Town hall addresses possible RIF

Hundreds of Department of Defense employees attended the Fort Stewart Personnel Town Hall, Feb. 13 at the Main Post

The event was presented by the Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield garrison commander, Col. Jason A. Wolter, to ensure transparency in the event of a reduction in force, which may affect Fort Stewart and several other garrisons such as Fort Hood, Fort Bragg and Aberdeen Proving Grounds.

Wolter opened the event by thanking the team for demonstrating that the garrison remains one of the Army's premier power projection platform. He applauded the workforce's efforts in the continued deployment of 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team to Korea; the continuing transition of the 2nd Brigade from an infantry brigade to the nation's 15th armored brigade combat team, and in taking care of Soldiers and their Families - every day.

Wolter said he was "proud and impressed" by the team's efforts. He also said the community looks forward to the return of the 3rd Infantry Division headquarters, which is expected in mid-April.

But he also wanted to continue his efforts to keep employees informed of developments following the Installation Management Commander's request for a reduction in force to the Department of the Army, made earlier

The town hall was the fourth in a series to address the installation's ongoing efforts to reach its adjusted Table of Distribution and Allowances. The TDA is used to determine the type and quantity of positions the installation is authorized.

Spartans test new SRT

First Sergeants of 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division test out the Soldier Readiness Test Ian. 26 at

The purpose of the SRT is to assess all components of Soldiers' fitness through their abilities to perform unit-specific combat related tasks and to change the focus of Physical Readiness Training to a more holistic, functional fitness program.

The SRT provides leaders an accurate assessment of Soldier fitness by measuring the nine components of physical fitness: explosive power, speed, agility, balance and coordination, muscular strength, muscular endurance, cardiovascular endurance, flexibility and reac-

Command Sgt. Maj. Michael McMurdy, senior enlisted advisor of 2nd ABCT, led the Spartan Brigade first sergeants through the SRT session and admitted to

never scoring less than a 280 on an Army Physical Fitness Test but still getting nervous.

"It's (SRT) not a test, its an assessment," McMurdy said. "Soldiers hear the word test and become nervous. The term assessment will make them feel more comfortable. There's no score. It's a go or

The assessment consists of six events and three phases. In phase one and three, all brigade combat teams conduct the same fitness events. Phase two is dependent on the function.

In phase one, the Spartan Leaders executed a 225-lb tire flip, an agility drill, and a 240-lb casualty drag within two minutes. During phase two, they conducted a 45-lb farmers carry within three minutes and finished phase three with a 1.5 mile movement, that included an under/over obstacle along the way, within 18 minutes, for a total combined time of 23 minutes for all three

Dual military couple faces first deployment apart

From high school sweethearts to Army Soldiers, Sgt. Karrington Austin and Spc. Dominique Austin, both assigned to 5th Squadron, 7th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, have been dedicated to each other for six years with no end in sight.

The Austins believe married life is tough for any couple, dual-military romances face unique obstacles but can withstand the test of time with love.

The couple started off as best friends during their junior year at Ross Sterling High School in Houston, Texas.

"It was the last three months of our junior year when we started dating," Dominique said. "It was then, over the summer, I knew she was the one I wanted to spend my life with. I formulated a plan to propose and marry the love of my life."

The stage was set for Dominique to propose at the biggest social event for teenagers – prom night.

"It was right after the announcement of the prom king and queen when my friend went up to the disc jockey's booth, explained to the DJ what I wanted to do, and without hesitation he handed me the mic," said Dominique.

"She said yes," Dominque said. "Didn't skip a beat." "I said yes," Karrington said. "And nothing has changed from the first time he proposed."

The Austins relationship came to a crossroad as their time in high school was coming to an end and life as adults was beginning. Pomp and circumstance played, speeches were made and tassels were moved from left to right in anticipation of caps being thrown in the air May 29, 2015.

Dominique felt the incessant urge to serve his nation and made the decision to enlist into the U.S. Army.

"He felt the Army was the best thing for him," Karrington said. "At the time, I wasn't completely sold on going to college either, so when he told me he wanted to join the Army my reaction was, 'Me too!'

They agreed to face the future together and the two wed in September of 2015. Soon afterward, they began their journey as Soldiers, with Dominique as a cavalry scout and Karrington as a culinary specialist.

Enrolled in the Army's Married Couples Program, they were able to both be assigned to Fort Bliss, Texas. While being in the same location lessened the stress of a potential long-distance relationship, time apart was still a huge factor in their marriage.

"The first year of marriage was difficult because our time together never quite synced," Karrington said. "When he would come home from the field, five days later I would go out to the field. It was hard but we maximized the time we had together."

Karrington's unit was eventually deactivated and she was reassigned to her husband's unit. This put them, relatively, on the same schedule.

