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Senior commander hosts town hall

The 3rd Infantry Division senior commander, Maj. Gen. Charles Costanza, addressed the Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield community via Facebook live, June 30, during his first COVID-19 Town Hall.

The town hall served as an opportunity for him to introduce himself to the community and address important changes made to the installation's health protection level, updated guidelines for on-post visitors and the return to pre-COVID operations for many of the services offered on Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield.

Col. Manny Ramirez, Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield garrison commander, Winn Army Community Hospital commander, Col. Julie Freeman and 3rd Infantry Division senior enlisted leader, Command Sgt. Maj. Quentin Fenderson were also in attendance.

Among the major updates was the change to the installation's health protection posture from HPCON Bravo to HPCON Alpha.

"There was a series of very specific conditions that allowed me to make the decision to go from Health

Protection level Bravo to Health Protection level Alpha," Costanza said. "I want to be clear though that just because we are moving to Health Protection level Alpha that it does not mean that COVID is gone and we still need to take some precautions as we move to Alpha."

Ramirez, also took the time to address the updated guidelines for hosting visitors on Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield and elaborated on the decision behind not returning to the trusted traveler program.

Ramirez explained that in light of the decision to not renew the trusted traveler program that leaders are working to make the visitor pass process for DoD ID cardholders who would like to host civilian guests on the installation easier.

"We are not moving back to Trusted Traveler due to force protection concerns," he said. "However, we have listened to your feedback and are streamlining the process to get visitor passes. If your guest or visitor is staying less than 24 hours a pass can be granted by the Visitor Control Center, pending a clearance check. For visits longer than 24 hours the visitor can submit a digital request via the DES page

on our website, *home.army.mil/stewart*."

In addition to HPCON and visitor access updates Col. Freeman reminded viewers that a reduction in HPCON status doesn't mean that our community should stop being vigilant when it comes to preventing the spread of COVID-19. Additionally, she spoke about the DELTA variant and the need to continue wearing masks and social distancing when required both on-post and while out in the community.

"Based on your efforts to get vaccinated, the amount of new personnel arriving already vaccinated, and the decrease over time in cases, we feel we can return to an increased sense of normalcy," Freeman said.

Overall, the town hall served as a platform to clarify and reiterate new policies and to praise the community for their vigilance in COVID-19 mitigation.

"You've heard the Senior Commander and know the direction we're headed," Ramirez said. "For the most part, the move to HPCON Alpha means improved services and the return to business as usual."

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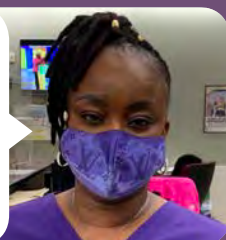

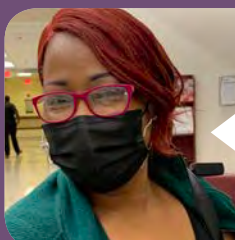

Training offers glimpse of future profession to West Point Cadets

Five Cadets from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, New York, temporarily assigned to 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, complete their three-week Cadet Troop Leader Training on Saturday, July 3, on Fort Stewart. CTLT gives cadets from West Point and ROTC the opportunity to experience leadership and a day-in-the-life of Army second and first lieutenants in active-duty units every summer.

Cadets attending locations in the continental U.S. are given three weeks with their selected unit and those attending locations overseas are given four weeks. Cadets are assigned a unit mentor, provided lodging at or near the military post, and provided meals at an on-base dining facility.

Cadet Danielle Cross, a fourth-year cadet at West Point and a Life Science major, was temporarily assigned to the 9th Brigade Engineer Battalion, 2nd ABCT, 3rd ID. "It's been a lot of fun. It's been really cool to see what a sapper engineer company does and to be out in the field and do a couple of their different training exercises with them," Cross said.

CTLT enables cadets going into their third or fourth year at university to see a day-in-the-life of an Army lieutenant and gives them insight into what their future holds. Because cadets attend CTLT before they rank the Army's 17 basic branches for their branch selection, the experience gives them a chance to test run their number one choice or an alternate branch they may be contemplating.

