

Soldiers train for subterranean operations

Soldiers assigned to 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 83rd Chemical Battalion and the 385th Military Police Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division, completed a five-day classroom seminar and training exercise on subterranean operations August 17-21 on Fort Stewart.

A Mobile Training Team from the Asymmetric Warfare Group instructed more than 100 Soldiers with distinct, complementary military occupational specialties on the constraints of below-ground battlefields, and on adaptive technical and tactical approaches.

“The seminar provides resonant knowledge, equipment familiarization and maneuver fundamentals to teams who may not have operated together or underground before,” said Ray Devens, AWG instructor.

The subterranean operations seminar taught, and challenged the Soldiers on environmental considerations, tool employment and task force collaborative planning and execution for the counter weapons of mass destruction and chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear mission sets.

Platoons comprised of riflemen from 2nd Battalion, 7th Infantry Regiment and 1st Battalion, 64th Armor Regiment, as well as enablers from 10th Brigade Engineer Battalion, 83rd Chemical Battalion, and 385th MP Bn. practiced maneuvers and adjusted to oxygen- and light-deprived tunnel systems and complex urban superstructures like subways and sewers.

Enablers, who attach to a combat arms unit, provide early warning detection, risk mitigation, hazard assessment, emergency response and security.

“As enablers, we strive to move seamlessly and collect rapidly to answer intelligence requirements about the threat, and aid in decision making,” said Spc. Joshua Coleman, a human intelligence collector from 10th BEB, 1ABCT.

Junior leaders cross-leveled skills, and integrated diverse capabilities. For example, combat engineer squad leaders showcased the relative advantages of exothermic - heavy - breaching to infantry squad leaders.

Staff Sgt. Edward Layne, infantry squad leader from 1-64 AR, said his squad learned to use a Bronco torch which is an ignited metal rod, fed by oxygen that cuts steel for their breach instead of an explosive charge to avoid negative structural repercussions and can weaken air quality.

Other critical skills the Soldiers learned was how screenings, interrogations and map tracking could empower the task force in real time.

“This task force can be nothing short of deliberate from its composition to its work rate and movements,” Coleman said. “Every single person taking up oxygen in the tunnel or supporting from the perimeter serves a critical function.”

“We push teams to understand each player’s unique function because sensors drive ability,” Devens said. “Teams must be disciplined in the challenge of translating close-quarter battle to subterranean environments.”

Marne Air returns to the Savannah sky

The high pitched whine of a jet engine mingled with the sound of spinning rotors cutting through the air. Dirt and debris was kicked up as a UH-60 Black Hawk helicopter began to achieve lift.

The pilots assigned to 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division, finished port operations as they flew the Black Hawk Aug. 21 from the Georgia Port Authority in Savannah to Hunter Army Airfield, following the brigade's nine-month rotation in Europe supporting Operation Atlantic Resolve.

Atlantic Resolve provides units with the ability to build readiness, increase interoperability and enhances the bond between ally and partner militaries through multinational training events.

The brigade began port operations Aug. 17 as Soldiers unloaded the aircraft from a ship and staged them at the port.

Soldiers folded the rotor blades of the Black Hawks and AH-64 Apache helicopters back to make the helicopters more compact. This allowed Soldiers to fit more aircraft in a tighter

spaces.

"We unloaded the aircraft and now we are unfolding them to make them fully mission capable," said Sgt. Christopher Smigel, a Soldier assigned to 4th Battalion, 3CAB, 3rd ID.

The CH-47 Chinook differs from the other two air frames, because it is so large the maintainers remove the rotor blades altogether and store them with in the aircraft.

"After unfolding them, we push them to the landing zone where we are going to have them take off and keep the mission moving like a conveyor belt," Smigel said.


The Soldiers participated in port operations from Aug. 18 to 21, unfolding, inspecting and flying the aircraft out of the port. Maintainers, pilots, fuelers and other Soldiers worked multiple shifts during the day to complete the mission.

"This is a testament to our maintenance personnel," said Capt. Tyler Lamb, commander of Company D, 3rd Squadron, 17th Cavalry Regiment. "The success of this mission is the on the backs of our maintainers, and they are our secret weapon to getting this done."

Select fitness centers open for active-duty, DoD cardholders

The Jordan and Newman Fitness centers reopened for all authorized Department of Defense ID cardholders as of Aug 3.

Active-duty personnel can hold physical training from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. with reduced occupancy in the gyms. The fitness centers are open to all other DoD cardholders from 11:30 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Soldiers can exercise in small groups and build cohesion with the gyms opened back up, said Lt. Col. Chad Moniz, the Army Field Support Battalion commander.

Social distancing and extra cleaning procedures have been implemented in the fitness centers to protect patrons.

Maj. Barry Farmer, AFSBN executive officer, said people should not be hesitant to workout at the gym during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"You should be aware of the situation and the environment that we're living in," Farmer said, in reference to adjusting to COVID-19 precautions. "If it requires you to wear a mask, if it requires you to hand sanitize and wipe down your equipment then that alone should be sufficient."