Making the most of their time together, Dominique and Karrington said they kept their flame going for those years at Fort Bliss and continued to do so as they transitioned into Marne Soldiers.

"As soon as we got to Fort Stewart we were told then that we are getting ready to deploy," Karrington said. "It was what we signed up for and we did it together."

They went on two rotations to Europe with the 1st ABCT. The Raider brigade is now slated to deploy to Korea, but only Karrington will go.

"My Soldier will soon be honorably discharged from the Army. This will be my first deployment without him," Karrington said. "Even though it will be tough, I am more focused on my contributions to my unit and my Soldiers because, for most of them, it will be their first deployment."

With Karrington's mind focused on the task at hand to deploy to Korea, her heart is filled with the love of her Soldier and was reminded of two things.

"The true love we share for each other transcends the boundaries of space and time," she said. "No matter how far away I may be from him, he is with me in spirit."

During the Aug. 22 town hall, the Fort Stewart Deputy Garrison Commander, Paul Stuart, explained that personnel in positions that are no longer authorized on the TDA are overhires. The installation is expected to reduce its overhires to zero by the end of the fiscal year.

Today, with attrition, management reassignments and separation incentives, the number of overhires currently on Fort Stewart's TDA is less than 50 personnel.

"I didn't have any expectations before coming to the town hall," said Angela Murphy who works with Survivor Outreach at ACS. "I figured we'd find out what we find out, and roll with it."

Wolter said the installation would continue toward its goal by October through attrition, management directed reassignments, and separation incentives such as the Voluntary Early Retirement Program and Voluntary Separation Incentive Program. He added VERA/VSIP will be made available April 2-13. He said people accepting this option will be off the rolls by June 30.

But the installation also has to plan in case the RIF

is approved. Wolters said if a RIF is initiated, other authorities come into play to help position and move

Planning for contingencies, he said the Fort Stewart Civilian Personnel Advisory Center will conduct a mock RIF to determine what positions and personnel will be considered overhires. Wolter said the mock RIF will be complete by March 31, with notices to possible overhires being provided by April 1.

During this and other personnel town halls, Wolter, Stuart, and the garrison resource management officer, Bill Jeffers, said employees could help by updating their resumes to ensure they reflect current education and training, work experience, qualifications, and veterans' preference.

Murphy said she learned a few things from the event that she could use to help prepare for any develop-

"I'll update my resume, stay flexible, and drive-on," Murphy said.

Garrison employees seeking more information are encouraged to talk to their immediate supervisors, the Garrison RMO, or the Fort Stewart CPAC.





1st SFAB holds activation ceremony

The 1st Security Force Assistance Brigade held an activation ceremony at the National Infantry Museum at Fort Benning, Georgia, Feb. 8, unveiling their unit colors for the first time in history.

Since the summer of 2017, the 1st SFAB has been building teams, training, and receiving new equipment tailored specifically to their unique mission. The ceremony served as the official recognition of the unit's activation.

The brainchild of the Army Chief of Staff, Gen. Mark A. Milley, the 1st SFAB was created in order to train, advise, assist, enable and accompany host-nation conventional forces in infantry, armor, cavalry, engineer, artillery and combinedarms warfare.

The unit is the first of six planned brigades specifically built to achieve the Army's vision of enabling combatant commanders to achieve theater security objectives by, with and through partnered and allied indigenous security forces for decades to come.

Throughout the Army's history, advise and assist missions in combat have been consistent. From World War II to Vietnam and Korea - continuing to today's battlefields in the Middle East - the Army has been helping our allies and partners build large, credible conventional forces capable to secure and protect their countries autonomously.

Although the mission set is nothing new, having dedicated units assigned to combat advising allows the Army to reduce, over time, the demand for conventional brigade combat teams to adhere to prior ad hoc solutions.

In January, the Department of Defense officially announced the 1st SFAB's deployment to Afghanistan this spring. Col. Scott A. Jackson, the commander of the 1st SFAB, reflected on the journey his unit has embarked on during a speech at the cer-

spring.

"Ladies and gentlemen, in less than nine months the formation in front of you has gone from a concept to a combat ready formation fully ready for employment," said Jackson. "Starting with nothing, this formation has simultaneously recruited, trained and assimilated more than 800 soldiers; received over 22,000 pieces of equipment; conducted two combat training center rotations; developed innovative doctrine related to security force assistance and formed and synchronized original equipping strategies to meet our unique mission requirements."

Jackson expressed his gratitude for the outstanding and remarkable leaders that filled the ranks before him. Prior to volunteering, Soldiers had to serve in a similar position in a conventional unit before being selected for the 1st SFAB. Jackson attributes this requirement to the professional and skilled culture that has been cultivated over the last nine months.

