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Cpl. Bee named U.S. Army Best Warrior runner-up

The 3rd Infantry Division patch is not commonly associated with the Pacific but this week Cpl. Jacob Bee from the Raider Brigade finished as the runner-up at the U.S. Army Best Warrior Competition while representing the U.S. Army Pacific.

Bee, an infantryman who enlisted in 2013, was first selected to represent the Raider Brigade at the 2nd Infantry Division competition at Camp Casey, Korea, in March. The six-day event in the unforgiving hills of Korea also featured a late snow storm. The cold conditions did not slow down Bee who is originally from Naples, Florida.

Bee then went on to represent the Indianhead Division at the Eighth Army competition in May, also in Korea. This competition was held during torrential rain storms and once again Bee finished first and moved on to the U.S. Army-Pacific competition in Hawaii. After winning in Hawaii, Bee became one of 22 Soldiers and NCOs from across 11 com-

mands who competed for the Army title at Fort Lee and Fort A.P. Hill during the first week of October.

The competition ended last week and the results were announced at the first day of the AUSA annual meeting in Washington, D.C., on Monday.

“We get to recognize some incredible Soldiers and NCOs,” said Army Vice Chief of Staff James McConville before the presentation. “We also recognize that behind every successful Soldier from the most junior private to the senior general officer is an NCO who made that person what they are.”

During the six-day competition, these elite competitors tested their knowledge, skills and abilities by conquering urban warfare simulations, demonstrating critical thinking, formal board interviews, physical fitness challenges, written exams, and warrior tasks and battle drills relevant to today’s operating environment.

The Raider Brigade is currently completing their nine-month rotation to Korea supporting the 2nd ID.

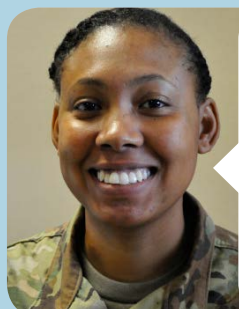

Raider Brigade Soldiers return home

Nearly 350 Soldiers with 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division arrived home to Fort Stewart after a nine-month deployment to the Republic of Korea.

The Raider Brigade deployed to South Korea in February 2018, completing their second National Training Center rotation that year to Fort Irwin, California, November 2017.

Capt. Miclos St. Fleur, an air defense artillery officer assigned to Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 1ABCT, 3rd ID, said the rigorous training leading up to the deployment was critical to the brigade's success.

"The NTC rotation really prepared us for what we were going to experience in Korea," said St. Fleur. "But we learned more once we arrived in country where we supported the 2nd Infantry Division and Korean-American Alliance."

Family and friends of the Soldiers filled the bleachers at Cottrell Field and cheered on the returning Soldiers as they marched toward the stands. After marching across the field, the national anthem was played, the brigade chaplain said a short prayer, and the 3rd Infantry Division commander, Maj. Gen. Leopoldo Quintas welcomed the

Soldiers home. After singing the Dogface Soldier song and the Army song, the Soldiers were released to their families.

Sgt. Kayla Lyon, an intelligence analyst with Headquarters, Headquarters Company, 5th Battalion, 7th Cavalry Regiment, said she trained at NTC and studied South Korean culture before deploying.

"We did a lot of studying on South and North Korea in order to be prepared as intelligence analysts, and I feel it helped," Lyon said.

The Soldiers were part of the first main body flight home; the rest of the Raider Brigade will be returning through the end of October.

St. Fleur said that the rotation to South Korea was a rewarding experience and that he felt prepared for any mission that the brigade could have faced there.

"But it feels really good to be home again," he added.

The rotation to South Korea marked the first time since the Korean War that 3rd Infantry Division units had deployed to the Korean Peninsula. During the Korean War, 3rd Infantry Division soldiers earned 13 Medals of Honor and suffered 2,160 killed and almost 8,000 wounded in action. The Raider Brigade is being replaced in Korea by the 3rd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 1st Armored Division from Fort Bliss, Texas.

GDOT prepares for hurricane

ATLANTA – The National Weather Service (NWS) has issued a tropical storm warning for several counties in southwest Georgia and a watch in other areas ahead of hurricane Michael. Earlier today, Governor Nathan Deal issued a state of emergency declaration for 92 counties located in the south and coastal areas of Georgia to provide for emergency assistance in anticipation of Hurricane Michael and its effects on the counties in its path.

