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Full Census count of military will prove important

For cities and states across the country, active-duty military, veterans and their Families are an important part of community life — whether they live on base, in nearby towns or are deployed or stationed overseas.

But military Families may not realize just how important they are when it comes to the 2020 Census. They should know that the 2020 Census will have an impact on their communities' political representation and billions of dollars in funding annually for the next 10 years.

State, local and federal officials will use data from the 2020 Census to determine funding for infrastructure and critical public services such as hospitals, schools, emergency response services and road maintenance and construction. All are services that military

members, veterans and their Families use in a community.

In mid-March, all households in the U.S., including those of servicemembers, veterans and their Families living in the U.S., will receive an invitation to respond to the 2020 Census. For the first time, people can respond to the census online, by phone or by mail.

The online option could be particularly popular with enlisted active-duty military members, more than half of whom are younger than 25-years old, according to Department of Defense data from 2017.

Respond to the Census

Most military households are responsible for responding to the 2020 Census on their own if they are stationed or living in the U.S. People will be counted where they live and sleep most of the time as of April 1, or Census Day.

Remember to count everyone who lives in your household, including young children, newborns and any relatives or others.

You will be counted in a military barracks in the U.S. if that's where you're staying on Census Day. A military point of contact, sworn to protect your privacy, will distribute individual questionnaires, collect them when complete and return them to the Census Bureau. This is similar to how people living in other group quarter facilities such as college and university student housing respond as part of the Group Quarters data collection.

The same procedure applies if you are on a military vessel with a homeport in the U.S.

You do not have to fill out a questionnaire if deployed or on a military vessel with a homeport outside the U.S. on Census Day.

Col. Tent Upton, commander, 1ABCT, 3rd ID, presided over the ceremony as the reenlisting officer.



Learn about the 2020 Census

Between March 12 and March 20, invitations to participate in the 2020 Census will start arriving in households across the country. Congress has approved that military will be counted at the station they are currently assigned or deployed from. Military households are responsible for submitting their own 2020 Census form online, by phone or by mail. Deployed Soldiers and those living in the barracks will be counted separately. All housing area residents on Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield will receive a Census invitation. This invitation will include instructions on how to respond to the 2020 Census online or by phone using the provided Census ID. For information on the 2020 Census, visit www.2020census.gov. CASAs' unique skillsets support Army goals

WASHINGTON – Jim Bland understands the unique challenges the Army faces recruiting in urban centers. Bland grew up in one of the 22 cities with growing populations that the Army identified as having limited exposure to the service.

Born on Chicago's South Side, Bland now serves as a civilian aide to the secretary of the Army, known as CASA, for northern Illinois. Bland said young Chicagoans often don't join the Army for a variety of reasons, often due to not being close to military veterans.

"There are not many role models for kids in the city who have served," Bland said. "Within our cities, the more touchpoints there are to the military or veterans, the higher propensity it is for someone to be interested or at least curious. That's really the goal; for people to seek out or learn about the Army."

Bland and almost 100 CASAs from

across the U.S. and territories attended the annual CASA conference in Washington last week where they heard from Army senior leaders and exchanged ideas on how to help potential recruits learn about the service. They also met with Secretary of the Army Ryan D. McCarthy and held seminars on how to achieve his priorities.

Officially recognized in 1922, the CASA program's purpose was to quickly train leaders for the Army. In 1950, the program's intent changed to focus on the link between military and community and remains much the same today: to improve relations between the Army and America's communities.

CASAs help tell the Army story, work closely with each state's National Guard to strengthen community connections, help liaison with the U.S. Army Reserve, assist transitioning Soldiers, and play a crucial role with recruiting. As the Army once again looks to make its end-strength goals, the CASAs' role takes

increased importance, especially in large cities like Chicago.

Angela Ritz, director of the CASA program, explained that each CASA possesses his or her own unique skill set, as some are community leaders, businessmen or former military. They come from different backgrounds and age groups. One current CASA played NBA basketball. Another is a former astronaut. Actor Sean Astin served as a CASA for 10 years

during the Clinton and Bush administrations.

