



SFRG Training & Class Descriptions

SFRG Commander's Training

The Readiness Essentials for Army Leaders (R.E.A.L.) Commander's training is primarily for Company Commanders, but is also informative for Brigade and Battalion Commanders and Command Sergeants Major. This two hour course delineates the roles and responsibilities of the Command Team regarding how to leverage the Soldier and Family Readiness Groups (SFRGs) to execute the Soldier & Family Readiness mission. Topics include Family Readiness, Mission Essential Tasks for SFRGs, SFRG Elements and Operations, Communications, Volunteer Management, SFRG Funding, and Resources. This training is IAW FORSCOM OPORD 200820, paragraph 3.B.2, dated October 2020.

Command Family Readiness Representative (CFRR) Training

The training includes topics on understanding your role, resources for success, SFRG Dos and Don'ts, and working with SFRG Volunteers. This training is IAW FORSCOM OPORD 200820, paragraph 3.B.2, dated October 2020.

SFRG Management Training

This course will assist SFRG Volunteers in how to set-up, maintain, and handle the challenges within the SFRG arena and IAW FORSCOM OPORD 200820, paragraph 3.B.2, dated October 2020. Open to all who desire to learn more about the structure of the SFRG and requirements of assisting the unit Commander.

SFRG Informal Fund Training

Readiness Essentials for Army Leaders (R.E.A.L.) training. This is mandatory training for all current and incoming SFRG Fund Custodians. Teaches Army regulations for managing of SFRG informal funds and fundraising. Suggested training for SFRG Volunteers, Commanders, and SFRG Fundraising Coordinators.

SFRG Key Contact Training

Readiness Essentials for Army Leaders (R.E.A.L.) training - Trains Key Contacts on their role and responsibilities as well as how to handle crisis phone calls. Suggested training for all SFRG Volunteers. Open to anyone wanting to learn more about the SFRG communication structure. The course includes tips and techniques for executing the role as well as practical exercises and scenarios.

CARE Team Training

By providing immediate support after official notification, the CARE Team fills the gap between the notification team and Family support arriving. This training is critical prior to establishing a CARE Team.