"I've been shadowing with the engineers, and I really think that it [the Engineer branch] is something that speaks to me a lot," said Cadet Annesley Black, a third-year cadet at West Point and an Environmental Engineering major, temporarily assigned to 9th BEB, 2nd ABCT, 3rd ID. "I really like working with the equipment and the people, and I think that Engineers is what I'm leaning towards."

The next time the cadets work with active-duty Soldiers and noncommissioned officers will be when they are commissioned as U.S. Army second lieutenants. The value of the cadets' time spent with those they are about to lead is not lost on them.

"For me, it means showing me the real Army outside of West Point. My only real experience has been through West Point and the summer trainings they provide," said Cadet Paul Budoff, a third-year cadet at West Point and a Systems and Decision Sciences major, also temporarily assigned to 9th BEB, 2nd ABCT, 3rd ID. "Being able to spend [time], given these short three weeks, speaking with people in the...[active-duty] Army, speaking with NCOs and officers from all the different branches has been a whole new experience for me. I've learned a lot."

Dogface Soldiers perform air assault operations during Orient Shield 21-2

Soldiers with 1st Battalion, 28th Infantry Regiment “Black Lions,” 3rd Infantry Division, took part in air assault training utilizing UH-60 Black Hawk helicopters on Aibano Training Area, Japan, June 28, as part of exercise Orient Shield.

Soldiers began the training by reviewing how to load and unload Black Hawks. Once the helicopters arrived, the Soldiers quickly loaded them and flew to their first objective.

“This training is important for us,” said Pfc. Austin Walmark, an infantryman assigned to the Black Lions. “It’s important to be flexible so when anything calls, we can hop on a Black Hawk and be able to secure the area and push out into our mission.”

While the majority of the training

taking place during Orient Shield is bilateral with Japan Ground Self-Defense Force counterparts, this training only involved U.S. Soldiers.

“We were picked up by helicopters and brought to another landing zone,” said Spc. Luis Rodriguez, an infantryman assigned to the Black Lions. “Our objective was to secure the landing zone so the others arriving after us could land safely.”

This exercise was the first time some of the junior enlisted experienced an air assault mission.

Rodriguez just moved to a new position as a squad automatic weapon gunner after previously working as radio operator. This was his first time securing a landing zone in his new position.

“Now that I’ve had hands-on on the way to handle my weapon, pulling security, loading and unloading the helicopter, I feel confident in

securing landing zones,” Rodriguez said.

After securing the landing zone, the Black Lions practiced medical evacuations and then returned from their mission.

“We’re a flexible, light infantry unit, so it’s great for us to know these things so we can work well with other units,” said Walmark.

Earlier this week, Black Lions practiced boarding and dismounting a JGSDF helicopter. The Black Lions will continue to train closely with their JGSDF counterparts throughout the duration of Orient Shield.

Orient Shield is the largest U.S. Army and JGSDF bilateral field training exercise being executed at various locations throughout Japan to enhance interoperability and test and refine multi-domain and cross-domain operations.

Vehicle parking safety reminder

When parking a vehicle into a space, do not block the pedestrian walkway with your bumper or trailer hitch. If there is a sidewalk, or marked pedestrian pathway, ensure that it is not blocked by any portion of your vehicle when you park by it. A pedestrian walking past the vehicle may not notice a trailer hitch, and be severely injured by walking into it. Motorcycle safety reminder

All motorcycle riders (Soldiers, civilians and Family members) are reminded that wearing proper gear while riding on Fort Stewart/Hunter Army Airfield is mandatory. The following requirements are listed in Army Regulation 385-10, Paragraph 11-9.d.

- Helmet, properly fastened under the chin,
- Eye Protection that meets ANSI Z87.1, reference (z) for impact and shatter resistance.
- Foot Protection, sturdy over-the-ankle footwear that affords protection for the feet and ankles.
- Protective Clothing including: long-sleeved shirt or jacket, long trousers, full-fingered gloves or mittens.
- Riders are encouraged to select PPE that incorporates fluorescent colors and retro-reflective material.