Spc. Jose Salcido, a petroleum supply specialist in 135th Quartermaster Company, 87th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade, said it is good that gyms are open during PT hours with proper limitations in place to prevent the spread of the virus.

Salcido participated in two details for sanitizing gym equipment since select gyms opened earlier this month for PT. Salcido monitors room capacity, hands Soldiers a card reminding them to wipe down used equipment, then enters the room after the Soldier has left and cleans the equipment for further sanitation.

"Everything here is so clean," said Maj. Aaron Holker, AFSBN support operations officer. "I don't know if it's always been like this, or if it is just because of COVID-19, but I feel pretty safe here doing my workout."

Maintaining physical readiness is a Soldier's responsibility regardless of the situational environment caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, Holker said.

"When the tide goes back out, we're going to find out who is not doing the workouts," Holker said. "And, you know, we're still going to have the Army Combat Fitness Test."

“We really appreciate your presence and a special welcome back to 3rd Combat Aviation Brigade; it’s great to see you back on Hunter,” Bolton said.



Army releases revised command policy

WASHINGTON — The Army recently published the latest version of its Army Command Policy since 2014, which now includes updates to corrective training, sexual harassment reporting and extremist activity on social media.

The 200-plus page policy, also known as Army Regulation 600-20, is the official guidance for commanders across the Army, and is typically revised every five years.

“As Soldiers, NCOs, officers, and [Department of the Army] civilians, we all have an obligation to know, enforce and take appropriate action in accordance with Army Command Policy,” Sgt. Maj. of the Army Michael A. Grinston wrote in a message to the force.

The revised regulation has nearly 70 different changes, which is quite significant, said Lt. Col. Melissa Comiskey, chief of command policy for the Army’s G-1 office.

“This is a massive regulation,” she said in an interview Friday. “It is command

policy. It is the commander’s guide, so there’s a lot that’s encompassed in here.”

Much of the updates come from previous directives that have since been superseded by the new regulation, which was published July 24.

“The Army continues to move and continues to build policy,” she said. “As we’re building policy, it doesn’t get immediately incorporated into a regulation. That’s why we have Army directives.”

The regulation now includes specified authority to correct minor acts of indiscipline with brief forms of exercise.

“The changes empower NCOs to lean on non-punitive measures as a form of corrective training to address minor deficiencies,” said Sgt. Maj. Jasmine Johnson, the command policy sergeant major, adding an example could be a Soldier doing 10 push-ups for arriving late to formation.

Another update is for commanders to notify their Soldiers that they cannot possess a firearm or ammunition, if they have a qualifying conviction of domestic violence.

The change comes after a domestic violence working group years ago identified a gap in the previous AR 600-20, Comiskey said.

The regulation also expands the policy on extremist group activities by incorporating social media for the first time, as well as command options for violations under the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

“Social media was not addressed in the previous regulation,” Comiskey said. “Also the requirement for commanders to notify either their [staff judge advocate] or [criminal investigation division] when there’s any type of reports of extremist activities in their organization.”

Policies from several Army and Defense Department directives have also been moved under the authority of the Army’s Sexual Harassment and Assault Response and Prevention program.

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



Engineer Qualification Tables are designed to establish Mission Essential Task proficiency first and foremost. EQT V is designed to certify engineer squads using situational training exercises and a live-fire exercise. 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COVID-recovered Soldiers called to donate blood

Soldiers who have recovered from COVID-19 are being called to participate in the Armed Forces Blood Program blood drive from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Sept. 2-3, at Club Stewart. Those who donate are eligible to receive a \$25 gift card that can be used to shop at various brand-name companies.

The product the AFBP is after is called COVID-convalescent plasma, said Marc Dewees, supervisor for the Kendrick Memorial Blood Donation Center on Fort Gordon. The CCP is the liquid part of blood that contains antibodies, which is collected from patients who have recovered from COVID-19, according to the convalescent plasma factsheet released by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration on fda.gov.

The website states that there is some data to suggest convalescent plasma might help some patients who are sick with COVID-19.

"It has been approved by the FDA, completely approved," Dewees said.

More than 70,000 patients have already been treated with the product, Dewees said, which is proven to be most effective when administered within the first three days of a patient experiencing symptoms.

The AFBP is trying to get between 8,000 and 10,000 units stocked before the end of September, he said.

"We are trying to stay at the tip of the spear with collecting this plasma," Dewees said.

Pat Young, a Fort Stewart employee, said he intends to donate during the drive and has already scheduled an appointment.

"COVID is already causing a strain on available resources," Young said. "If we could develop a

response, it could greatly enhance our mission readiness as well as relieve a lot of stress on Families."

Young, who recently recovered from the virus, said that it can feel uplifting to help out someone that may become infected in the future.

"It made me feel good that I could turn it around from a bad experience to a resource that could help others," Young said.

The drive is targeted toward those who have recovered from the virus, but Dewees said any person who wishes to donate whole blood may do so as well at the blood drive.

"We're more than happy to take them," Dewees said.