"The real common denominator is a CASA's ability to connect to key community influencers and a love of the Army," Ritz said.

There are currently 120 CASA positions in the U.S. and its territories. CASAs are appointed as unpaid special government employees for a two-year term and may serve as a CASA for up to 10 years.

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Soldiers train, certify on antiterrorism

Soldiers from various units, including units from the 3rd Infantry Division, learned the duties and responsibilities of an antiterrorism officer during a recent Antiterrorism Level II Mobile Training Team course Feb. 24-28 on Fort Stewart.

The goal of the training was to train and certify commissioned and non-commissioned officers as antiterrorism officers, so they can teach Antiterrorism Level I, increase security and readiness, and assist their commander with other antiterrorism responsibilities at their respective units.

"Antiterrorism officers are tools for their commander to keep Soldiers safe," said Sgt. 1st Class Thomas Adams, 3rd Battalion, 48th Infantry Regiment at Camp Blanding, Florida. "Every unit needs an antiterrorism officer, regardless of their military occupational specialty."

Staff Sgt. Bradley Opsal, an instructor assigned to the force protection division, said his unit certifies Soldiers

at Fort Stewart twice a year, but they teach the course at installations worldwide.

During the course, Soldiers learn the various responsibilities of an antiterrorism officer, such as risk management, managing resources, reviewing projects, physical security and conducting vulnerability assessments.

"Vulnerability assessment is one of the most important things they learn, because they must understand their unit's vulnerability and how to fix their vulnerabilities," Opsal said.

The class consisted of classroom instruction and practical exercises.

During a practical exercise, Soldiers used what they learned in the classroom to identify the vulnerabilities of buildings and decided on how the security of each building can be improved.

"The class is very good and informative," said Staff Sgt. Michael Lewars, 224th Military Intelligence Battalion at Hunter Army Airfield in Savannah. "I learned how to see everything wrong with a building, and now I can go back and teach classes at my unit."

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Program places 96% of separating Soldiers

PENTAGON – Last year, the Army's Career Skills Programs helped 4,782 Soldiers transition from military service into a civilian career, according to Installation Management Command officials.

Army's CSP had a 96% employment placement rate in 2019, and has given troops a chance to master various skills needed for the civilian workforce since its inception, said Christine Traugott, assistant deputy for Child, Youth and School Services and Education in the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Manpower and Reserve Affairs.

More than 21,000 Soldiers have completed various CSPs across 32 Army garrisons since 2015, said Amy Moorash, US Army Installation Command, Army Continuing Education System chief. The program has a total placement rate of more than 93% and a network with more than 4,000 employers.

With the high number of employers, larger companies, like Microsoft, may have hundreds of subsidiary employers lined up to hire troops when they don't.

Soldiers can enroll in an Army CSP up to 180 days before separation and after completion of the five-day Soldier for Life -- Transition Assistance Program workshop. The use of permissive temporary duty to attend

a CSP more than 50 miles away may be granted at the commander's discretion.

Transitioning Soldiers are matched with first-class apprenticeships, on-the-job training, job shadowing, employment skills training, and internships needed by participating employers nationwide, Traugott said.

The program is offered to transitioning Soldiers' in all branches of the Army -- Active, Guard and Reserve. Some employers include family members transitioning into civilian life, too, Moorash said.

Also, the CSP doesn't have to be linked to the Soldier's military occupational specialty, Traugott said.

"We're giving veterans a way to navigate the challenges of job searching while showcasing their abilities in a way that civilian employers can relate to," Traugott added.

Although the Army would prefer to keep its best talent, Traugott admitted, the next best thing is "to make the off-ramp as easy as possible and make sure Soldiers have somewhere to land. If a Soldier has decided to separate, our program is here as part of the Soldier Life Cycle."

"We hope Soldier's will be influencers in their communities," she added.

The success rate of the CSPs affirms civilian companies want the quality and values troops bring to the workplace, Moorash said. "Our transitioning military

make wonderful recruits. These programs allow training and working in an industry possible."

"This is the warm handover to the civilian world. This promises a Soldier a career, near where they want to live, and doing something they may have never dreamed of being able to do," Moorash said.