New bicycle law now in effect

As of July 1, the operator of a motor vehicle approaching a bicycle shall approach the bicycle with due caution and shall proceed as follows. The new 3-Footer Law is outlined in § 40-6-56.

- Make a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the bicycle if possible in the existing road and traffic conditions
- If a lane change under paragraph (1) of this subsection would be impossible, prohibited by law, or unsafe, reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to a reasonable and proper speed for the existing road and traffic conditions, which speed shall be at least ten miles per hour less than the posted speed limit or 25 miles per hour, whichever is more, and proceed around the bicycle with at least three feet between such vehicle and the bicycle at all times.

The sky is the limit for four female aviators

An all-female flight crew took to the skies in an HH-60M Black Hawk helicopter to participate in a fly-over for the 3rd Infantry Division change of command ceremony at Fort Stewart, Georgia, June 21.

Pilots and flight paramedics from the 2nd Battalion, 3rd General Support Aviation Battalion, 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade, 3rd ID, geared up just like they would any other flight, but this flight was unique to them. It was the crew's first time participating in an all-female flight.

The crew consisted of two HH-60M Black Hawk helicopter pilots, Chief Warrant Officer 4 Natasha Ryan and Chief Warrant Officer 2 Shelby Taylor, and two flight paramedics, Sgt. Heather Kicki and Sgt. Chelsey Pcolar.

Kicki, a flight paramedic, said the flight was not about busting stereotypes or challenging the status quo, but rather about showing people what women can do in the U.S. Army.

"We showed up, got the job done and everything turned out as planned," said Kicki. "The whole crew is outstanding, hard working females, and to

be amongst them doing anything is a reward in itself."

The Women's Armed Service Integration Act was signed into law in 1948, giving women a permanent presence in the military, although their roles were severely restricted. On June 4, 1974, 2nd Lt. Sally Murphy became the first female U.S. Army helicopter pilot to graduate from flight school and receive her wings, paving the way for countless women to join the ranks in aviation.

"I feel proud that aviation allows a spot for all genders," said Pcolar. "I take my job seriously, I feel the amount of responsibility as a crew member, and I am confident in my ability to crew."

From Murphy being the Army's first female aviator, to women flying in combat operations since 1989, women's roles in aviation have only continued to grow throughout the years.

"I was on a mission in Pakistan when I met two 'Big Windy' [1st Battalion, 214th General Support Aviation Battalion, 12th Combat Aviation Brigade] CH-47 Chinook helicopter pilots, that were women, and seeing them doing the job made me feel like it was a possibility for me," said Ryan. "Representation surely does matter, and I'm not sure I'd be here if it wasn't for meeting those

women."

Women have proven themselves time and again, to where women in the aviation community have made a mark on the history of U.S. Army aviation.

"Women in the Army have an unwritten code of taking care of each other," said Taylor. "The camaraderie of being able to do something together that was impossible years ago, and doing it well, it's hard to put that feeling into words."

All four crew members hope to send the same message to young females and aspiring pilots, that there is absolutely no place that women do not belong.

"We went to breakfast after the flight, and a young girl came up to us and asked if even the girls fight for our country," said Ryan. "It was a little disheartening because I realized at some point in her little five year old life she had already been conditioned to believe women didn't necessarily belong in this role. We talked to her for a bit and by the end of it she said that she wanted to be just like us."

Women in aviation have come a long way since the days of 2nd Lt. Sally Murphy and those that followed in her footsteps, with all of them breaking down barriers so that today's women only have the sky as their limit.

- If you find a circular red spot like a bullseye on your skin after being outdoors, you may have been exposed to deer ticks. Check with your health care provider as soon as possible.

