

Veteran joins Warrior Legends Hall of Fame

A World War II and 10th Mountain Division veteran. 1st Lt. Euel Akins, was honored Feb. 1 at the American Legion Post 184 in Savannah for his service and his induction into the 10th Mountain Warrior Legends Hall of Fame.

Joe Higgins, chairman of the Veterans Council of Chatham County, read Akins's honor aloud to a crowd of veterans and guests and referred to him as "100-years

"You, sir, look fantastic," said Lt. Col. Stephan Bolton, Hunter Army Airfield garrison commander.

Akins was also honored by a veteran service representative, Stephen Marks, from the office of Georgia Congressman Buddy Carter.

"From one veteran to another, thank you for your service," Marks said.

Bolton spoke on behalf of current 10th Mountain Division Commander Maj. Gen. Brian Mennes and said that he was thrilled to have received word that Akin would receive this honor.

that we admire in a Mountain Warrior," Bolton said. "You are a true warrior legend of the 10th Mountain Division."

Akins was born in Statesboro in October of 1920. He served as a Soldier with the Company D, 87th Infantry Regiment, 10th Mountain Division during the campaign through Italy. He was awarded two Bronze Star medals for sustained and meritorious ground combat.

After his enlistment, he joined the Georgia Army National Guard where he served for three years, earning a commission as a first lieutenant and serving as a forward observer.



Soldier's 'will and drive' lead to success at Ranger school

Ranger school is one of the toughest schools a Soldier can go through. Imagine traversing a mountain with a 1,400-foot climb through poor weather conditions every day of a week. While in school, the candidates push themselves physically and mentally through rigorous training for more than 60 days. That thought alone may seem tough and intimidating, but for logistic officers it sets them apart from their peers.

Second Lt. Dylan Roach, an assistant supply officer assigned to Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Special Troops Battalion, 3rd Division Sustainment Brigade, completed Ranger school and shared his challenges and how he succeeded in becoming the third "ranger-tabbed" officer in 3rd SB.

"The whole school is incredibly challenging," said Roach. "Ranger Assessment Phase week was especially very physically demanding, but once you get through that it is kind of just sucking it up."

Roach recalled the most challenging phase of Ranger for him.

"Mountain phase was particularly difficult for me mostly because we would walk up a mountain every single day and the weather was extremely poor," he said. "It was cold and rainy for eight out of the 10 days that I was there."

Keeping a positive mindset kept Roach going each day. "I would just wake up every day and take it one day at a time, not feeling sorry for myself because everyone in the platoon was going through the same thing," he said.

What was most challenging aside from physically preparing for school was getting a reservation, but with persistent dedication, he earned it.

"It took me nine months to actually get a slot to go to

school," he emphasized.

While he waited for acceptance into the school, he gathered information and preparing with the help of an operational contract support officer in 3rd SB as a mentor.

"Second Lt. Roth from the Brigade helped me physically, and with my mindset of what to expect, and the physicality of the course when I went in," said Roach.

Through the use of technology, articles or books, a Soldier can easily obtain information about Ranger school, but first-hand experiences tend to be more informative, according to 2nd Lt. Jameson Roth, who is assigned to HHC, STB, 3rd SB.

"I've been there. I understood. I went through it and I just wanted to help somebody get there," said Roth. "Roach really didn't have any guidance or anyone to help him go forward. I was just mentoring him."

Roth was an eye witness to Roach's persistence to succeed.

"Roach had all the will and all the drive to do it- I just helped him lay out a good plan to get there," said Roth. "I talked through an abundance of information with him, especially being a logistics officer and not having an infantry background. I guided him to information he was going to have to learn and how to do before he ever got there, so it would not be the first he was learning them."

Once Roach made it to Ranger school, Roth continued to mentor him. Roach also received advice, guidance and support from his friends, colleagues and family.

"I had a lot of people help me," said Roach. "My commander, Capt. Toller, was fully supportive of me going to school."

Roach learned a lot about himself during the process.

"One big thing that I took away ... was that you can push yourself more than you think," said Roach. "I was halfway through RAP week and was like wow, I'm doing things right

now that I didn't think I could physically do. You can definitely push yourself beyond what you believe your limits are."