"The Exchange is all in to make military communities the No. 1 place to live and work," Morales said. "It has been a privilege to reward military students' academic excellence for the last 20 years."

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

The DOD will provide the Census Bureau administrative data for military members and Family living with them overseas as of April 1.

Special considerations for military

The Census Bureau has clear guidance to help active-duty military and veterans understand how to respond to the 2020 Census based on where they are currently residing on April 1.

If you are active duty and:

- Deployed outside the U.S. while stationed in the U.S., the Census Bureau will use administrative data from the DOD to count you at your usual residence in the U.S. Note: Any Family members living in the U.S.

need to respond for themselves to a Census questionnaire.

- Stationed outside the U.S., the Census Bureau will use administrative data from DOD to count you and any dependents living with you overseas at your home state of record in the U.S.

- Staying in barracks or other on-base group quarters in the U.S., the Census Bureau will work with a point of contact on your base to ensure you are counted.


- Living in a household in the U.S., you need to respond to a household Census questionnaire and count everyone living there.

- Military Family members and veterans living in the U.S. will receive invitations to respond to the Census.

- Be sure to count everyone in your household, unless you are staying in certain types of group quarters. In those instances, a representative of the building may use administrative records to respond to the Census for everyone staying in the building or may ask you to fill out an individual census questionnaire.

- Responses to the 2020 Census are safe and secure. Federal law bars the Census Bureau from releasing personal census data to law enforcement, immigration agencies or other government agencies.

Installation kicks off 2020 AER campaign

Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield kicked off the 2020 Army Emergency Relief Campaign Feb. 25, during the installation's community leader's information forum at the Fort Stewart main post chapel.

"Here at Fort Stewart and Hunter we issue out the third most assistance in the United States Army," said Command Sgt. Maj. Rebecca Myers, Fort Stewart and Hunter garrison senior enlisted leader. "Last year we distributed a little more than \$3 million to Soldiers, Families and retirees."

AER assists active-duty Soldiers, Family members, and surviving spouses of Soldiers, who died while on active duty or while retired. This assistance provides funds for rent, utilities, food, funeral expenses, emergency medical care, additional acquired needs, and scholarships to spouses and children of Soldiers.

"Many Soldiers and Family members use AER assistance for emergency travel," said Sgt. 1st Class Yuliya Krivitchenko, Headquarters and Headquarters Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division, unit supply specialist.

Although AER assists those in need, very few con-

tribute to the program.

"In the Army, when it comes to bringing those funds back in through fund raising, only about seven percent of the active-duty component contribute to that fund raising," Myers said. "This program is all about helping each other; it's not about a hand-out or about a charity."

Last year Fort Stewart and Hunter received more than \$126,000 worth of donations for the AER campaign and assisted nearly 3,000 Soldiers, Families and spouses combined.

"I would like to raise at least \$2,000 from the HHBN," Krivitchenko said, who is more than half-way to her goal.

Krivitchenko said Soldiers and Family members can begin the AER assistance process by speaking with their supervisor, contacting Army Community Service, or speaking with an AER unit representative.

"One of the things that you are going to get when you send a Soldier over to Army Emergency Relief to get some assistance is making them better by the time they leave that office," Myers said. "We are going to sit down with them and go over how to make them more financially stable in the future. So, that is definitely a benefit to using the AER program."

In addition to loans and grants, the AER program offers additional categories to help provide assistance.

Myers said when those in need come to get assistance, the AER representative will help with getting grants or interest-free loans without causing additional financial problems for the Soldier or their Family.

"We can help out with scholarship funds, car seat assistance, and medical care that is not covered by Tricare," said Myers. "There is a ton of assistance out there. If you are not teaching your junior leaders about what kind of categories for assistance we have, people don't know and then they go out and get themselves in trouble."

According to Myers, the AER Headquarters provided more than \$3.5 million worth of assistance in 2019 and she is hoping that the installation will meet its goal this year.

Myers said she hopes the Soldiers and Families contribute to the AER program.

"Help us make this a great program and help us meet our goal this year," Myers said.