"The secret sauce to our achievements is standing right in front of you - the Soldiers that compose the 1st SFAB," said Jackson. "Their achievement is indicative of the self-starting, high-performing, mature and intelligent Soldiers we brought

In attendance for the ceremony was Milley, who spoke on the critical and enduring need for the SFABs and how the benefits of having a permanent, additive force structure would be tenfold for the

"The SFAB gives us purpose-built formations designed to execute the critical mission of security force assistance without having to rip apart conventional BCTs," said Milley.

He went on to say that by not relying on conventional BCTs to execute security force assistance missions, the Army can

develop and maintain the number one priority of readiness.

"In times of national crisis when our Army is called to expand quickly, we already have a ready-made brigade combat team chain of command," continued Milley. The brigade could be filled with Soldiers, conduct training and be ready to fight in a relatively short period of time.

Milley continued that the 1st SFAB is an excellent organization because the unit is filled with the right people and emphasized that 80 percent of the formation are combat veterans, many with advising

He closed by saying that he is very proud of the enthusiasm, training and efforts of the commander and the Soldiers and that the 1st SFAB will establish its own history.

In addition to revealing the unit's colors for the first time in history, the 1st SFAB cased their colors, symbolically preparing for deployment. Jackson addressed the brigade in its entirety for the last time before they deploy and offered some final guidance.

"Remember that you are the United States of America and the profession of arms to our partners," said Jackson. "Our conduct, appearance, actions and values must represent the best of America and its Army."

Jackson closed out by voicing his confidence in his formation and acknowledging their phenomenal work.

"This is just the beginning of our journey and our legacy," said Jackson. "Stay true to your values, trust in one another and continue to write the story of the 1st Security Force Assistance Brigade."

MEDDAC chaplain assistant personifies selfless service during accident

On Feb. 9, around 8:45 a.m., there was an accident on Highway 196 in Hinesville, Georgia involving two auto-

At that same time Sgt. Dustin Napier, a chaplain assistant at Winn Army Community Hospital, was on his routine morning drive when he approached the

"As I come across from Airport Road -probably about a mile and a half down the road on the left hand side of the median, is where I ran into a car accident that involved two vehicles," Napier said.

Napier's military training kicked in as he began to evaluate the situation. Using his truck as a barrier he blocked the oncoming traffic from the accident vic-

"I had stopped my vehicle short of the accident to make sure I could block off traffic, so that way it was safe for me to be able to exit out of my vehicle and assess the situation," Napier said.

After considering the situation and completing a safety check, Napier exited the cab of his truck and made his way to the first vehicle involved in the acci-

"I got up to the first vehicle and made sure that the other individual that was driving that vehicle was safe," Napier said. "There was also another Soldier on ground that was helping with the accident."

After checking on both passengers, Napier leaped into action, directing traffic until the authorities arrived on the scene. For Napier, there was no other decision than to stop his vehicle and provide support.


"I felt like it was the right thing to do. If it was my Family, I would want somebody to stop and help take care of them as well, " Napier said.

Napier attributes the training he received in the Army, as well as the core values he follows as a non-commissioned officer in the Chaplain's Corps, to providing him with skills and compassion necessary to provide support during the accident.

"As a religious affairs NCO we maintain security management for the chaplain," Napier said. "When we're downrange. I'm CLS (Combat Life Saver) qualified, so I know how to do CPR.

Bystanders play more of a role than I thought

This is a personal commentary on my experience with the Army's bystander intervention training.

My name is Pfc. Regan Riggs and I'm a cavalry scout serving as a unit public affairs representative for 6th Squadron, 8th Cavalry Regiment, 2nd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division at Fort Stewart, Georgia. I had the privilege to sit in on 2nd ABCT's Mind's Eye II train-the-trainer course from Jan. 18 - Feb. 1.

Mind's Eye II is an Army program that focuses on the prevention of sexual harassment and sexual assault within the Army. It is a program that was developed for Soldiers, by Soldiers here and was adapted from the current Bystander Intervention Training.

Before I took this course, I thought of two perspectives of sexual assault/harassment -- the victim and the offender. After observing Mind's Eye II, I learned that bystanders play more of a role than I thought.

Another difference between Mind's Eye II training and other programs is the trainers do not have to be a certain rank to be facilitators. Unit leaders chose their most influential Soldiers in their formation in order to give Soldiers a level of comfort and trust within their ranks. This program is an interactive approach to leader training focused on individual decision making and professional identity.

Monique Ferrell, director of the Army's SHARP Program, explained to me that this program would essentially be the Army's primary prevention initiative to prevent sexual harassment and sexual assault. Instead of sexual harassment and sexual assault being the focal point, Mind's Eye II would illustrate to Soldiers what "right" looks like, in hopes of changing the culture and stopping problems before they manifest. The intended goal is to increase positive and healthy behaviors by targeting prevention at all levels of the total force.