Georgia DOT is preparing on a statewide level in partnership with the

Governor's Office, Georgia Emergency Management Agency, the National Weather Service and state and local officials. The traveling public's safety is a top priority as Georgia DOT readies for tropical storm weather conditions. Maintaining the roads and bridges are essential before, during and after the storm.

Statewide, Georgia DOT crews are prepared to activate and deploy as needed.

Georgia DOT's maintenance staff and bridge inspectors will be available to regularly patrol the interstates, state roadways and bridges to assist in identifying potential hazards or negative impacts to travel. In the event that flooding occurs, crews will have to wait until water recedes to assess the situation. If motorists see flash flooding, trees down or other obstructions on roadways or bridges impeding travel, they are urged to contact 511 and speak with an operator to report the incidents.

Motorists are reminded of the hazards of being on the roads during inclement weather that potentially includes high winds, flash flooding, the possibility of downed trees and possible road and bridge closures. If significant flooding occurs, the public is advised not to drive around barricades that are in place for motorist's safety and to treat non-operational signals as a four-way stop. Additionally, the public should monitor local radio and TV stations for the latest details on weather conditions and possible evacuations.

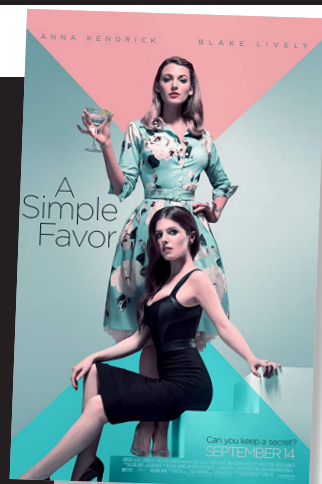

Winn provides comfort to bite victim

Visiting the emergency room can be a frightening experience, especially for a Family member whose local support system is currently deployed. However, for Mary Britton, her experience and the care she received at the Winn Army Community Hospital Emergency Department was something she will never forget.

"I felt like I was coming to a place that truly does believe in Family," Britton said. "As I've said, I never felt like a patient; I always felt like somebody's loved one."

On March 17, Mary arrived at the Winn ACH with a serious dog bite on her left forearm. Mary was noticeably distraught and voiced her fears to Sheriece Heard, her triage nurse.

"I am extremely afraid of needles," Britton said, "and, they were very cognizant of that, and they made me feel extremely comfortable."

For Heard, providing a safe and comfortable atmosphere where her patients can heal is important because she thinks of her patients as her extended Family.

"I immediately grabbed a wheel chair and went out to the parking lot, and saw that there was a patient bleeding," Heard said. "She was pale in the face, very clammy. She was kind of in shock, and so I just wanted to give her some security in knowing that she wasn't by herself, and that we were going to take very good care of her."

After reassuring Britton and noticing the severity of her injury, medic Spc. Scott Barron brought her back to the trauma bay where Britton's safe, reliable, quality healthcare continued.

"They were extremely caring and compassionate," Britton said. "Coming into this, I had that initial feeling of 'oh my gosh, I'm about to do this all by myself,' and that was never the case. Every minute, somebody was there. I wasn't just a patient that walked through the door; I truly felt like I was somebody's sister or daughter or a loved one in their Family."

Providing a comfortable atmosphere in this trauma situation was paramount. If the patient was uncomfortable with how her care was being administered, the process of treating her injury may become extended.

"If they feel more comfortable with us

that makes anything that we're doing a lot easier to do," Barron said. "It makes us connect with them; it makes us remember them more, and it shows that bond that we have. We're here to serve."

During her stay, Britton expressed her concern about seeing the extent of her injury, and that's when Spc. Robyn Bowels, a floor medic in the ED, leapt into action. She designed and fashioned a make shift barrier to keep the patient calm and comfortable while the ED team worked on her injury.

"We kept it covered, so that way she wouldn't get anxious," Bowels said, "because she was kind of afraid of how it would look."

Bowels has a Family-first philosophy when it comes to taking care of patients and hopes that the patients that visit the Winn ED for care understand that.

"I think it's good that we can be that Family for them when their active service member isn't with them," Bowels said. "That way, they actually have someone to lean on and talk to that is that calm, cool place where they're not frantic and not able to go home to them; they have us to fall back on to."

Almost eight months after Britton's injury, Britton and her husband, Col. Jeff Britton, 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade commander, made a surprise visit to the hospital commander's monthly award ceremony at Patriot Auditorium, where Britton had a chance to thank her care team first hand.

