Basic Restrictions on Political Activities of Soldiers & DA Civilian Employees

The 2024 Federal Election Cycle is underway, and every Service Member and Civilian employee is encouraged to register and vote. However, Service Members and DA Civilians must be aware of limitations regarding their participation in the political process. The examples provided below are not exhaustive. Actions as minor as a "like," "comment," "share," "favorite," and/or "retweet" on a social media post can be viewed as endorsing, advocating, and campaigning for a partisan political party or issue. Think before you post or share. If in doubt, you are encouraged to reach out to your servicing OSA for guidance, 334-255-3308. Get out and Vote but be smart and diligent during the 2024 election season!

What You Need to Know:

May	May Not
1. May vote and encourage others to vote - generally	1. May Not Encourage others to vote for a particular candidate in official capacity
2. May, as an individual, donate to a political campaign or political issue	2. May Not Solicit donations or fundraise for a candidate or political party
3. May have a bumper sticker on your car	3. May Not have a Big Sign (for multiple stickers) on car - not a flag/sign on on-post housing
4. May join a partisan or nonpartisan political club and attend while not in uniform (Off-duty/personal time, not official time)	4. May Not Volunteer for a candidate's campaign, political party or partisan political group (in official capacity or on duty time) (Civilians in official capacity, on duty, or using Gov't resources)
5. May attend political meetings or rallies as a spectator (In personal capacity on personal time and in civilian clothes only and without implying military endorsement)	5. May Not actively participate in any of these types of events (Civilians have more opportunity for active participation - but only if not on duty, not using Gov't resources or using official position)
6. May "follow," "friend," or "like" social media related to political parties or candidates and <i>Meta Fund Raising</i>	6. May Not "forward," "share," or "retweet" a post or tweet (Civilians in official capacity, on duty, or using Gov't resources)
7. May participate in the Federal Voting Assistance Program	

DA Civilians are also prohibited from political activity in the workplace or while wearing uniform or official insignia.

Political opinions regarding candidates & issues SHALL NOT be discussed in the workplace.

Online activities, INCLUDING SOCIAL MEDIA, may be extensions of the workplace.

Political conduct is governed by AR 600-20, DAVID 13-04.10 & the Hatch Act.

COMING TO FREEDOM FEST? IF YOU NEED A VISITOR'S PASS, DON'T WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE... PLAN AHEAD!

Unescorted visitors must obtain a visitor's pass to gain access to Fort Novosel. People can pre-register for a pass online at <https://pass.aie.army.mil> or in-person at one of our Visitor Control Centers.

To obtain a visitor's pass, people will need a valid government-issued photo identification, such as a driver's license, state-issued ID, or passport.

Online pre-registration must be submitted five days prior to the event.
