

RELOCATION READINESS (RELO)

The Relocation Readiness program offers pre/post move assessments to provide individualized assistance through various resources such as Welcome Letters / Packets, Military One Source resources, the Lending Closet, moving related information, including referrals to all agencies and programs that support Soldiers and Families during their PCS move. Sponsorship support for all Soldiers along with the Spouse Sponsorship and link-up with their SFRG.

The weekly Victory Welcome is a newcomer orientation for Soldiers and Family Members. The Commanding General provides his vision for the 1st Inf. Div. and conducts a Q&A session with all family members. Closing out the day with the Information Fair and PCS Social which provides Fort Riley and local community partners with the ability to share information to assist with all aspects of settling into the Flint Hills Community.

ARMY FAMILY TEAM BUILDING (AFTB)

Whether you're new to the Army or want to brush up on skills, get a leg up with AFTB. This training program takes you step by step through Army culture and connects you to the skills and resources to become a self-reliant member of the military community. Resilience training is available to military spouses upon request.

ARMY FAMILY ACTION PLAN (AFAP)

Army Family Action Plan (AFAP) enables Soldiers, Family members, Retirees and DA Civilians the opportunity to let Army senior leadership know what's working and what's not, along with suggestions on how to correct the issue(s). ARMY COMMUNITY SERVICE



The mission of ACS is to facilitate the commander's ability to provide comprehensive, standardized, coordinated and responsive services that support Soldiers, Army Civilians, Retirees and their Families regardless of geographical location and to maximize technology and resources, eliminate duplication in service delivery and measure service effectiveness.

FINANCIAL READINESS PROGRAM (FRP)

FRP provides comprehensive educational and counseling programs in personal financial readiness. The program covers indebtedness, consumer advocacy and protection, money management, credit, financial planning, insurance, and consumer issues. Other services offered include mandatory financial literacy, financial planning for transitioning Soldiers, financial counseling for deployed Soldiers and their Families. Classes or Seminars for Youth and Teens are available upon request.

Army Emergency Relief (AER)

The Financial Readiness Program includes providing Soldiers and Families emergency assistance to help prevent privation through consideration of Army Emergency Relief loans and grants for eligible individuals.

Army Emergency Relief (AER) is a private non-profit organization funded by Soldiers for Soldiers. The mission of AER is to provide emergency financial assistance to Soldiers and Families with a valid need. EMPLOYMENT READINESS (ERP)

This program provides employment, education, training, mock interviews, on-line training, virtual training, and volunteer opportunities. To provide military spouse, veterans and civilians the competitive edge needed to secure employment. Computers are available for employment research and resume preparation.

DEPLOYMENT, MOBILIZATION, & STABILITY SUPPORT OPERATIONS (MDSSO)

The Mobilization, Deployment & Support Stability Operations (SSO) Program provides Active Duty, Reserve, and National Guard units with pre and post deployment/mobilization briefings, Soldier and Family Readiness Group trainings and assistance, information and referral services, and resource materials. The information and material is designed to support unit commanders in preparing service members, civilian employees, and their Families for military operations.

EXCEPTIONAL FAMILY MEMBER PROGRAM (EFMP)

EFMP is a Department of the Army mandated enrollment program that works with other military and civilian agencies to provide comprehensive and coordinated medical, educational, housing, community support and personnel services to families with special needs. An exceptional family member is a family member, regardless of age, with any physical, emotional, developmental or intellectual disorder that requires special treatment, therapy, education, training or counseling. FAMILY ADVOCACY PROGRAM (FAP)

The Soldier and Family Readiness Program/Family Advocacy Program promotes individual, couple, and family wellness by offering a comprehensive prevention program that includes awareness, education and support. Our services include workshops to help strengthen relationships of Army Families. Classes and workshops are offered to commanders, military units/troops, professionals and families. Prevention and support services include New Parent Support Program (home visitation), and the Victim Advocacy Program.

New Parent Support Program (NPSP)

Expecting parents and parents with children ages 0-3 have special challenges, and NPSP has tools to meet them. Programs including home visits, play groups, and parenting classes help caregivers learn to cope with stress, isolation, deployments, reunions, and the everyday demands of parenthood.

Victim Advocacy Program (VAP)

Victims of domestic violence and sexual abuse have round-the-clock access to services, including emergency assistance, information, referrals, and ongoing support in accessing medical, behavioral health, legal, and law enforcement services on and off garrisons. Victim Advocates will discuss the option of restricted and unrestricted reports