Roach also learned certain leadership skills that he could use in the future.

"As a logistics officer, I bring a unique skill and mindset, because there is not a lot of tabbed logistics officers in the Army," he said. "As far as being a leader, you learn a lot about yourself at school and how to lead others, especially those who do not want to be led."

Looking at his future, Ranger school graduation opened some appealing doors for the junior officer.

"Ranger school was something I wanted to do in my career," said Roach. "I have been looking at going into the 75th Ranger Regiment and that's something that they require of all their leaders and officers."

Just as Roth gave advice to him, Roach offers mentorship for any Soldiers that may be thinking about attending.

"Try to talk to as many people as you know that have been through the course so you can get different perspectives," he encouraged.

He said it is crucial for students to prepare their bodies for the rigors of the course.

"It is a physically demanding school, especially during RAP week, because you're on your feet for pretty much 20 hours a day and then it does not really stop after that."

According to the recent graduate, an individual should consider every factor when selecting a class date, including the season.

"I would try to go during the summer months and avoid being a 'winter ranger' because that cold is a big factor," he asserted. "It's a huge challenge so prepare yourself both physically and mentally."

ADSMs using Urgent Care Clinics are NOT covered by TRICARE without an Approved Authorization on file with TRICARE. All COVID-19 testing and Urgent Care should be provided by the Military Healthcare System management and tracking. Emergencies (Loss of Life, Limb, or Vision) stop at the nearest Emergency Room and provide your TRICARE insurance information. ADSMs on leave or when in the absence of an MTF they attain an Approved Urgent Care Referral from their duty station Primary Care Manager at their Healthcare Clinic or contact the Nurse Advise Line at 800-874-2273 Option 1 24/7 hours. Note: The rules for Non-Active Duty beneficiaries are different for ADSMs covered by TRI-Prime.

Ziembinski said the SRU takes pride in providing adaptive reconditioning program opportunities, occupational and physical therapy. Noting, they strive to get those Soldiers transitioning out aligned with internships, to best get their resumes squared away for career opportunities.

Ziembinski emphasized the recognition for the SRU means a lot to him because it demonstrates results from a forward thinking staff.

"The Iron Guardians - they are always being innovative," Ziembinski said. "They're coming up with new and creative ways to get after it. It doesn't matter what the mission is."

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

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
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












Army announces new grooming, appearance standards

WASHINGTON— Army senior leaders recently approved several upcoming grooming and appearance modifications, said Sgt. Maj. Brian Sanders, senior enlisted leader of Army G-1's uniform policy branch.

The changes originated from a panel of 17 Soldiers—15 women and two men—who assessed a list of proposed grooming and appearance modifications connected to the professional appearance, health and wellness, diversity, and inclusion of Soldiers.

Minimum hair length

One of the updates will authorize no minimum hair length for all personnel, to include making it an optional style for female Soldiers. Under the current policy, a Soldier's hair length can be no shorter than 1/4 inch from the scalp unless otherwise exempt.

Panel findings determined that females attending Ranger, Special Forces, or Sapper training were often encouraged to cut their hair to abide by health and hygiene recommendations while training in an austere environment, Sanders said.

Multiple hairstyles

Soldiers will also be authorized to wear multiple hairstyles as long as it maintains a neat and professional appearance, and if the hairstyle doesn't impede the use of headgear or other equipment.

Currently, Soldiers are allowed to braid, twist, lock, or cornrow their hair if they are uniform and no greater than 1/2 inch in width. Individuals must also have appropriate size and spacing between each style. The updated standard removes the constraints of dimension requirements.

Ponytails

Female Soldiers with medium-length hair will have the option to wear a ponytail if the individual's hair length or texture prevents them from securing it into a tight bun, Sanders said.

Under the new policy, medium-length ponytails are only authorized for wear on the back of the scalp and cannot exceed the head's width or interfere with the proper wear of a Soldier's headgear.

The updated standard will also allow females the option to wear a ponytail while wearing an Army Combat Uniform during physical training, or while wearing tactical headgear during tactical training or combat operations.

Hair highlights, root growth

The Army plans to authorize the wear of highlights if it presents a natural appearance and is not a prohibited color, Sanders said. Further, if a Soldier decides to color or highlight their hair, root growth of a different color should not exceed 1.5 inches of the original color.

