COLONEL ASHLEY S. LEE

DIRECTOR, ARMY CAPABILITY MANAGER FOR RECONNAISSANCE AND ATTACK ARMY FUTURES COMMAND FORT RUCKER, ALABAMA

Colonel Ashley S. Lee is a native of California and received her commission from the University of California in Los Angeles (UCLA). She is the Director of Army Capability Manager for Reconnaissance and Attack. She most recently served as the Division Chief for the Joint Staff's J5 Security Cooperation Coordination Division in the Pentagon overseeing the Joint Staff efforts to provide over \$50 billion in security cooperation to Ukraine and Israel.

Colonel Lee graduated from the Aviation Officer Basic Course and Flight School in 2002 and served as an Attack Helicopter Platoon Leader with 1-2nd Attack Battalion at Camp Page, Republic of Korea, and 1-229th Attack Battalion at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. She deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom III while assigned to 3-3rd Attack Battalion. Following the Aviation Officer Advanced Course and Maintenance Manager Course, she was assigned as a Company Commander in 4-2nd Attack Battalion. She later served as an Aviation Trainer and the Secretary of General Staff of the National Training Center. She deployed to Combined Joint Task Force (CJTF) - Horn of Africa as the Secretary of the Joint Staff in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. She was then assigned to the 1st Air Cavalry Brigade as a Battalion Operations Officer and Executive Officer.

Following the Army Command and General Staff College, Colonel Lee served in the Army Test and Evaluation Command (ATEC) at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland, as the Deputy Director for the Aviation and Fires Evaluation Directorate, and then as the ATEC Executive Officer to the Commanding General.

From 2019 to 2021, Colonel Lee commanded 3rd Battalion, 58th Aviation Regiment at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. She deployed the battalion to CJTF - Horn of Africa in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. The battalion was selected as the Air Traffic Control Unit of the year by AAAA for 2020-21. Upon completion of battalion command, she attended the National War College at Fort McNair in Washington, DC.

Colonel Lee holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science from UCLA, a Master of Business Administration from Trident University International, and a Master of Science in National Security Strategy from the National War College. She is a graduate of the Aviation Officer Basic Course, the Initial Entry Rotary Wing Course, the Aviation Officer Advanced Course, the United States Army Command and General Staff College, and the National War College.

Her military awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Bronze Star Medal, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal with three oak leaf clusters, the Army Commendation Medal with two oak leaf clusters, and the Army Achievement Medal with one oak leaf cluster. She has also earned the Army Aviation Badge, the Parachutist Badge, and the German Proficiency Badge (gold).