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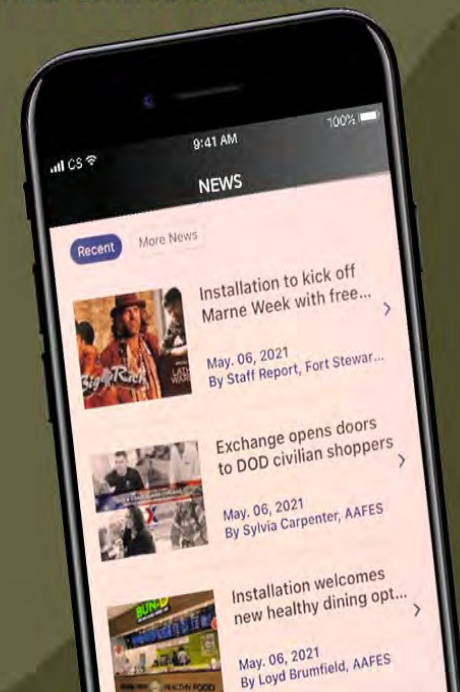
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Installations celebrate Independence Day

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Exchange offers back to school layaway options

The Army & Air Force Exchange Service is showing Army Families that it matters where they shop, allowing more time to pay for electronics during back-to-school season.

From July 2 through Sept. 2, AAFES shoppers can use layaway to hold tax-free purchases of computers, notebooks, tablets and iPads—items that are not typically eligible for the program.

“Technology is evolving quickly and

having the right tablet or computer can be critical to academic achievement,” said Fort Stewart Main Exchange Store Manager Marne Gulde. “The Exchange’s layaway program is an affordable, practical way for students to stay on top of their studies.”

A \$3 service fee and a deposit of 15% are required to hold items on layaway. Items must be picked up by Sept. 2. Shoppers can visit customer service at the Fort Stewart or Hunter AAF Exchange for details.

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Installation pharmacy services resume, expand

Pharmacy Services continue to evolve on Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield as resources shift to restore normal operations and new equipment expands capabilities for beneficiaries.

“With COVID-19 conditions improving and our community’s efforts to get the vaccine, Tuttle Army Health Clinic is excited to open our pharmacy lobby back up to beneficiaries. With that said, facemasks will still be required and social distancing encouraged to keep our staff and patients healthy,” said Tuttle AHC Commander, Lt. Col. Michael Henry.

“The pharmacy lobby reopens to patients 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, starting July 7,” Henry said.

Henry said although Tuttle AHC will be discontinuing drive-thru pharmacy services on July 6, additional pharmacy resources were recently made available to expand services including a civilian-prescription drop box located in the clinic’s main parking lot; and the ScriptCenter, located in the Hunter Exchange.

The ScriptCenter is an automated pharmacy kiosk and locker system that provides a safe and secure pick-up of prescriptions and healthcare products during PX hours. It offers extended hours for community members, providing services after the regular pharmacies close.

The ScriptCenter allows individuals to call

in their prescription refills; which will be available for pickup after three duty days. The prescription will remain available there for up to 14 days – and will return back to the pharmacy if not picked up in that time.

Patients can retrieve the prescription from ScriptCenter by providing a quick scan of their military ID card - after inputting their date of birth or fingerprints. If you forget your login or PIN, you can press “Forgot ID” or “Forgot Pin” to recover them. Controlled substances or prescriptions that require refrigeration still have to be picked up at the pharmacy’s window.

The ScriptCenter is available to all active duty military, dependents, retirees, and authorized Department of Defense ID holders who register for the service. Individuals can register at the kiosk at the time of pickup by bringing one of their prescription numbers that they need to pick up. If you don’t have a current prescription number to activate, you can call 435-6161 option 3 and speak to a member of the Tuttle Pharmacy. Or call the number listed on the ScriptCenter at 944-535-9989.

The Hunter Kiosk opened March 31 at the Hunter Exchange, 130 Haley Drive Building 6020. The Hunter Kiosk hours of operation are 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and 10:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday. The kiosk is closed on Sunday.

Sgt. 1st Class Brett Perry, Station Commander for the Special Operations recruiting station Hunter Army Airfield was one of the first to try the kiosk, March 31.

“I’m blown away by the convenience,” Perry said. “I’ll definitely be a frequent user.”

The Fort Stewart Kiosk is scheduled to open August 17 at Winn Army Community Hospital.