Optional earrings with ACU

Female Soldiers will soon be authorized to wear earrings with their ACU. Earrings can either be screw-on, clip-on, or post-type earrings in gold, silver, or diamond and must be unadorned and spherical without exceeding 6 mm or 1/4 inch in diameter.

Pearl earrings are not authorized with the ACU, Sanders said. Females are currently authorized to wear earrings when wearing their service, dress, mess, and evening mess uniforms.

Individuals will not be allowed to wear earrings in a field environment or during a combat-related deployment, or in locations where access to regular hygiene is limited.

Lipstick and nail polish

Along with supporting a Soldier's identity, the Army approved the use of additional colors of lipstick and nail polish, including the wear of clear nail polish by male Soldiers. Females also have the option to wear an American manicure, a two-tone nail style that maintains a natural appearance.

"Some male Soldiers in certain occupation specialties rely on their hands, which are under constant bombardment while working with tools or harsh chemicals," Sanders said. "A male Soldier would take this opportunity to keep their nails protected."

According to the updated policy, extreme colors and nail shapes, such as a coffin, ballerina, and stiletto nails, are prohibited while in uniform or on duty in civilian clothes. Unauthorized pigments include, but are not limited to, purple, blue, pink, green, orange, bright red, and fluorescent or neon colors.

Wording and imagery update

Another update will remove and replace potentially offensive and weaponized words and phrases, such as "Mohawk, Fu Manchu, dreadlock, eccentric, and faddish," Sanders said.

Army officials are currently replacing phrases of concern with alternative verbiage to provide increased clarity and guidance about a Soldier's professional appearance based on safety, good order, and military bearing—instead of relying on the phrase at the discretion of the commander.

The updated standard will also include imagery and videos to provide specific examples of proper grooming and appearance standards.





Winn tests drive-thru COVID-19 vaccine clinic

Winn Army Community Hospital, in coordination with the 3rd Infantry Division, conducted a COVID-19 drive-through vaccination clinic Friday for Fort Stewart Tricare beneficiaries identified as part of the Department of Defense vaccine distribution plan.

The event helped to evaluate the feasibility of offering the vaccine to a larger audience when a larger supply of vaccine becomes available. A major change from the drive-through influenza vaccine clinic, Winn ACH is partnering with 3rd Infantry Division units to use Donovan Field as the starting point for screening. Participants were provided information about the Moderna vaccine, including benefits and side effects, before they were directed to the Winn ACH overflow parking lot for the vaccine. After they received the vaccine, participants were asked to wait 15 minutes as an added safety measure in the case of an adverse reaction.

Many expressed their appreciation for the service. "I am 65 and I feel we should do this, not only for the community, but to help the country to return to normalcy," said Wilhelmenia Howard.

Keith Rank, a retired veteran over 65 years old, stated, "I wanted to get the vaccine to protect myself, and those I come in contact with."

Due to limited resources, an appointment is required for the COVID-19 vaccine. The hospital is currently

vaccinating in phases that include emergency responders, health care providers, deploying service members, installation critical workforce, and enrolled beneficiaries aged 65 and older who reside within 40 miles of Fort Stewart. Eligible participants can schedule their appointment through the COVID-19 vaccine appointment line at 435-6633, Option 3; which is open 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. If an individual has questions regarding their eligibility or availability, they are encouraged to check with their unit or organization, their primary care managers, message the hospital social media platform, *facebook.com/winncares* or review information on the Winn TRICARE website at *winn.tricare.mil*.

"We plan to offer COVID-19 vaccine to all of our eligible beneficiaries according DoD phases. It will take some time as our vaccine supply is limited currently. We'll be providing information as soon as it becomes available," said U.S. Army Medical Department Activity – Fort Stewart and Winn Army Community Hospital Commander Col. Julie Freeman.

Community members are encouraged to follow the Winn ACH Facebook site, *facebook.com/winncares*, to learn more information and learn when the various phases become open; but to continue using mitigation measures – even after taking the first vaccine – such as washing hands, wearing a mask, avoiding large crowds and maintaining a distance of about six feet from others.