The appointments will be spaced out to prevent large groups gathered at any given time. Donors and collectors will wear a mask at all times and the stations will be sanitized between donations, Dewees said.

The AFBP is the military's official blood supplier. They are a Department of Defense agency that provides blood products for Service members, veterans and their Families during both peacetime and war, according to their website. They have components working together to collect, process, store, distribute and transfuse blood worldwide as a joint operation among the military services.

Donors must be at least 17-years old, weigh at least 116 pounds, and must be free of cold, flu and COVID-19 symptoms.

Appointments are highly encouraged to maintain social distance and prevent large groups; however walk-ins will be accommodated. Appointments can be made at militarydonor.com, by searching for code word 'stewart'. For information and restrictions on eligibility, visit militaryblood.dod.mil.

New enrollment fee established for Tricare Select group A retirees

Effective Jan. 1, 2021, Tricare Select group A retirees will have an annual enrollment fee of \$150 per person and \$300 per Family with a catastrophic cap increase of \$3,500.

Tricare Select group A enrollment fees will be waived for active-duty Family members, survivors of members who died on active duty and disability retiree Families. The applicable catastrophic cap will continue to be \$1,000 for active-duty Family members and \$3,000 for survivors of members who died while on active duty or disability retiree Families.

Note: You're in group A if you initialed enlistment or appointment or if your uniformed services sponsor began before January 1, 2018.

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
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CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

A true test of faith

James 2:14-18, “14 What use is it, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but he has no works? Can that faith save him? 15 If a brother or sister is without clothing and in need of daily food, 16 and one of you says to them, ‘Go in peace, be warmed and be filled,’ and yet you do not give them what is necessary for their body, what use is that? 17 Even so faith, if it has no works, is dead, being by itself.”

The apostle, James, is addressing a common misunderstanding among Christ followers in the first century. Some in the church were convinced that faith was an action of the mind and the heart, and that one’s conduct was not an indicator of genuine faith. But, James uses a simple example in verses 15 and 16 to prove that faith alone is worthless. James reminds his readers that faith must be accompanied by actions which reflect the values and principles Jesus taught his followers to obey as they sought to imitate him in their daily lives.

What James doesn’t address in this section is the result of faith and works in the lives of those who follow Christ. As God works through Christ followers to minister to a

hurting world, further obedience to God’s will and purposes are adopted in the lives of those who put their faith into action. Christian writer Joel Ryan address this aspect of faith when he writes, “Deeds are the outer reflection of this inner transformation. They are the evidence of a heart that has been and is continually being transformed and renewed by God.”

So as God renews us through faith and works, in turn we further seek to honor and glorify Him with our words and deeds. This is the new reality that James and all other Christ followers have experienced as they put faith into action. In doing so, God manifests Himself in His people and brings restoration to their souls. This is the true test of faith that each of us who follow Christ should ask ourselves on a regular basis: Do my words and deeds honor the God I profess to follow?



Provider Maintainers train on new service pistols

Small arms maintainers from the 632nd Service Maintenance Company, Special Troops Battalions, 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade, were trained on the recently fielded M17 and M18 pistol July 27-28 on Fort Stewart.

The training, provided by the U.S. Army Tank-Automotive and Armaments Command, gave the small-arms repair Soldiers an opportunity to get a hands-on feel for the new systems and learn the details of operating and maintaining them.

“An instructor came here from TACOM and went over the whole weapons system for the M17 and M18 pistols, breaking down the weapon understanding how it fires,” said Staff Sgt. Ryan Daly, platoon sergeant with 632nd SMC.

The instructors also covered all the different trajectory, how to disassemble not only the weapon but also the magazine and how to properly clean it, Daly said.

“Being a platoon sergeant, one of my main focuses is training all the Soldiers in my platoon and making sure they are up to date,” Daly said. “Being able to learn the system properly from TACOM gave me the tools to properly train my Soldiers and the noncommissioned officers under

me to operate the weapon systems properly.”

The Army began fielding the M17 and M18 pistols to replace the M9 Berretta in 2017. The pistol arrived to Fort Stewart this year as part of the equipment fielding process. The new systems created new challenges for the 632nd SMC as maintainers and eased some previous complications.

“From a maintenance stand point, [the weapons systems) are a lot easier to work with,” said Spc. Kobe Guay, a small arms and artillery repairer with 632nd SMC. “The trigger group just comes out, as opposed to the M9 where you have to work around the chassis. I feel that this new weapon is definitely going to make the process a lot quicker knowing exactly what we need to do to get it done so we can get weapons through our shop much quicker.”

The maintainers ended the training having gained confidence in their ability to provide the Division and tenant units the quality support the Sustainment Brigade is known for.

“For an SMC, this is an important opportunity because it helps Soldiers basically cross train with some of the tenant units and the units we support here on Fort Stewart,” said Capt. Jessica Richardson, commander, 632nd SMC. “We are the only ones that are going to be maintaining them on Fort Stewart and it gives our Soldiers an opportunity to fulfill their military occupation specialties.”