During class, the instructors gave us several scenar- **Stewart.**

ios and asked us what we would do if a situation would occur. I realized that I had no idea what I would or should do. One thing I realized was that the outcome could be dependent on whether or not I decided to be a silent bystander.

I distinctly remember one of the Soldiers saying, "If you do nothing, you are just as guilty as the offender."

This phrase stuck with me. I felt convicted.

How could I be guilty if I simply choose to mind my own business and not intervene? Well, the answer is simple.

Digital breast tomosynthesis, also referred to as three-dimensional (3D) mammography, can help eliminate the problem of overlapping breast tissue. DBT allows for a low-dose mammogram, which produces multiple consecutive images taken from different angles across the arc of the breast, producing a 3D image. This produces a cleaner and clearer image.

The tax filing season is upon us. Did you know that there are free tax preparation services available at both Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield? Below is general information about the tax center and some of our most frequently asked questions.

Where is the Marne Tax Center locat-

The Fort Stewart office is located in Building 816E, 2233 Gulick Ave. The Hunter Army Airfield office is located in Building 1211, 638 Horace Emmet Wilson Boulevard.

What are the hours of the Marne Tax Center?

The Marne Tax Center is open Monday through Wednesday, 10 a.m. to 6:15 p.m.; Thursday, 1-6:15 p.m.; and Friday 10 a.m. to 6:15 p.m.

Can I make an appointment?

No, both offices will be accepting walk-in clients on a first come, first serve basis.

What do I need to bring with me?

In order for our tax preparers to provide customers with the best service and assistance, you will need to bring all of the proper documents and a little bit of patience. You will need to bring the following documents as they apply to your situation:

- W2/1099misc/1099SSA.
- Mortgage Interest Statement (1098).
- Power of attorney if necessary.
- Prior year tax return.
- Proof of dependent care expenses.
- Interest income statement (e.g., 1099INT).
- Identity theft personal identification

number.

- Dividend income statement (e.g., 1099DIV).
- 1099B, for stocks and/or bonds.
- Statements reflecting capital gains or loss.
- 1095 Proof of medical insurance coverage.
- Driver's license.
- · Social Security card for yourself and all Family members claiming on your
- · Student loan interest statement. • Divorce decree if applicable.
- · Proof of educational expenses.
- HUD 1 statement, if home was purchased during the tax year.
- Individual retirement account or Thrift Savig Plan contribution statements
- Educator expenses.

What are the most commonly forgotten forms?

Social Security cards for everyone

you are claiming, and the Form 1095 are the most commonly missing forms. We need them to start your return. We also ask that you bring in your Driver's License if you have it, as your state may require your driver's liscense number for your state return.

What if my spouse is deployed, how can I file for them?

You will need to have the non-present spouse fill out a power of attorney form that includes the power to prepare state and federal tax returns. These forms are available at the Legal Assistance Office. Alternatively, the non-present spouse can fill out an IRS Form 2848.

What if I can't find my or my Family member's social security card? Can't I just bring my military ID card?

It is essential that you bring your social security card with you to the Marne Tax Center. Before filing your tax return, we need

to be certain that the name and social security number on your tax return exactly matches the information contained in the Social Security Administration's records. If the information does not match, your taxes will not properly be filed, and this could lead to a delay in receiving any refund due. Alternatively, we will also accept a

memorandum from the Social Security Administration identifying the taxpayer or family member. If you cannot find your social secu-

rity card, please visit www.ssa.gov/ask or the Social Security Administration in Savannah, Georgia at 430 Mall Blvd #1, Savannah, Georgia 31406.

When will you prepare taxes for rental properties?

Rental property returns will be accepted starting on 1 March for only one rental property. Please ensure that all of your expenses are organized before you arrive at the Tax Center as our preparers cannot organize your receipts for you.

Are there other options available to me for free or at a reduced cost?


Yes, there are several options that you can use to prepare your taxes other than the Marne Tax Centers.

There are other Volunteer Income Tax Assistance programs in the area. You can locate the one nearest to you on https:// www.irs.gov/individuals/free-taxreturn-preparation-for-you-by-volun*teer*s. They provide the same service that the Marne Tax Centers do at no cost, but certain income limits may apply.

Military OneSource offers free tax preparation software at www.militaryonesource.mil/-/miltax-free-tax-services-from-military-onesource.

Their phone number for assistance while filing is 800-342-9647. This service is provided to Service members, their Families, and Retirees who have left the service within 180 days.

Access is granted once users have registered on the site, no CAC required.

This year is especially challenging because the original event had to be rescheduled due to Hurricane Irma."


