Batteries (nonvehicle), and Insecticides. The HMPC is also the centralized turn in point for lithium batteries, spent fluorescent lamps and PCBs. Another function of the HMPC is to take in unknowns in the form of abandoned, orphaned and unclassified waste containers. All Hazardous waste generated on Fort Riley is stored, processed, and shipped from the HMPC.
- Who is it there for?-The HMPC is here for almost everyone! With very few exceptions reusable items can be picked up free of charge for use on post. Some items may only be used for non military specification use only. Come check us out-we would be glad to show you around and see if we can help you!

The HMPC is an important link in the Hazardous Materials Management Program. The HMPC has diverted approximately \$2,300,000 worth of hazardous materials from disposal, most of the cost savings are through the Free-issuing of products.
