Senior Year Stabilization Policy

- Allows soldiers with high school seniors to request stabilization from PCS movement during the child's senior year. This is a soldier initiated action.
- Soldier should initiate a DA form 4187 requesting stabilization through their unit commander to their servicing PSB/MPD. This must be applied for between March of the Sophomore year and 1 September of the Junior year.
- This is a request, not a guarantee. The needs of the Army will dictate.
