

## Emergency Supply Checklist

Food (at least a 3-day supply of non-perishable, easy-to-prepare food)

Water (1 gallon per person, per day for 3 days)

First-aid kit & emergency blanket

Medications (7-day supply of medical items including glasses, contact lenses, and syringes)

Copies of personal documents (insurance policies, birth certificates, and lease or deed)

Extra batteries

Battery-powered or hand-crank radio

Sanitation & personal hygiene items

Baby supplies (bottles, formula, baby food, and diapers)

## EVACUATION

The Senior Commander is the only one who directs an evacuation order for the installation. An order will be released stating all areas in the mandatory evacuation zone. After the storm hits, Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield will work diligently to clean up the installation. Please be advised this can take several days after the storm hits.

Families can not return to the installation until the Senior Commander rescinds the evacuation order.

## PREPARE NOW!

- ✓ Have a map and know your evacuation routes
- ✓ Make a plan if your family has to evacuate separately
- ✓ Build a kit that suits the specific needs of your family
- ✓ Set up a specific meeting location in the event of separation

## REIMBURSEMENT TIPS IF EVACUATION IS ORDERED BY THE SENIOR COMMANDER

- ✓ Only personnel in **mandatory evacuation areas** are covered by the Army Reimbursement
- ✓ Keep all lodging receipts, if ordered to evacuate. You can only be reimbursed for lodging receipts in your name!
- ✓ There is no need to keep gas or food receipts (food is based on per diem)
- ✓ There is NO reimbursement for pet expenses
- ✓ Only Family Members listed in DEERS will be reimbursed for per diem – this is a great opportunity to check your DEERS information!
- ✓ If you drive 2 cars – you can claim two cars
- ✓ Any damage to your household or food in the refrigerator will need to be addressed with your insurance company