"There really are no words to express the gratitude I have for them," Britton said.

For Col. Michelle Munroe, U.S. Army MEDDAC – Fort Stewart Hospital commander, the opportunity to show the healing work accomplished by the staff of the ED and put their readiness on display was a welcomed one.

"It was just an incredible story for what our population, our staff do to support the community," Munroe said. "And, for them to actually come back and not only recognize the staff but show the incredible results of the care that we gave to her for this traumatic event was exceptional."

The care that Ms. Britton received during her time in the trauma bay is a testament of the caliber of Soldiers and Civilians that make it their mission to provide quality healthcare for our beneficiaries.

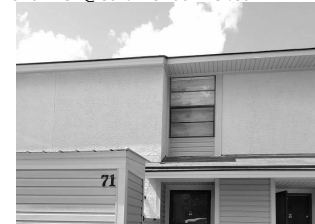

Children can be quite precocious. The gleam in an 8-year-old boy's eye, hinted at that, as he quoted the Bible, trying to shock his Sunday school teacher.

"Job 2:9," the boy said. "His wife said to him, 'Are you still maintaining your integrity? Curse God and die!'"

When giving children the opportunity to choose any scripture verse to memorize and come back the next week, teachers take chances. But the result is more often **John 11:35** ("Jesus wept") due to its brevity. This Job passage was an attempt at shock and boyish humor meant to cause the teacher discomfort and make the student look cool.

As much as this passage is shocking, it does cause us to address a deeper issue. For Job, it was maintaining his faith and trust in the midst of death,

pain, loss, and challenge. For us the question that echoes through the ages is, what is it that allows us to maintain our integrity as we face challenges in life?

We all face challenges and difficulties. Not just big events, such as deaths or disasters; but often an accumulation of little things -- a child that never picks up their toys, a car that never seems to run properly, going to the field. Our list can go on and on. It becomes a combination of factors.

As we face these challenges we may want to throw up our hands and think why; and then face the reality of how to respond. We could try to avoid these problems, but they wouldn't go away. Most likely doing this would add more problems to the ones we're avoiding. We could try to soothe our problems with alcohol, but the added costs and challenges this often brings merely pushes dealing with our difficulties to a less opportune time in the future.

Our best course of action is to have a strong support structure to help us deal with life's challenges. For people of faith, this means taking an active role in your faith community. Whether this is on-post of off, finding a place of worship allows you to exercise your faith with like-minded believers who will assist you with life's trials and place your focus on your belief.

There are numerous resources and helping agencies to serve Soldiers and their Families. Many community groups would love to have the participation of you and your family. There are also chaplains, military family life counselors, and others who are ever-ready to provide an attentive ear to hear your challenges and help you find a way forward.

As we face challenges in our lives, let us always maintain our integrity. Be willing to find help, resources, and answers versus believing that we have to suffer alone.

Stewart streamlines meal cards

Big changes came to the Fort Stewart-Hunter Army Airfield food service program last week with the implementation of the updated meal card system.

Soldiers would normally have to pay money or produce a Department of Defense Form 713 to get their omelets, bacon and coffee after a long morning workout. With the new system, Soldiers can now dine with one form of identification, the Common Access Card.

The universal meal card program was introduced to Stewart-Hunter Soldiers Oct 1. It combines the joint data module into the CAC allowing each service member to rapidly access their meal entitlements and help them pull up to the table quicker.

The new system has streamlined unit S-1 processes and has improved accountability thanks to a series of codes that can report elements such as entitlement status and number of visits made to the dining facility. The dining facility staff can address errors on the spot.

"There has been a good reception so far," said Cornelius Williams, food service program manager for Fort Stewart

and Hunter Army Airfield. "With any new system there's a little resistance. It's important for our servicemembers to know that currently we are not able to go to finance and collect money. That will be part of the next phase of the program. In 2019 we're hoping to have the system set up to deduct funds in addition to the ability to accept debit and credit cards."

If you get to feeling sick, it may be the flu. Children ages birth to four years old and adults over the age of 65 are most likely to get the flu. Flu season is normally in the fall and winter every year and it seems to change each year with a different strain of the virus. It is spread by people coughing and sneezing. What you can do to stay healthy:

- Avoid being around sick people if possible
- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water, or use hand sanitizer
- Cover your mouth when coughing or sneezing, preferably with the inside of your arm rather than your hand
- Avoid touching your face
- Disinfect surfaces that may be contaminated
