Our system provides the management framework supporting Fort Riley's achievement of its declared end state, which is to maintain a world class reputation for fighting, and winning when the nation calls, enabled through mutually beneficial relationships and enduring presence in the Flint Hills Region.
- 3. To support and protect the Soldier, maximize military preparedness, and manage environmental impacts, Fort Riley commits to:
 - a. comply with applicable legal and other requirements;
 - b. prevent pollution and promote waste stream reduction;
 - c. conserve, protect and restore natural and cultural resources; and
 - d. integrate environmental consideration into all activities.
- 4. This policy applies to all active duty, reserve component, and National Guard Soldiers; civilian employees of the Department of Defense; contract employees; and other persons assigned to, or conducting business at Fort Riley.
